News from Helen Whately MP

It's been a busy start to the new term in Westminster where I've asked questions on International Trade and Equal Pay, and spoken in debates on up skirting and proxy voting. The headlines may be all about Brexit but there is other work going on too. I've also got some new responsibilities as the Conservative Party's Vice Chair for Women. Meanwhile there's plenty going on with my local campaigns on Cleve Hill Solar Farm, East Kent Hospitals, Operation Stack, Brenley Corner, Farming and Accessibility.

At the moment, disabled passengers, parents with buggies – anyone who can't use stairs – can't get onto the London-bound platform at Headcorn. There are similar problems at Faversham station where the lifts constantly break down. Thankfully, after years of campaigning, the Faversham lift is finally getting replaced with bigger, easier-to-use and more reliable lifts. Works have already begun and are due to finish in November. As for Headcorn, I've been arguing that this station should get a share of £300 million fund to improve step-free access at train stations and we're expecting an announcement soon.

If getting a train is tricky when you have a disability – catching a plane can be uncomfortable, undignified and unsafe. Being manoeuvred into your seat in front of the entire plane can be mortifying, and risky if the person assisting you isn't properly trained. Once you're in your seat, you can't get out, even to go to the toilet. I've heard that people avoid drinking water for hours before a flight and wear incontinence pads. During the flight, your wheelchair may be stored in the hold and could be lost or broken, so when you arrive at your destination you're stuck. I've introduced a new Bill to make sure airline staff are properly trained and that wheelchairs are stored safely.

As well as equality for people with disabilities – including hidden disabilities like mental health problems – I’m fighting for equality for women. I sat on the Committee for the Bill to make up skirting – the awful, intrusive practice of taking a photo up a woman’s skirt – a crime, and I was pleased when this Bill passed its third reading in the House of Commons. As the Conservative Party’s new Vice Chair for Women, it’s my mission to encourage more women to step forward and stand for election. Since I’ve become Vice Chair, almost everyone I’ve spoken to knows someone – a woman – who would be a good MP or Councillor. But too often, women don’t quite have the confidence – they say things like “I’m not sure I’m good enough...” or “I don’t think I’d have time to really do it justice...” even though I know they are the sort of people who are brilliant at fitting things in and would give more time than others already in the job. If you’re reading this and thinking “that sounds like me”, please drop me a line and let’s have a chat. Or if you know a woman like that, please encourage her to do so. Don’t get me wrong, we need capable men to stand for election too, it’s just that there are a lot more men putting themselves forward than women.

There are so many passionate campaigners locally who make an enormous contribution to our public life. Like the Graveney Rural Action Team, who are doing a great job raising awareness of a proposal to build a solar farm the size of Faversham on the Graveney marshes. I’m extremely concerned about the scale of this proposal. I want Britain to have more sustainable energy, but this solar farm is just huge. I want much stronger reassurances from the developer that the beautiful landscape and local wildlife will not be harmed.

Our countryside is precious and needs looking after. Farmers work hard to protect the environment, but it’s a tough business and profit margins can be slim. For two years, I’ve been campaigning for a seasonal agriculture workers’ scheme, so that fruit growers can hire the workers they need to harvest their produce. There were growing fears that beautiful Kent fruit would be left to rot in the fields – so I’m delighted that the Government has listened and is now piloting a seasonal workers’ scheme. While the numbers are small at the moment, it’s a step in the right direction. If this pilot is a success I hope the scheme will be extended so that farmers can continue to access migrant labour after we leave the EU.

To make sure the country is prepared for Brexit we need to make sure our roads can cope if there are delays at the border – and that we won’t be paralysed by Operation Stack. The A2/M2 is a crucial corridor leading to and from the port, but at the moment Brenley Corner junction is completely unfit for purpose. It’s busy and dangerous, and while some sections have recently been upgraded with a new surface, the job’s only half finished. I recently met with Highways England to get some answers. They explained that two separate improvement schemes are underway at Brenley Corner. The first is the resurfacing scheme, and the second is the installation of pedestrian and cycle – ‘toucan’ – crossings. The proposal is that the remainder of the roundabout will be resurfaced when the crossings are installed. This is expected to take place before the end of the financial year, subject to approval.

On Operation Stack, Highways England have come up with a temporary plan to keep traffic on the London-bound part of the motorway while stacking lorries coast-bound. At the same time they are working on a permanent alternative to Stack. The Prime Minister is rightly working to get a deal that keep movement at our borders as smooth as it is at the moment – but it's responsible to be prepared.


Let us remember them together

Grafty Gourmet

Enjoy this versatile vegetarian fritter recipe as a snack or for lunch, or serve with a green salad, yogurt and lime wedges as a light dinner.

