

Summer, has a wide variety of shops to interest the visitor. See the map overleaf for details of all our local retailers and businesses. Shopkeepers here are renowned for their friendly and personal service to all their customers.

Ellesmere is steeped in history. At the centre of the town is The Square, dominated by the old Town Hall, which was built by the Countess of Bridgewater in 1833. Typical of the buildings in Ellesmere, it has a fine vaulted cellar.

In 1796 a meeting was held at the Royal Oak Hotel in Ellesmere, to raise money for the Ellesmere canal, which would link Shropshire with Netherpool, later re-named Ellesmere Port. It is said that one million pounds was pledged that morning! To honour the event the hotel's name was changed to 'The Bridgewater Arms'. It is now The Ellesmere Hotel. Eventually the canal was constructed from Llangollen's Horseshoe Falls to Hurleston Junction near Nantwich.



A short walk from the town will bring you to the Wharf. From the towpath you can see Beech House, an imposing building, where Thomas Telford is said to have lived whilst he designed and built the canal.

Ellesmere, originally a fortified Anglo-Saxon settlement, has always enjoyed the vitality of a busy market town. Indeed, regular markets have been held here since 1221 when the first Market Charter was granted by Henry III. Market day is Tuesday.

Walks & Places Of Interest

The canal provides easy and even access to a number of places of interest. Colemere, 2.5 miles (as the canal flows), is renowned for its wildfowl population. Closer to the town is Blakemere, a jewel of nature, which, together with the other meres, was carved from the earth by glacial movement some 12,000 years ago. The absence of traffic, except for the odd narrow boat chugging past, makes this walk one of great tranquillity and peace. There are numerous public footpaths from the towpath back towards the town or to Castlefields and the Mere so your walk can be as long or short as you wish! Canal archaeologists will be interested in the earliest tunnel to carry a towpath and the remains of one of the limekilns which served the area. Close by is also a canal overflow facility.

Eating Out

As often as the weather permits visitors will delight in taking a picnic to one of the beauty spots in the locality. The town has a good source of food shops from which to buy your snacks, as well as cafes, tearooms & restaurants. Most of the public houses and hotels have an impressive menu for lunch and dinner for that special treat.

The town's existence is owed to the Mere (Anglo Saxon for 'lake') as it was used as a defence in ancient times. Meres, unlike lakes, do not have water flowing through them, but depend upon water draining from the surrounding land. This nutrient rich water encourages a wide variety of plant, insect and animal life. The meres are unique in the country and a rarity in global terms. Visit the Visitor Information Centre to find out more.

The Mereside area has recently been extensively remodeled to update all the facilities including the Boathouse Visitor Information Centre, Arboretum, Children's Play Area and Cremorne Gardens. Stroll through The Cremorne Gardens to a children's playground and a nature walk giving wonderful views of the Mere and its wildfowl. For those content to sit and watch the birdlife, there is free roadside parking and numerous seats on the promenade.

During the season you can hire a rowing boat for a trip around The Mere. Between March and May there is an opportunity to see the herons on their nests and feeding their young, via a CCTV screen in the Visitor Information Centre.



Ellesmere is wonderfully located as a centre from which to tour. The historic towns of Shrewsbury and Chester - both well worth a visit - are within easy reach, as is the north coast of Wales.

Why not book in for Bed and Breakfast (at the Visitor Information Centre or Info-Link in town) and take time to enjoy this quintessentially English town set in peaceful, undulating countryside.




