As soon as some specific proposals are available it is intended to hold a workshop so ideas can be reviewed and feedback given.

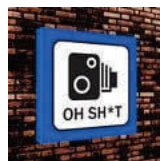

The idea of 30 mph limit is to enable a driver to stop in the event of the of the unexpected.

Speeders need to note T & W are close to introducing mobile Speed detector vans on the B5063 in attempt to bring the average speed somewhat closer to the 30 mph limit.



Housing update from Telford & Wrekin Council

Rodington Parish Housing Needs Survey

You may recall that a housing needs survey was carried out in Rodington parish in March 2010 by Telford & Wrekin Council, with the support of Rodington Parish Council. The survey identified a need for 4 new properties for households currently living in the parish.

Some households indicated a need for affordable housing, however the survey forms were only partially completed and there were no contact details provided. We have therefore not been able to include them in the figures as we do not have all of the information we need to assess their needs.

The survey also showed some potential need for future or "newly forming" households. This refers to people who are currently part of a household but need, or will soon need, their own accommodation. This could apply to adults of any age, but could be, for example, a young person still living at home who will need to set up their own home in the future. Again, we don't have sufficient information about their circumstances to be able to include them in the figures.

The survey was also aimed at finding out if there are any households who are living with another household at the moment but who need their own accommodation as they are overcrowded or sharing facilities. This could be, for example, a family with children living with parents or an older person living with family but who needs their own accommodation.