Carrot, Sweet Potato & Feta Fritters

800g of carrots
2 large potatoes
1 large onion
600g of sweet potatoes
5 medium free-range eggs
200g of feta, crumbled
6 tablespoons of wholemeal flour
25g of fresh coriander, chopped
2 tablespoons of cumin seeds
300ml of vegetable oil
Green salad, lime wedges and yogurt to serve

1. Peel and grate the carrots, potatoes, onion and sweet potatoes. Put in a colander over the sink with a big pinch of salt to drain for 30 minutes.

2. In a large bowl, combine the eggs, feta, flour, coriander and cumin seeds, then beat with a fork until mixed.

3. Squeeze as much liquid from the veg as you can, pressing down hard into the colander for 1-2 minutes, then add to the egg mixture. Stir to combine and season well. Heat the oven to 150°C/fan130°C.

4. Heat the oil in a wok or saucepan. Put a small handful of the mix in a slotted spoon and lower into the oil. Cook 2-3 at a time: fry for 1-2 minutes, then turn and repeat until golden. Put on a plate and keep warm in the oven.

Finish planting Spring cabbages and Autumn onion sets.

Resolution to Flooding at Woodcock Lane

For some time the Parish Council has been attempting to get Kent County Highways to address the occasional flooding of the road at the Village end of Woodcock Lane. In response KCC have always insisted that the cause lies with poor maintenance of the ditches by land owners.

Persistence has paid off, and the Parish Council was able to convene a site meeting with various departments of KCC and relevant landowners from either side of Woodcock Lane. In this way everyone could come to a common agreement on what is causing the problem and the best solution.

As a result a number of actions were agreed by everyone present. The drainage department at KCC is raising an order for a civil crew to clear around the ends of the culvert and install kerb spillways/grips in the verge over the culvert headwalls in Woodcock Lane. Plus they will install a kerb grip at the end of the ditch near the gully at the farm entrance in the junction of Church Road so the water drains freely into the ditch.

This work will be carried out when the Highways team sets up the road closure for installing a tarmac bund on the road to better direct the water in the ditches.

Our thanks to Sean Wickens who attended the site visit and has assisted by clearing their ditches of vegetation to receive the re-directed water.

It is hoped that this will provide a permanent solution to a long standing problem.

You may recall that at the beginning of this year we sent out the e-mail below regarding Kent Police's new pilot Community Policing Volunteer project in West Division.



Password Managers – Stop worrying about remembering all your passwords

A password manager assists in generating and retrieving complex passwords, potentially storing such passwords in an encrypted database or calculating them on demand.



Types of password managers include:

Locally installed software applications - Password managers commonly reside on the user's personal computer or mobile device, in the form of a locally installed software application. These applications can be offline, wherein the password database is stored independently and locally on the same device as the password manager software.

Online services accessed through website portals - An online password manager is a website that securely stores login details. They are a web-based version of more conventional desktop-based password manager.

The advantages of online password managers over desktop-based versions are portability (they can generally be used on any computer with a web browser and a network connection, without having to install software), and a reduced risk of losing passwords through theft from or damage to a single device.

The major disadvantages of online password managers are the requirements that the user trusts the hosting site and a key logger is not on the computer they are using. With servers and the cloud being a focus of cyber-attacks, how one authenticates into the online service and that the passwords stored there are encrypted with a user defined key are just as important.

Password managers typically require a user to generate and remember one "master" password to unlock and access any information stored in their databases.

There are many products available, some of them are free, some offer additional services which you may need to pay a monthly premium, so make sure you read all the terms and conditions and check that there are no hidden costs that you are not expecting.



What an emotional roller-coaster the summer was for us all:

We bit our lips as we watched the World Cup semi-final:

We held our breath as 12 boys and one man were trapped in a cave in Thailand;

We cheered or grimaced as Mr Trump arrived in England;

We despaired as our favourite plants wilted under the blazing sun.

For me it was all the more a nail-biting time as my old job came to an end; I had to attend four interviews and my beloved cat went missing for eight days.

However serious or trivial, all these things affect our sleep, concentration or countenance, to a greater or lesser extent. A friend of mine claims that football did 'come home' because it united us as a nation during a time of 'Brexit' turmoil. Whether or not you agree, the international cave rescue effort certainly brought joy and hope, despite one tragic fatality.

On a personal level, throughout the job-hunting process, I prayed that, if I threw lots of balls in the air, God would show me what He wanted by whatever came down, presenting a result that showed the way forward. I admit to several restless nights before the job interviews and asking several friends to pray on my behalf, which they did, and for which I am really grateful.
