

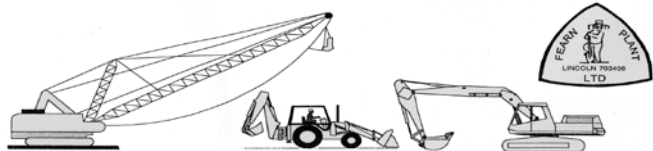

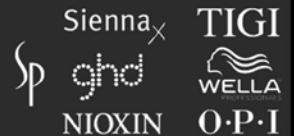

Harby with Swinethorpe Parochial Church Council (PCC)

Dear Parishioners,

We need help to solve an approaching crisis.

Three of the current six PCC members will shortly be leaving the village and two other members are going to be away for the whole of January and February leaving just one.

With normal regular services to arrange during this two month period as well as ensuring cover for any unexpected events such as funeral services, you can see that we have a problem. Although we have a new Rector, the Church cannot operate without others to organise and run the services.

The situation is therefore very serious.

Unless we can get help, the PCC are considering cancelling all services during this two month period and temporarily closing the Church.

We therefore urgently need volunteers to come to join the PCC and to help organise, run and attend services. Can you please help?

October Meeting: Funding for Local Groups

- Community groups were invited to apply for funding towards projects. A total of eight groups applied and the following contributions were made:
 - £ 1,170 Village Hall redecoration
 - £ 600 Bowls Club push along sprayer
 - £ 100 Harby Tea Time hall hire
 - £ 500 Harby History Group re-print of the History of Harby Book
 - £ 630 Harby Playing Fields new seating and bench for toddler area
 - £ tbc Harby LIVES First Responders Group equipment

October General Meeting

- The County Council has awarded a £20 million contract to BT, to provide high speed broadband of up to 80Mbps to 95% of homes and businesses by April 2016, with a minimum of 2Mbps broadband speed for all.
- Joint Community Led Plan (Harby, Wigsley and Thorney) update: An initial survey has been sent to all households to find out residents key issues before developing the main consultation.

November General Meeting (draft)

- The draft budget was set for 2014-15.
- An open meeting is to be arranged with AB Internet who provide high speed broadband in rural areas.
- The County Council is drafting a scheme to address the flooding on Wigsley former airfield.
- The overgrown hedge opposite the school has been cut.
- Tree maintenance work has been arranged for trees on parish land.
- The Council is to register the Harby War Memorial with the War Memorials Trust to record its history and condition.

Planning Applications Update

Application to convert and extend garage to form an annexe to be used solely in connection with Millwell House, Church Road. Parish Council support proposal. Pending decision by NSDC.

Erection of live / work unit on land at Enfield Farm, Station Road. Parish Council object to proposal. Pending decision by NSDC.

New Pre-School Nursery on land next to Janandra, Station Road. Parish Council support proposal. Approved by NSDC.

Erection of wind turbine (maximum height to blade tip 77m) and infrastructure. Following an open meeting Parish Council objected to proposal. Rejected by NSDC. Decision now being appealed to the Secretary of State.

Defibrillator being installed at Harby

The Council has bought a defibrillator, following a suggestion from a local resident. It will shortly be housed outside the Village Hall near the Post Box. The defibrillator is fully automated and can be used by the public, if someone suffers a cardiac arrest. In this situation when you dial 999 the operator would give you the code to open the box and you would take the defibrillator from the box to the casualty to use.

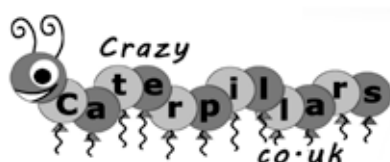

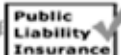

Look two, one's going, one's gone

With the reconditioned bells, our first official engagement was, as mentioned in the last issue, the ringing for the wedding of John Rouston and Julie Davis. The ringing was excellent. I must compliment all the ringers again. The team for this first memorable ring, were Derek Phillips from Eagle, Jayne Rose, **Philip Thomas** (omitted in the last issue, with apologies Philip), Derrick Watson from Spalford, Lorraine Dickinson and myself. Whilst on the apologies section, I must also apologise to **Mr. Geoff Wells** from Coddington. The photo of him, securing the No. 3 bell on the bottom right hand side of the page in the last issue, was named as Mr. George Dawson.

