

Letter from our Rector, Rev. Steve Stewart:

As I write this letter, this week has marked the 20th anniversary of the I I th September 2001 attacks by AI Qaeda terrorists on United States. One of the ongoing themes in the news reporting is of course being that these momentous events changed the world. And in many ways, they did. Somehow the 21st century just feels that little less certain, that little bit less secure than it once did.

The events of 9/11 certainly raised huge questions about the place of religion, faith, dogma, belief in society and the relationship between the different cultures of the world: the so-called "clash of civilisations". It is right for us to ask, Where in this season of uncertainty and change is God? Throughout all of the enormous changes not only in the international arena since 11 September 2001, but also in my own life, I have found that the one place of absolute unchanging, life-affirming, loving certainty is to be found in the person of Jesus Christ. What followed 9/11, irrespective of the rights and wrongs of all sides, was 20 years of war. And, as any student of history will know and have heard, the first casualty of war is the truth. My calling as Rector here is centred in the teaching of the Bible not simply because that is "what clergy do", not because it is a requirement of the job, not because the Bible simply contains nice things which we want to hear (it doesn't always, far from it!) but because I am convinced by reason and have experienced in my life the truth of the treasures within it. The Bible is God's answer to the casualty of the loss of truth in human affairs, political and personal.

The purpose of the church therefore is nothing more than to reveal the truth of Jesus Christ to the world: that He loves you, He died for you to wash away sin, to make you righteous, and by his resurrection to offer you the free gift of eternal life. Our churches here in Hanborough and Freeland seek, through being founded on God's Word, to be loving, welcoming, hopeful places of peace, where world-changing, life-giving truth can be found.



FREELAND PARISH COUNCIL – Lisa's notes from the meeting held on 13th September 2021

Parish Council meetings - change of venue

The next few Parish Council meetings due to be held in October, November and December will be held in the Village Hall rather than the Newell Room, just to keep everyone safe as we head towards the winter months with Covid sadly still hanging around and not going anywhere anytime soon!

I would also like to pass on our thanks to St Mary's Church for accommodating our September meeting following a mix up with a Hall booking.

Inspired Villages Planning Application

Fiona Lehane, one of the "Freeland Friends" who was instrumental in producing and delivering the leaflet about the Inspired Villages planning application, attended the September meeting to deliver an imaginative and brilliant poem that delivered a very clear message "It's not in the Local Plan".

At their meeting on Monday, Freeland Parish Council unanimously agreed to object to this planning application on the grounds that it was <u>inappropriate development for the site and village</u> (including the scale, location and type of development being out of keeping with existing scale and character of the village); <u>poor access to amenities and public transport</u> (most of which are not within walking distance); and <u>poor transport</u> planning (included the fact that the plans proposed to improve the site's accessibility are unrealistic and so will not make the scheme any more sustainable).

With over 200 objections now logged on the WODC Planning Portal, it is clear there is a strong sense of feeling about this application. If you haven't already logged your response, I would strongly urge you all to take a look at the proposals and submit your comments to the Planning Officer at WODC (Joan Desmond). Due to the timing of this application being submitted over the summer holiday season, an extension for comments was granted by WODC and they have confirmed that all comments received will be taken into account right up until date of determination, the date of which, at the time of writing these notes, is not yet known.

Buses

The Freeland Community Bus has resumed its Thursday service into Witney and a timetable is included in this Grapevine on **page 27**.

A new initiative is also being explored with a company called First and Last Mile CIC to provide a bus service between Freeland, Hanborough, Standlake and Eynsham. Nothing has been finalised as yet, but it's looking positive so again watch this space for more details. See **page 33** for more information.

Building a Better Freeland through Neighbourhood Planning

Freeland Parish Council and several Freeland residents learned all about the highs and lows of creating a Neighbourhood Plan on 1st September at an online meeting with Eynsham Parish Council. Despite several large developments planned around Eynsham over the next few years, the Eynsham councillors were clear that having a Neighbourhood Plan has been vital in helping Eynsham gain more say in where and what development happens and how other aspects such as green spaces and traffic calming are managed. To quote one councillor, the village would be 'naked' without its Plan.

With the need for sustainable, affordable housing in the right place raised many times in the responses to the recent retirement village proposal, the Parish Council has decided that it would like to start the Neighbourhood Planning process by setting up a working group and holding exploratory discussions with West Oxfordshire District Council. Three people from the village have agreed provisionally to get involved, but we need lots more hands to make this happen. We would therefore like to ask whether anyone interested in supporting Neighbourhood Planning in any way, big or small – or even if you just want to find out more at this stage – to please get in contact with me at **lisa.fpc@gmail.com**. Time is pressing. Pressure for speculative development is growing, and grants to help create Neighborhood Plans are running out. However, we can develop the future we want for Freeland, but it needs to be with your help.

Oxfordshire Plan 2050 consultation & OxCam Arc Spatial Framework Vision consultation

Oxfordshire Plan 2050 is a long-term plan that will set a framework for future planning decisions.

Various policies have been suggested including addressing climate change, improving environmental quality, creating strong and healthy communities, planning for sustainable travel and connectivity and creating jobs and providing homes. A consultation about these policies is now open to all members of the public and will run until

Friday 8th October, and it can be viewed at **www.oxfordshireopenthought.org**. Printed copies are available at the local library or from WODC offices in Witney.

The Government has also launched a consultation, '**Creating a vision for the Oxford-Cambridge Arc**', on the OxCam Arc Spatial Framework Vision. The Arc spans the five counties of Oxfordshire, Bedfordshire, Buckinghamshire,

Northamptonshire and Cambridgeshire, forming an 'Arc', which provides a place to live for approximately 3.7 million residents and is home to one of the fastest growing economies in England & has been designated by the Government as an area of national economic importance.

