

News from your local MP - Helen Whatley

Delivering on people's priorities during challenging times

I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas and new year, together with families, friends, and communities for the first time in 3 years

.

After a turbulent year in 2022, things have returned to normal in Parliament recently with important legislation being passed and big announcements made.

Since he took office Rishi has been determined to get on and deliver for the British people, and the plans he set out just before Christmas to tackle the small boats crisis once and for all are testament to that.

We must put an end people losing their lives in the Channel trying to come to the UK. We need an asylum system which is fair — with safe routes for people to come here legally but no tolerance for those who don't — and his plan will do just that.

As you'll have seen in the Chancellor's recent fiscal statement, public finances are under real pressure at the moment after covid and the war in Ukraine. But that doesn't mean we can stop delivering on people's priorities, and that's why there was more money announced for schools and the NHS.

I know how much good that money can do locally as we educate our children and work to clear the NHS backlog.

This is on top of lots of other good news locally, like the recent announcement that Lenham School has been included in the Schools Rebuilding Programme, and as Health Minister I've been working on getting more people cared for in the right place this winter – with Kent getting over £5 million of funding to help free up hospital beds.

I've also been working flat out on other problems that matter to local residents – supporting people with the cost of living, fighting for a solution to Operation Brock, getting Government support for Faversham's swing bridge, talking to police about rural crime, and making sure Maidstone's development meets our needs. I know that for lots of people this winter is going to be really tough. We continue to pay a heavy price for standing with the people of Ukraine in their fight for freedom against oppression - a stand that our children and grandchildren will one day thank us for.

In the meantime, we will get through this. And just like with covid, we will continue to make sure support reaches those who need it for as long as needs be.

Launching my cost-of-living webpage

Everyone is being hit with the rising cost of living at the moment. But for some families, even doing everything right, it's becoming increasingly hard to make ends meet. That's why it's so important that people are claiming the support they're entitled to. There is actually so much help out there, both locally and nationally, but it can be hard to know where to look.

Feeding into Maidstone's Design Plan

We need to make sure that development in Maidstone looks great, protects green space, and meets residents' needs. That's why I recently fed into Maidstone Borough Council's Design and Sustainability plan - calling for design which complements the built and natural environment, promotes good transport links and health and wellbeing, and provides a boost for local employment.

Development should be a positive for people locally, and we have to make sure that it improves and enhances our local area rather than harming it.

Cash boost to get people home from hospital

After a stay in hospital, people should be recovering in the best place for them.

Very often that's at home or in residential care, but sometimes patients can end up waiting in hospital for care to become available. That's not good for them, and it's not good for our hospitals either.

That's why I'm delighted that Kent is getting over £5 million of funding this winter to speed up these discharges. As Minister of State for Health and Social Care I've been working directly on the fund in government and know just how much good this cash can do for our local NHS and its patients.

Good news on rural energy support

As a Government we're determined to make sure everyone gets support with their energy bills this winter. But I know that for some people locally - like park home residents or people using heating oil - it hasn't yet been clear how you're going to get that support.

As a backbencher I campaigned for more clarity, and so I was pleased to get a really positive update from the energy minister recently.

Park home residents will be getting support through their local authority with a scheme launching in January, while heating oil users' support is being doubled and the vast majority will receive it automatically. As always, let me know if you have any further issues and I'll follow up for you.

Success for Lenham School Building bid

Recently we got the wonderful news that The Lenham School has been included in the latest round of the government's School Rebuilding Programme. It's a Government programme to transform 500 schools across England, backed by £1.8 billion of funding this year. We're hoping it will allow them to demolish an old block in a poor state of repair, and replace it with a modern, fit-for-use building, to provide more classroom space.

After coming on leaps and bounds in recent years the school is now well oversubscribed. This investment will mean better facilities and more school places for local kids. It's great news for students and teachers, and it's great news for the village too.

Grafty Gourmet

A great stew with an Italian twist. Simple and comforting on those cold Winter nights.

