Commonwealth Games 2022 'Work hard - Have Courage - Be Kind'



By the time you read this, it will all be over... is it a sign of relief or have you enjoyed the coverage? This year the Paralympics are included in the one big event which is a great thing. Individuals and teams have given their all, some have excelled, others have been totally

surprised, some have experienced deep disappointment, sometimes the difference as little as 3/100th of a second.

When you see the winners climb the podium, receive the medal, turn to face the flag of their nation, it isn't difficult to be moved, to perhaps even feel such joy both with them and for them. To watch as their anthem begins, their faces torn between tears and smiles, their lips move to sing or to quiver... it is a unique moment and we rarely see it. There are so many stories about going for gold, winning and what it really all means. This is just one of many...

It was the 400 metres in the paras in the 1980s. It was late in the afternoon and the crowd was beginning to disperse, and there were only two boys in the penultimate race of the day. The coach of one boy was preparing for the big win. The gun went off, the boys started out. It was so painful to watch them, struggling with calipers on their legs, trying their hardest. The reporter can remember thinking: *'thank goodness I am not like that'*. Then a voice boomed out: *"Come on Joey, go for it, run!"* He continued to shout, bellowing encouragement and his voice caught the imagination of the crowd and they began chanting: Joey, Joey, Joey. The coach was getting more and more animated as Joey gained a commanding lead. He was already way out in front, and it seemed the coach didn't know about courtesy, civility, consideration. He just got louder and louder.

And then suddenly, twenty metres from the finish line Joey stopped. The crowd could hardly believe it. The cheering died away, there was an eerie silence broken by the coach who looked like he was about to explode. *'You've got to finish the race, Joey. Don't stop now, keep going'*. The reporter for Time Magazine couldn't help thinking again: *'thank goodness I am not like him. How can he really be a winner?'*

But Joey looked up, waved at the crowd, waved at his mum and dad, and then waved at the coach who was now beside himself. There was a deathly hush as Billy finally caught up. Then Joey took Billy by the hand and said: *'Billy, let's finish the race together'*. And they did. The crowd who had cheered Joey before went ballistic, the coach collapsed on the ground weeping and the reporter for Time Magazine fell on his knees, moved beyond words and silently prayed: *'Lord, forgive me, make me like Joey.'*

I heard this story over 30 years ago, and it still touches my heart because I know it speaks of deeper truths. This last July, at a Primary School Year Six final assembly, the retiring head gave the leavers some precious words of wisdom gained over the years: *Work Hard – Have Courage – Be Kind*. It was **the** best advice. Advice that would hold any competitors in good stead; it is advice that holds and helps us as human beings in our communities and as Christians, the light of Christ will shine through us if we give of our very best, be courageous in our giving (time and talents and well as money) and generous in our kindness.

This comes with very best wishes to all those returning to school, college or university and to those who are beginning – somewhere or something new. **Work Hard – Have Courage – Be Kind**.

I am in conversation with the Diocese about a Benefice profile for a replacement for Helen O'Sullivan our associate Vicar who left post a few months ago. Without a full-time stipendiary role, this will no doubt affect what we are able to deliver as a ministry team in relation to Sunday Services, though hopefully there will be minimal impact.





SMB Play Area Update

Since last year, the co-opted members of the Recreational Committee have continued to explore funding options to kick start the Play Area project, including available grants through Hampshire County Council and Basingstoke and Dean Council. We found that both councils currently do not have available funding.

To help us reach our £125,000 goal, we are applying for a community grant through the Greenham Trust and have created a fundraising page on their platform The Good Exchange, which is open until June 2023. We have succeeded in securing match funding for every £1 donated (up to £5k) starting now. Should you wish to donate, please visit thegoodexchange.com and search for 'St Mary Bourne Parish Council.'

With the new Village Cafe coming along, the project will enhance the space for families and residents, with a new, natural play area for under 12s. In the coming months, we will engage with the school to get input from the children. A meeting is also being planned for mid-September to look at the wider use of the Rec and pavilion, as well as the additional parking spaces that will be created from the play area project.

I'm always interested in the life of the village and retirement has provided the opportunity to get more involved.

Ed Makgill

Growing up in the idyllic settings of St Mary Bourne and the surrounding parish is a privilege, I now feel honoured my family will enjoy it too. I cannot imagine living anywhere else.