In February this year, the Government published details about the intention to create a long-term strategic plan for the Arc, called a 'spatial framework'. This Framework will provide a vision for the future of the whole area to 2050 and beyond, in order to shape future local planning decisions on how land is used, where and what type of new development happens, and what infrastructure is to be provided.

The consultation will run for 12 weeks and is open until **12th October** and is open to all members of the public and can be found here:

There are also strong alternative views on the need and evidential basis for the Arc at all. A local campaigning group which began with the aim of stopping the Oxford-Cambridge Expressway has morphed into campaigning against the Arc (the Expressway was cancelled in March 2021). The District Council is in the process of upgrading some bins so that they will become dual purpose bins (for both litter and dog waste). Please help to keep Freeland the lovely, clean village that we know and love! Thank you, your co-operation is much appreciated.

Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations will be in 2022 to celebrate the first time any British monarch has ever reigned for 70 years. There will be a range of commemorations and one of the main national projects will be a large-scale tree planting campaign all across the UK, to be known as The Queen's Green Canopy. People, voluntary groups, schools and local authorities across the UK are being encouraged to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee". The Parish Council is hoping to get involved in this project and will be looking for suitable sites around the village to plant some trees. The actual planting programme will need to be in two phases; autumn/ winter 2021-22 and then October-December 2022.

The village hall has also been booked for **Sunday 5th June 2022** for a Big Lunch style event and we are looking for anyone who would be willing to help organise this – please get in touch with me if you can offer any assistance. Thanks!

Road Closures - A4095 & Cuckoo Lane

I have been advised that two temporary road closures are due to take place as follows: North Leigh, A4095 Witney Road between Common Road and Park Road – carriageway widening works. Road closed from **29th September – 1st October**. The closure will operate each night from **21.00 to 05.00 hours**.

North Leigh, Cuckoo Lane (past the sawmill turn, near edge of Broadmarsh Woods – Thames Water works. Road closed from 8th – 17th November inclusive. This will be a 24-hour closure. (See also page 19)

Exemptions for both closures are included for police, fire and ambulance services and for the works vehicles and for access to premises which are only accessible from the closed section of road.

Yellow Rattle Trial Sites

Freeland Parish Council are keen to support the Freeland Naturehood's efforts to extend wildlife corridors across all local parishes, and some work of sowing Yellow Rattle on several carefully curated trial sites across the village is in progress. Yellow Rattle is used to slow down the growth of invasive grass species. Once sown in August/September it is hoped further sowing and planting of native perennial meadow species can be done with greater success in the Spring. *Continued......*

ROADWORKS NEAR FREELAND

The A4095, both directions, from Wednesday 29th September up to, and including, Friday 1st October 2021, from 21.00 each night to 05.00 the following morning on the A4095 between the junctions with Common Road and Park Road. During the above times and dates, this section of the A4095 will be completely closed to facilitate section 278 carriageway widening. Diversion signs will be in place directing vehicles via the A4095-A44-A34-A40-B4022 and A4095 and vice versa.

ROMAN VILLA - MOST SUCCESSFUL OPEN DAYS YET

September 11 and 12 proved to be North Leigh Roman Villa Volunteers' most successful open weekend to date.

Saturday saw over **250** visitors to the mosaic, while Sunday achieved the highest attendance on a single day of **330** since the volunteer group started. This made for the busiest weekend at the Roman villa yet. Over one third higher than the best previous weekend.

Among these visitors were 26 volunteer cleaners drawn from Friends of North Leigh Roman Villa, who helped Laura Mountford of English Heritage to clean and conserve the mosaic. One family party involved in cleaning said: "We all thoroughly enjoyed helping clean the mosaic today and wanted to thank you for the opportunity to be involved"

In conversation with the dozen local volunteers staffing the site over the weekend, visitors remarked on the great opportunity to handle so many different Roman artefacts and added: "You've changed the way I think about the Romans." "Thank you for making these dry stones interesting."

This was possible because as well as North Leigh Roman Villa volunteers, the event welcomed volunteers from Tackley Local History Society. They helped set North Leigh villa in the wider Roman context of this part of Oxfordshire, and to provide details to visitors of the newly unearthed villa in Tackley, which has its own mosaic. The event also featured, via a live interview with John Perkins from the Tackley group, on Radio Oxford.

Specialists from English Heritage were also present explaining artefacts and coins from the Roman era.

Another first was the use of a contactless card terminal for donations, alongside cash donations. So far, in addition to the Blenheim Bursary award announced in the summer, visitors in 2021 have donated over **£400** towards improving the site.

Cumulatively, since the North Leigh volunteer group began in the summer of 2019, more than **3,250** visitors have now seen the mosaics at the site.

FREELAND SPEEDWATCH

Many local residents will have noticed that the Freeland Speedwatch team have resumed their activities. Sessions have already been held at varying points along Wroslyn Road, at varying times and on varying days.

Details of speeding vehicles are forwarded to Thames Valley Police who will take appropriate action. It is incredible how many people drive in excess of the 30mph speed limit with many recorded at speeds well in excess of 40mph. One driver was clocked at **63mph**! If anyone drives at excessive speed through the village they are very likely to be caught.

The collection of data is not only important for Thames Valley Police but will also be a useful tool in discussions with Oxfordshire County Council when considering the impact of the proposed Park and Ride and building of Salt Cross, the new garden village. This will be particularly relevant to us if we do not want Freeland to become a route for heavy construction vehicles or to become a rat run.