Chicken Arrabbiata Stew With Parmesan Dumplings

For the stew

2 tablespoons of olive oil 1 onion, thinly sliced 8 skinless and boneless chicken thighs, halved 2 large garlic cloves, crushed 1-1½ teaspoons of chilli flakes 4 tablespoons of sun-dried tomato pesto 250ml of chicken stock 2 x 400g cans of chopped tomatoes 5 thyme sprigs, tied 2 teaspoons of sugar ½ small bunch of parsley, finely chopped

For the dumplings

80g of cold unsalted butter, cubed 150g of self- raising flour 80g of parmesan cheese, grated 50-60ml of milk

- 1. Heat the oil in a large shallow casserole dish. Fry the onion over a low-medium heat for 7 minutes or until soft and turning translucent. Turn up the heat slightly, add the chicken and fry for 5 mins until beginning to brown around the edges. Tip the garlic and chilli into the casserole and fry for 1 minute. Stir through the pesto, pour in the stock and tomatoes, then add the thyme, sugar and some seasoning. Turn the heat to low and cover with a lid. Cook gently for 40 mins. Remove the thyme and check the seasoning.
- 2. Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan. To make the dumplings, put the butter and flour in a bowl with ½ teaspoon of salt, then rub the butter into the flour with your fingertips until it resembles fine breadcrumbs. Mix in 50g of the parmesan cheese and pour in 50ml of the milk, then swiftly combine with a cutlery knife until everything is well distributed and you have a soft dough (add more milk if it's too dry). Briefly bring the dough together on a worksurface, then divide into eight balls.
- 3. Arrange the dumplings over the stew, then scatter each with the remaining cheese. Put in the oven and bake, uncovered, for 25 minutes or until the dumplings are doubled in size and golden brown. Scatter over the parsley and serve.



Anniversary

My anniversary this month is 30th January, the date on which Francis Poulenc died 60 years ago (1963). Born 7th January 1899 he was a French composer and pianist. His compositions include songs, solo piano works, chamber music, choral pieces, operas, ballets, and orchestral concert music. Among the best-known are the piano suite *Trois mouvements perpétuels* (1919), the ballet *Les biches* (1923), the Organ Concerto (1938), the opera *Dialogues des Carmélites* (1957), and the *Gloria* (1959) for soprano, choir, and orchestra.



As the only son of a prosperous manufacturer, Poulenc was expected to follow his father into the family firm, and he was not allowed to enrol at a music college. Largely self-educated musically, he studied with the pianist Ricardo Viñes, and also made the acquaintance of Erik Satie, under whose tutelage he became one of a group of young composers known collectively as Les Six. In his early works Poulenc became known for his high spirits and irreverence. During the 1930s a much more serious side to his nature emerged, particularly in the religious music he composed from 1936 onwards, which he alternated with his more light-hearted works.

In addition to his work as a composer, Poulenc was an accomplished pianist. He toured in Europe

and America and was among the first performers to see the importance of the gramophone. He recorded extensively from 1928 onwards.

Criminals are using cost of living crisis to scam the public – don't' be a victim - The public are being warned to be more vigilant against fraud, particularly about sharing financial and/or personal information, as criminals seek to capitalise on the cost-of-living crisis.

TIPS:

Stop: taking a moment to stop and think before parting with money or information could keep you safe.

Challenge: Could it be fake? It's OK to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you.

Protect: Contact your bank immediately if you think you've fallen for a scam and report it to Action Fraud. www.actionfraud.police.uk/report-phishing

Report: Suspicious emails can be reported by forwarding them to report@phishing.gov.uk. You can also report suspicious test messages by forwarding them to 7726 (it's free of charge).

Here's three of the most common scams circulating right now.

1. Energy Bill Rebates – The messages state that the recipient is "owed" or "eligible" for an energy bill discount as part of the Energy Bill Support Scheme. The emails may reference your energy provider and some include the Ofgem logo in an attempt to legitimise the correspondence. Never click on any links in emails. Households to not need to apply for the Energy Bill Support Scheme as it will be automatically applied by your energy provider.

Remember, your bank or the police will NEVER ask you to transfer money or move it to a safe account.

2. Cost of Living Payments – emails or texts asking you to claim or apply for the payment by registering via a link, which looks genuine, is designed to steal personal and financial information.

Remember, if you are eligible for cost-of-living assistance, you do not need to apply, payment to you is automatic. The DWP will never ask for personal details by SMS or email.

3. Fuel vouchers, phone bill discounts and supermarket offers – There has been a rise in consumers being targeted by emails pretending to be from utility companies offering savings on energy bills, fuel vouchers, phone bill discounts and supermarket offers. These emails encourage you to register via a link, in reality the offer does not exist and the third-party website is designed to steal your personal or financial information.

If you see an offer that sounds too good to be true, it probably is. Always check the brand's official website to verify whether an offer is authentic.



Happy New Year!

The Church's New Year began with Advent Sunday in preparation for the coming of God's Son, Jesus, on Christmas Day. It is a time for reflecting on and preparing for a new beginning.