Keen interest in nature and the countryside that surrounds it. Like to keep active, either walking the dog or plodding up and down hills of the Bourne Valley on a run. I enjoy using creative solutions in tackling all projects big and small.

Joining the parish council is a great opportunity for me to help give back to the community that I grew up in.

Parish Council Activities

Bridge in slightly Troubled Waters - As many will know, unfortunately the bridge in the middle of SMB has been hit, again, by an articulated lorry.

This has been reported to Hampshire Highways and we wait for the repairs to take place. The warning barrier will remain in place until such time.

On top of the repair, we will also be encouraging Hampshire Highways to look at how this can be prevented or minimised from reoccurring. We don't know what this will

look like at this moment, but we will keep everyone updated as we learn more.

Speeding - One area we will also be pushing is speed in and around the parish. There are areas that are prone to higher speeding and, especially leading into villages and hamlets, this has been raised as a concern.

We wait to hear from Hampshire Highways what options we have, but as soon as we do, there will be much consultation about the best way forward.

In and around the Rec - The recreation ground in St Mary Bourne is possibly busier now than it has ever been and this is a great reflection on all those who make this work. The Village Centre, play area, bowls, the various cricket teams and the rec itself are all attracting more locals to come and utilise this wonderful space.

Of course, the village shop and the Café due to open soon will also add to this space, and so it may be time that we collectively need to plan and consider how this space will operate in the short term, but also be a little more considerate of how it will need to evolve to deliver a benefit over the next decade or more.

Much planning and discussion ahead, but this will start with a collective meet in the Village Centre during mid-September. All will be most welcome to come along to this collective discussion, from where we can then start to draw up some ideas and plans. More information will be posted and circulated when a date has been set.

'Hide and Lookie' - There has been successful activity with the National Lottery funding to install an observation hide around the lake. Finer details are being completed along with discussions with residents overlooking the lake and more details will be provided on the PC website. The grant has around six months until any installation needs to occur, so there is time to plan and discuss.

If anyone would like to get more involved with maintenance works around the lake side, please get in touch with Oliver Madge and get added to the working party group.



Welcoming new faces at Two Rivers Medical Partnership – and the “pod” system explained

We are delighted to announce that Dr Stephen Rohan has joined Two Rivers as a 5th lead GP. Dr Rohan completed his final year of GP training with us and is a fantastic doctor, so we feel really fortunate that he chose to stay with us. Moving to five pod teams will improve our resilience with an ever-increasing workload and enable us to retain continuity in 5 slightly smaller pods from September.

We are also fortunate to announce Alice Barker who joins our practice nursing team. Winnie Sheppard will become the overall nursing team lead. At the same time, we say goodbye to Allison Spittles who many will know has led our diabetes service for many years who retires from the end of August. We have also employed 5 new receptionists to assist with the volume of calls coming into the surgery and have been working behind the scenes to evolve the booking templates.

What is a pod? As a lead GP we each lead a ‘pod’ of clinicians which may include a retained GP, GP registrar, and Advanced Nurse Practitioner. This allows the lead GP to spend greater time with the more complex patients whose needs are not suited to the old fashioned 10-minute NHS GP appointment but also allows time to support the wider team of clinicians. Our teams are gradually becoming more advanced and so all members are increasingly taking on more complexity – a positive reflection of their hard work and culture of learning.

Our team have continued to navigate the pandemic world with care, often with conflicting messages from health agencies, government and in the media. We thank you for both your understanding and support as we continue to evolve the booking system from September and adapt the service to best meet our patient’s needs.

Light Touch Nor any drop to drink

This summer has been so different from our traditional depressingly wet ones. Wildlife has suffered badly

with the few ponds in the countryside empty, unconnected water troughs in the fields bone dry, rivers very low and vegetation dying. Animals have had to rely on us for survival and there may be more droughts to come in future years. The easiest way to help birds and small animals is to put down shallow trays of water in a shady place, preferably sunk into the ground and with a stone or two inside to prevent tiny creatures drowning. The stones also allow bees etc. to get a drink. Also make sure any garden ponds are regularly topped up preferably from water butts.



