- 3. Open Forum Ms Mutch (LM) (resident of Seckington) has serious concerns with overnight parking on the B5493 lay-by and litter within Seckington. LM collecting litter around the village regularly. DH to check if NWBC are collecting litter every Tuesday. DW reported that Highways dept will not allow 'no overnight parking' signs to be erected. Can the lay-by be permanently blocked off or closed? 9. Duckpond Willow Tree – NWBC tree officer advised that the tree nearest the road needed to be taken down. Arborcare disagreed. Ongoing inspection required. A replacement could be planted now, but it would obstruct the maintenance ramp into the pond. Replacement to be planted if existing tree is removed.

- South Staffs Water is changing to a Business from April 2017. May affect cost of water. Ongoing.
- Tamworth Cricket Club to discuss whether help is available to mow the field. Mole inactive.
- **11. Carpark and Pond Inspections –** DC is not prepared to sign off that carpark is safe as she feels the checklist criteria are too vague. CV will not sign off on carpark being safe as he does not agree that the carpark surface is safe. Noted.
- 12. Litter Pick The next litter pick will be on Saturday 4 March 2017. DC has leafleted villages with details. NWBC to drop of bags as before.
- **13.** Unmetered Electricity Supply Clerk reported that Western Power have changed the supply certificate to reflect the new low energy bulbs.
- 14. Dog Fouling in Newton Regis Wendy Morris has circulated an email to most residents, encouraging the reporting of any dog fouling to the dog warden. At the end of this year, the dog control order expires. DW to ask if we are automatically transferred to the new scheme.

- 15. Fouling of Lay-by on B5493 covered in Item 3.
- **16. B5493 Road Closure before Browns Lane junction** the Parish Council were not notified of this closure, but agreed that all statutory requirements have been met. Closed 6 March 2017 for 4 weeks.
- **17. Mud on the Road –** on B5493 near the Barleyfields development. Tamworth and Staffordshire Councils are not involved in keeping the road clear of mud. This is down to the developers.
- **18.** Preparing for emergencies in Warwickshire leaflet the Parish Council has tried in the past to identify vulnerable residents, but no one was prepared to identify themselves. Noted.
