Parish Council Matters

Parish Council Report

May 2023 marks the end of the current Moulsford Parish Council and there will be an election for a new council. We do hope villagers will consider standing and to encourage that thought each of the current councillors will be writing a short piece for Moulsford News about being a councillor - what we've learnt, what's been good and, no doubt, the odd frustration. But we're starting off with the departing parish clerk's view. See overleaf.

I should also add that our clerk, Geoff Twibell leaves us at the end of August after 10 years in the post. The clerk is the council's only member of staff and as well as being an administrator and accountant, is also ultimately responsible to South Oxfordshire District Council for ensuring the parish council conducts itself fairly, correctly and legally in all matters.

What is a parish councillor? A parish clerk's view...

Advocate. Planner. Counsellor. Adviser. Consultant. Negotiator. Mediator. Diplomat. There are many ways you'll hear parish councillors described. And in truth the job probably requires some of these skills at one time or another.

But above all a parish councillor is someone in the community that people will look to for help, guidance and support. A representative and spokesman for the community who can influence decisions on planning matters, crime prevention, open spaces, public services and more, all to the benefit of those they serve.

In the build-up to local council elections next year, in subsequent issues of Moulsford News you'll be hearing directly from our five parish councillors on how they find the job, what persuaded them to become a councillor and what they get out of it.

In general those serving their communities report enjoying seeing things change for the better as a consequence of their decision-making. Some report a real sense of achievement from a job well done. Others report a sense of pride and satisfaction. But without exception they all feel that they are making a difference.

Annual Parish Meeting 2022

This year's annual parish meeting (APM) – the first in three years thanks to Covid – was a departure from the norm, ushering in a new video-based format and a much broader range of topics than ever before.

It saw for the first time the inclusion of local businesses Well Barn Estate and Greenlands Farm, the former occupying roughly one half of the entire Moulsford parish. We also heard from Oxford University Hospitals, St. John The Baptist Church and Goring Gap Walks, not to mention the parish council, our village committees, the coffee shop and other initiatives.

Neighbourhood Planning Statement Update

As reported in last month's Moulsford News, we are lucky enough to have been selected to participate in a government pilot scheme, aimed at simplifying the process of planning for small villages. The scheme gives parish councils, residents and local businesses more of a voice in overarching planning matters - for example housing developments, infrastructure, transport and investment as well as ecology and the environment.

Over the last few weeks, we have managed to get a team together to work on areas of potential interest and outline what we might cover in the statement. However, we would also value input from yourselves in the village; therefore we are planning two initiatives:

1. A survey which will go to all households and businesses, giving you a chance to tell us what matters to you. This will be in both paper format and online - just select whichever suits you best.

2. A village meeting, in which we plan to outline our thoughts so far and would love to get your input. This is planned for 23rd Sept at 7pm in the Pavilion. We hope as many of you as possible will make it so that we can make sure our statement truly represents the views of the village.

Please put the village meeting in your diaries now :) A reminder will be posted on Moulsford Village Facebook page closer to the time, together with a QR code for the questionnaire.

Quality of water in the Thames in the Benson, Wallingford, Crowmarsh area

South Oxfordshire District Council is working with Thames 21 to assess the quality of the water in the Thames in this area. Thames 21 will be collecting samples from Wallingford as well as at sampling points both up-and downstream between May and September 2022. The samples together with surveys of river users undertaken in busy periods over the summer and other data will be used to get a better understanding if there are issues with the quality of water in this area.

The data collected will be used to inform an application to Defra for Bathing Water Status which will be submitted in the autumn. Having bathing water status on the Thames here won't solve all pollution problems – but it should force improvements in local sewage treatment so it is treated to a standard suitable for public health.

The ultimate aim of the project is to:

- Make sure that users of this stretch of the River Thames including swimmers, kayakers, canoeists, rowers and anglers can make informed decisions about their use of the river
- Improve the health of the river for ecosystems by deepening our understanding of the causes of river pollution in Wallingford

Bathing water status would help in pressuring river stakeholders (including Thames Water, the Environment Agency and Ofwat) to work harder to improve the quality of the river here – for people and wildlife.

This is to support local initiatives to improve the health and well being of South Oxfordshire residents and is open to applicants for projects which help communities become more active or sustain activity.

Church Chatter

At the time of writing hopefully we are all still able to enjoy the warm summer weather and maybe the opportunity to relax a little with school holidays still a little while to run.... For those of our young people who have received recently their exam results we trust that they will have reflected all that hard work during the previous school year, and they are able to move on to greater things, be it sixth form colleges, apprenticeships, university or gap year adventures. The world begins to open up and today offers a myriad of opportunities ripe for exploration assuming budgets and savings allow. Nearer to home volunteering experiences also are now slowly returning to normal post Covid so why not give it a go? Wallingford Castle Meadows officially recognised as one of country's best parks thanks to coveted Green Flag Award

This summer Earth Trust is celebrating the continued recognition of its ability to connect communities with the natural world after receiving a Green Flag Award for Wallingford Castle Meadows. This year marks the 15th consecutive Green Flag award. It is also the 9th year in a row that Wallingford Castle Meadows is receiving Green Heritage Site accreditation with support from Historic England, for the management of its conspicuous historic features, which includes the remains of one of the greatest medieval castles in England.



Earth Trust manages Wallingford Castle Meadows in partnership with South Oxfordshire District Council. The prestigious Green Flag award, managed by Keep Britain Tidy, is widely acknowledged as the international quality mark for parks and green spaces. Recognition as part of the scheme requires high standards of management to be upheld; making the lineage of the award status a valuable acknowledgement of Earth Trust's mindful and measured approach to land management.

Earth Trust cares for the historic Wallingford Castle Meadows alongside a growing number of local community green spaces including Thrupp Lake and Abbey Fishponds. The charity is perhaps best known for managing the iconic Wittenham Clumps – 500 hectares of woodland, farmland, wildflower meadows and wetlands a few miles outside of Wallingford.

The special places that Earth Trust cares for receive 200,000 plus visits each year. Understandably, the numbers of visits reached unseen proportions during the pandemic, when free to access green spaces became not just a source of leisure, but a lifeline.

Earth Trust Senior Ranger Tim Read maintains these rich meadows as diverse green spaces for people to enjoy, with the help of a group of dedicated volunteers. Tim had this to say about the award: "After two years that have seen parks and green spaces play a vital role for people as a place to relax, exercise and connect with their community, it's a real thrill to receive official recognition for the hard work and dedication of the team that make Castle Meadows a great space for everyone to enjoy."

Earth Trust CEO Jayne Manley also commented on what this year's award means for the charity: "We are thrilled that in our 40th year, Castle Meadows has again received recognition for the work we do to ensure the local community can access and enjoy this magical green space full of nature and heritage. In 2022, with the launch of our new strategy we are more dedicated than ever to the connection between our past and future.

Our vision is a society where accessible, engaging green spaces like this one, enable nature and people to thrive in balance. We are passionate about the power of green spaces and our bold new strategic direction has local communities at its heart. So if you are a visitor to Wallingford Castle Meadows and care about the work we are doing to manage spaces like this – not just at a practical level but also in terms of cutting edge research, advocacy and community engagement, please join our circle of people wanting to see and be a part of change!