The Australians invented simple water stations after their terrible fires last year, which councils are giving out for free this year now droughts are more common. These are made from a few pieces of drainage pipe which creates a vacuum letting the water down as the animal’s drink. You may have noticed the ones in Hirst meadow and the churchyard. Postcard from Binley – September 2022

My thanks this month go to Binley legend, Frank Lee. Although Frank doesn't actually live in Binley I feel his patronage of the Hurdlers Arms over the years has earned him honorary Binley Resident status. I'm sure he'll accept that in the spirit with which it is intended, Frank is and always has been an absolute gentleman. And he very kindly lent me a book, "Beyond the Old Royal Road" by Gordon Lee. It is, as was very fashionable at the time, a gentleman's documented ramble around the countryside from Winchester in the east meandering eventually to Stonehenge in the west. It is set in that golden period between the wars and applies to the old stretch of mingled Roman Road and ancient British trackway that passes along the top of the chalk hills from Winchester to Salisbury and which even today can be traversed almost in its entirety. The hero of this thoroughfare is King Arthur, he of the round table and it was his established line of communication between Winchester, on through our valley and then onward to those western settlements associated with his name.

Arriving at Egbury Castle Farm, once the site of an ancient British camp our author is told by a labourer "They sez as 'ow there is a golden table buried in the vield." In my time here I have heard old timers refer to a field as "vield" and 'un instead of "you" as in "Don't be scared of my dog, he'll not harm 'un!" A great exponent of this dialect was Harold Cummins who I was fortunate to live above in Baptist Hill when he lived in Belle Vue Cottages. We got on like a house on fire and would often lean on the railings over the Bourne and chat about nonsense on our way to the Coronation Arms. I loved hearing Harold talk and I would often call in at the wood kiln on Stoke Hill where Harold and Tony Golding would be sat whiling the time away, drinking tea and messing about with bits of wood. He also had the unique ability to thread what I shall call the "Anglo Saxon vernacular" into the middle of words, if you know what I mean? It takes quite a level of skill! I've only ever known one other person who could do that and he was an Irish ghillie on the Cork Blackwater. Thirty-five years ago I would have sat quietly in the Hurdlers having a midweek pint and listened to old boys from the surrounding villages talk exactly like that. They used words like "Bungersome" meaning clumsy or "Hopperty boy", an awkward overgrown lad. Some words are still universally in use like "shirty", to be angry or "chaff", to scold. My favourite though is "Dew-bit", meaning an early breakfast and it's one I have adopted myself as it is such a wonderful turn of phrase. But all these words were part of a rich figurative language here in the valley that was used with perfect naturalness and one can only mourn its passing.

Walking by what is now Vitacress, the author Gordon Lee remarks on the presence of redshanks, snipe, plovers and yellow wagtail. Now yellow wagtail I have seen myself, but I would be interested to know if the others are still present. I used to see the odd snipe up by the gravel pits in Stoke so maybe someone will tell me. But here's something I didn't know, Rosemary Plincke's old place, "Portway" opposite the entrance to Derrydown is the site of the old Roman road of the same name connecting Salisbury and Silchester. I assume it went right through Rosemary's garden, on up past the surgery to the Barry Walsh's and beyond. It's certainly as straight as an arrow as Google maps will tell you. My father-in-law had told me it went past his place at Bradley farm (Dunley) and the paving was four to six inches

under the soils surface. This stuff fascinates me, particularly as he mentions three round Celtic barrows between SMB and Stoke adjacent to the stream. Water played an important part in Celtic nature worship and if anyone has any information on these I would love to hear from you (postcardfrombinley@gmail.com).

Since I mentioned sticks a couple of issues back, Peter Corbett has been asking me to come and view his stick collection. And so it transpired that the other morning I did. Poor Peter is still recovering from a broken hip so we had to travel from room to room via a zimmer frame which as you can imagine in an old house is a little tricky. Sticks were propped up in the corners of most of these rooms, he could tell me where each one came from, who made it, gave it to him and when. There were many beautiful examples and I was amazed to see how beautiful polished horn could become, opalesque in colour and transparency. Some of the hand carving was absolutely exquisite. Most were hazel or blackthorn but one though had me stumped. It was about three feet long and spiralled in design with a carved snakes head at the bulbous end. I thought maybe corkscrew hazel but it was too "whippy" for that. I'm glad I didn't have money on it because it turned out to be a dried and preserved Bull's todger! Certainly, the first and hopefully the last I'll ever have my hands on!