It is said that, you should not start with an apology, well, I have done, two apologies in fact. I like to give value for money. The Newsletter takes me a day or three, therefore I'm apt to forget by the time I've finished, or think I have.

Now to the subject of the bell ringing, by the way, the chat breaks are easy on the legs and bum! Lorraine, thanks again for the cushions, they have now passed the seating trials. Following the aforesaid wedding we held our first practice on the Monday evening, which, considering the slight stiffness of the new ropes, the ringing went rather well. Two days later on the 25th September, "not another practice" I hear the bowls club say. Yes, our first guests to try out the bells were from Thorpe on the Hill tower. Like Harby they also rely on outside help for ringers, with Roy Chapman from Thorpe, the rest, 8 in all, come from the district. We had an enjoyable time, with interesting comments during the evening, although we also, suffered the stiff rope syndrome. This anomaly has since been overcome, with installation of a 25watt heater out of Millie's green house, inserted in a tube along with the ropes. I set a time switch to come on a couple of hours before the ringing is to commence, and 'hey presto' no more 'stiffies'.

Our next practice brought Sue Paine along, for the experience of 'having a go' at bell ringing. Sue through other commitments can only attend alternate Mondays to date, so far Sue is on course to be an addition to the 'famous team'

On 3rd. October final adjustments having been made by Whitechapel to the treble clapper, the bells now ready for the Morning Service on 6th October. The next service was, the Harvest Thanksgiving Service on Sunday 13th October. All Saints had been beautifully decorated with flowers, fruit and veg to the usual high standard. During the service, the bells were dedicated by the Revd. D. Yabbacome. The service was followed by the Harvest Festival Luncheon held this year in the Playing Field Pavilion. The venue turned out to be the best yet. The ladies preparing an Excellent Luncheon, well done all those involved, another, 'best yet'. Guests at the Luncheon were some of the Guild Members who had helped Whitechapel with the Bell Restoration. Four of the Guild Members Ian and Christine Hasman Winthorpe, Geoff Wells (conductor) Coddington, Richard Sutton South Scarle with the aid of Roy Chapman from Thorpe on the Hill and my-self rang the first quarter peel on the restored bells. Exhilarating! This ring, was our contribution to the –Southwell and Nottingham Diocesan Guild 'quarter peel week' I also rang for Caunton's ¼ peel but that ring failed about ¾ of the way through.

Following our ringing for Evensong on Sunday 20th October, we had the pleasure of a team of ringers from Clifton, Nottingham with friends, on Saturday 26th October. They rang for an hour, carrying on to two other Churches afterwards. The ringers were Peter Haywood, Denise Summerton, Sharron and Austin Bryon (St. Mary's Church, Clifton), Margaret and Bernard Smith (Sutton Bonnington), Edward Nicholson (Beeston), Tom Blyth (Saxilby) and Sandra and John Underwood (Lincoln Cathedral).

To conclude this full diary, we then rang 3rd November, for Morning Worship. Whilst in Harby, we maintain a sombre silence in the Belfry for the Remembrance Services, this year, the well attended service was held on 10th November. (The clock struck at 11 o'clock to perfection, for the two minutes silence.) I have since learnt, that other parishes ring rounds for remembrances services, slowly, basically standing almost, at each stroke. Perhaps we will be ringing in this fashion next year, if all agree. Our most recent ring for a service was on Sunday 17th November at 9-00 a.m.

At practice the next evening, we had a surprise visitor, Mr. Ian Stonehouse a campanologist from Barrow on Soar, Loughborough. He had travelled to Harby, to try out the augmentation; He was also great help ringing plain hunt on six bells. Late in the evening we had a stay break, which sadly terminated the practice. Peter Small of Doddington is making us a replacement this week (fingers crossed)..

As I write Peter Scott from Whitechapel has just rung to say that he will be here in the morning to attend to the treble clapper. Hopefully, to take it away to adjust the weight and return the clapper on Friday 22nd November, as the clapper, if not controlled when 'ringing up,' will ring on the incorrect side of the bell.

We in the belfry wish you all the best wishes Pat, in your new home at Faldingworth, you worked wonders for the bell restoration project. Many thanks from us all.
