As well as an opportunity to chat with members of the Parish Council informally over wine and nibbles, local residents were treated to a fascinating talk by Howard Tissiman, local member of the Worthys History Group, on the history of the church, which dates back to Saxon times, and is Grade 1 listed.

Annual Parish Report - by Cllr Claire Welland

Chair of the Parish Council, Claire Welland, who lives with her young family in School Lane, gave her report on our activities at the annual parish meeting in St Swithun's Church. The full text of her report can be seen on the parish website.

She explained that the Parish Council is now responsible for a children's play area, in The Dell off Willis Waye. We are looking to improve the play area soon, and local residents have been consulted. Do let us know if you have any good ideas, or if you can help with regular inspections.

Planning applications continue to come in and this has been an increasing trend. Taking control of planning in the village requires us to develop a Village Design Statement. Are you interested in helping with that? Please let us know.

We currently have nearly £25,000 in Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) to spend on improving our Parish. Do let us know if you have any projects you think the Parish Council should be undertaking.

The PC has also set aside funds for a possible future parish election, and \pm 1,500 for future flood mitigation.

We now have a bus stop sign at Taylor's Corner northbound, and have been

working with the City Council, County Council, Worthy Down and developer Skanska, to put back a bus shelter at the entrance to Worthy Down. This should be happening very soon.

Development on the King's Barton (Barton Farm) site continues. As well as the 17 homes developed by Bargate Homes at Barton Farm off Andover Road, many homes at the Cala Homes site are now occupied. At some point, King's Barton may choose to set up their own Parish Council, but for now they are part of this parish. The new path around the Barton Meadows Nature Reserve is available for residents to enjoy. The livestock fencing and gates have been installed. Conversations continue regarding access to footpaths and cycle ways across the site, linking Barton Farm with Headbourne Worthy.




Who's Who on your local Parish Council

REMINDER: Affordable Housing Provision Locally

Headbourne Worthy Parish Council is working with the HARAH Housing Partnership to develop a small affordable housing scheme for people with a local connection to the parish. The Parish Council wants to ensure that people with a local connection to Headbourne Worthy are given first priority for the affordable properties. By local connection we mean people who live, have lived, work or have close family in the parish.

The affordable housing units will be for Shared Ownership and Affordable Rent. We are currently unsure of the housing mix; this will be dependent on local demand.

Only people who have registered will be eligible for an affordable property. If you or someone you know would be interested in one of these affordable properties and have a local connection to Headbourne Worthy is in your/their interest to register as soon as possible.
