Speed watch

As mentioned last month, the Council needs 9 -12 volunteers to make a Speed Watch programme in Moulford viable. We do not yet have enough volunteers to proceed, so this is another call for expressions of interest.

Green Spaces

Playground - Volunteers in the Green Spaces team regularly check the playground area, but as always, if you notice anything of immediate concern, please email parishclerk@moulsford-pc.org.uk in case we have not picked up on it yet. The Playground Inspection Company will be carrying out the annual inspection of Moulford's playground during April.

Basketball Goal - The Council is waiting for the results of the annual playground inspection report before planning when to refurbish the surface.

Wheel chair accessible path - The Council is liaising with Hanning Homes (The Old Vicarage) and the Pavilion Management Committee to agree a route for a path linking The Old Vicarage to the Pavilion. This will be a rubberised surface to provide wheelchair access for all who require it. Given the pressure on the parking and turning area, the route currently being favoured is to access the Pavilion via the verandah.

Badger Bank Bench - The Beacroft Farm's team have kindly removed the bench so it can be under dry cover for a short period while it undergoes some routine maintenance.



Wittenham Clumps

SODC are working with The Earth Trust to enhance accessibility and footpaths at Wittenham Clumps. It is planned that this work will be completed in the Summer. This includes 80 additional parking spaces.

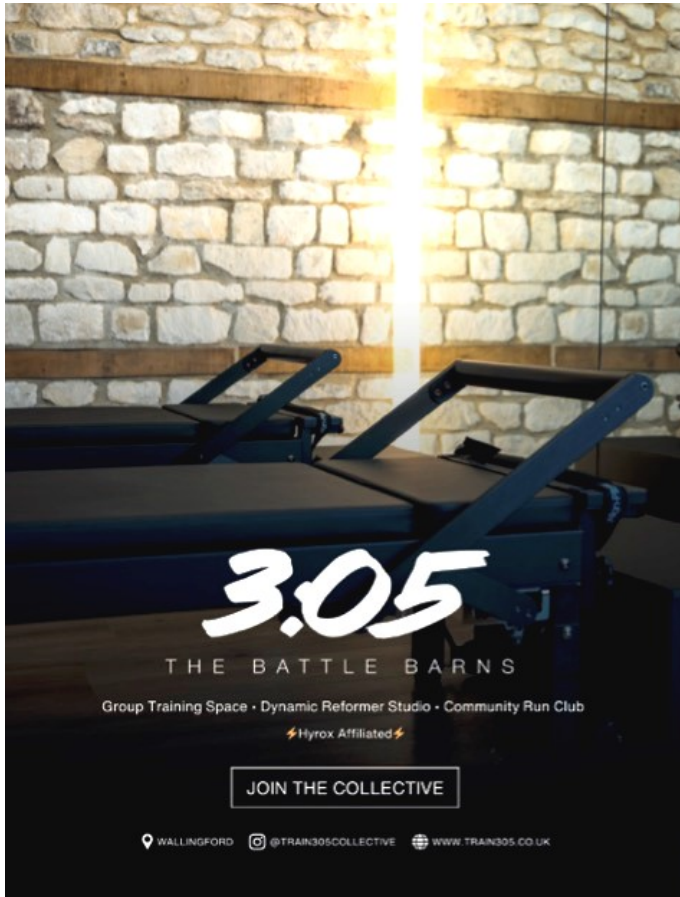

Youth, Age and Rest

Our small village today is home to two outstanding independent schools which provide excellent education to over 960 students each year. For comparison, the 2021 census for Moulsford reported 586 residents. A village school was founded in 1828 and opened in 1851, but closed in 1980 due to falling enrolment, and is now The Clock House, a private home.

Moulsford’s two schools are linked in their early history. Cranford House is a Grade II listed building. The school began where Moulsford Prep is now sited. The building was built in 1875 by Mr. Hawkins, a Wallingford merchant. Founded in 1931 by Winifred Laurence in her own home for one pupil, Billy Higgs; the school expanded and by 1950 had 136 students. In 1953, the school acquired Moulsford House and part of the school moved across the street.

By 1961, the increase of traffic volume made crossing the street dangerous and the school moved entirely to its current location. (Seems traffic has been a problem in our village for over 60 years!) Miss Laurence sold her home in 1961 and the buyers opened it as Moulsford Preparatory School with 13 students.

Comfort for Older Folks

The Old Vicarage was a new addition to Moulsford when it was built in 1847 as a home for the first perpetual Curate of Moulsford, Rev. George Kidd Morrell. His relative, Baker Morrell, paid £2639 with some help from Queen Ann’s Bounty and the Berkshire Diocesan Society.



St. John the Baptist church was rebuilt at the same time, and its cemetery is the vicar’s eternal resting place. Also resting is Hopewell James Shuldham Morrell, who owned the Moulsford estate from 1903 to 1906 and was an avid football player.

Recently purchased by Hanning Homes Ltd., The Old Vicarage will continue to provide quality care for the elderly. Notable visitors of the past include Princess Margaret in 1999.