Peter has been here in Binley for 52 years and spending that hour in his company was like being in Jack Hargreaves' shed, only grander. He has a wealth of knowledge, history and tales to tell. I have learned so much about Binley from Peter, Richard Simmons and Elizabeth and Mark Maclay. I should persuade them to allow me to record their thoughts and memories and perhaps get something scribbled down. I would hate for it all to be lost. NA

Grants available for community chalk stream projects

Keen to take action for our local chalk streams, but need help to make your idea a reality? The Watercress and Winterbournes scheme is offering funding for community-led projects that protect, enhance, or celebrate the Candover Brook, Cheriton Stream, Bourne Rivulet, Pillhill Brook, River Arle, Upper Anton, or Upper Test.

Your project must be based around at least one of the above streams, and must support one of two aims. It could improve the condition of locally important chalk stream habitats, or their associated built heritage. It could also enable people to explore, enjoy and learn about the streams' natural and cultural heritage. The proposed activities should be accessible to, or beneficial for, the wider public.

We'd love to hear from passionate groups of people with the drive to bring their vision to life. You might be part of a parish council, a school, a registered charity, or a Community Interest Company. Voluntary and community groups are also welcome, provided you're constituted and have your own bank account. If successful, you'll receive up to £5,000 in funding and have one year to complete your activities.

The projects funded so far have been varied. New Alresford Town Trust created information materials that capture the unique story of the town's Eel House. Hampshire Bat Group installed 35 roosting boxes to support the bats that thrive along our chalk streams. Andover Trees United connected communities with the Upper Anton through artist-led walks and musical performances. Finally, the Watercress Way Charity are currently developing a programme of educational events focused on the River Arle.

The deadline for the next round of funding is Monday 3rd October, but we recommend expressing your interest as soon as possible. 




BIRDS OF LONGPARISH

By Chris Bowman

THE HOOPOE

We had a rare visitor to the village, first seen in Jacqui Healey's garden. It spent some time in Forton before relocating back to Southside Road. It's a new bird for the village, but not seen by me.

Hoopoes are about the same size as a Jay, long curve-billed, pinkish, ground feeding bird with bold cream-white bars over black wings, rump, and tail-base and remarkable crest. When excited, the Hoopoe fans its crest and makes itself large-headed. Thirty plus cases of proved breeding since 1830's; peaks 1895-1906 and 1950; latest confirmed 1977 four pairs nested in Somerset, Surrey, and Sussex. Breeding starts in Central Europe in late April - May. They nest in holes in trees or buildings and have used nest boxes lined with leaves and grass. 4-10 eggs are laid and incubated for 14-20 days and fledge at 26-29 days. Hoopoes' food consists primarily of larger insects and their larvae. Normally the Hoopoe forages alone on the ground, by walking about jabbing with its bill left and right and probing into the ground.



Summer is nearly over, and the big migration has started. The Swifts left 4 days early and the Swallows and House Martins are getting ready to leave after a long hot summer.

Margaret Brunsdon

And it wasn't just immediate family she cared for, Nan would regularly take in and feed most waifs and strays that she came across, fortunately for us, that also included my dad!!

Since Grandad passed, we still tried to ensure Nan got out and about as much as possible, whether that was simply down to Mum's for a roast or BBQ and a cheeky game of shot roulette, or further afield such as a mystery day trip down to Exmoor, or even a visit to the nature reserve in Dorset, where I took her around the woods to see the flowering Bluebells. I know a favourite evening of hers was when the Wurzels came and played at The Cricketers in the village, I'm not sure if it was the music she enjoyed most or the fact that she was being chatted up by young lads regularly throughout the evening!

Nan insisted she would NOT be going into a nursing home and wanted nothing more than to spend the rest of her days in her own home. Whilst we all will miss her, we can be comforted in the knowledge, that Nan got her wish, she remained in Longparish and passed peacefully away in her own home. And now I'm sure she's happily reunited with Grandad once more!



Each episode includes chats with the Mill's weavers and tacklers and interviews with experts on the broader topics of weaving and silk, sustainable textiles and how silk made at the Mill is used. The most recent episode (no.6) is out now, and covers traditions and silk weaving heritage.