St. John the Baptist Church

As of 1922, the Vicarage and Vine Cottage were the only buildings in Moulsoford not owned as part of the Col. W. N. Jones estate. Our village church retains some of the original medieval building including a 13th century lancet window. In 1846, the church was redesigned by Sir George Gilbert Scott based on a Gothic Revival style. Its three bells were recast in Oxford in 1847 and ring today.

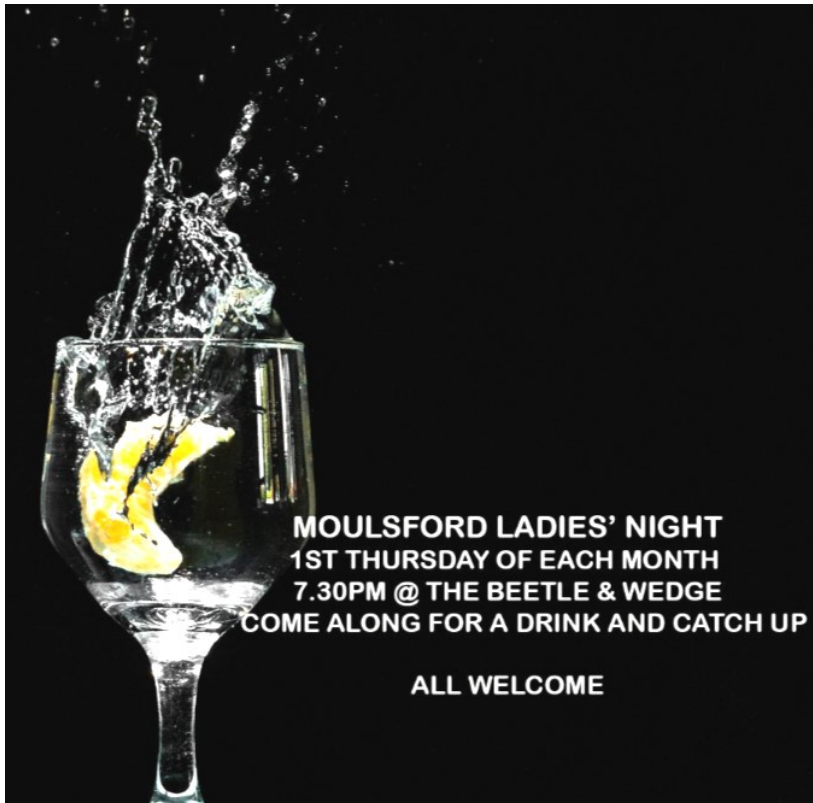
Thank you to all who helped at the Coffee Shop in March and to all of you who came along.

Goring Chamber Choir Celebrates 75th Anniversary with Ambitious Baroque Programme

Goring Chamber Choir will mark its 75th anniversary with an exceptional concert at Douai Abbey on Saturday, 16th May at 7:30pm, centered on the Magnificat - Mary's own song of joy and thanksgiving.

"Just as the Magnificat is Mary's song of celebration, this concert is our magnificat - our song of gratitude for 75 years of singing together" says musical director Frances Brewitt-Taylor.

The choir tackles Bach's magnificent and powerful Magnificat - a major undertaking last performed by the ensemble in 1995. With its highly demanding chorus parts and exquisite orchestral scoring, Bach's masterwork captures everything from explosive joy to tender beauty in Mary's famous canticle.

The celebration continues with the Durante Magnificat (formerly attributed to Pergolesi), sharing Bach's joyful atmosphere, and Mozart's charming offertory motet Alma Deicreatoris. Taking advantage of Douai Abbey's magnificent acoustic, the choir will also perform six contrasting unaccompanied motets by Bruckner, Britten, Timothy Blinko, Frank Ferko, John Tavener and Pierre Villette - each exploring different aspects of Mary's life in an ecstatic range of sound worlds.

"This will be an evening of great vitality, joyfulness and variety," says Brewitt-Taylor. The choir will be accompanied by Oxford's professional baroque orchestra Charivari Agréable, directed by Kah-Ming Ng, and joined by four highly accomplished young soloists.

Local Services

Wallingford Local Producers Market

WPLM is a regular event in many people's calendar.

Based at St Mary-le-More, it's their weekly fix of fresh vegetables, cheese, cakes, bakes, coffee and lots of foody treats.

Inside there's even more, with handmade arts and crafts by local makers; there really is something for everyone. All the food and crafts are made locally and the market has a warm and welcoming community feel. So if you haven't found it yet, go and visit on a Saturday morning between 10am and 12.30pm.

Starting in March, the market will also be in the Market Place on every first Saturday of the month with extended hours between 10am and 1pm (except 1st week of Sept).



Wallingford Emergency Food Bank

We are a registered charity operating a food bank based in the centre of Wallingford with the aim of providing emergency food packages to those who need them. Wallingford Emergency Food Bank was set up by Churches Together in the Wallingford Area and we began serving the community in 2011.
