

Commemorative Benches and Trees Policy

INTRODUCTION BY BAUGHURST PARISH COUNCIL

This is version 3.1 of the Baughurst Parish Council Commemorative Benches and Trees Policy which has been amended from Version 2 of the Benches Policy to include estimates for the costs and potential locations of commemorative benches and trees. Baughurst Parish Council will consider requests for donated benches or trees to be installed on public spaces within the parish. These facilities will be enjoyed by a wide range of people and the Council will ensure that they are managed and regulated for the mutual benefit of all.

The Parish Council welcomes the donation of benches and seats and trees by parish organisations or residents wishing to remember loved ones. To answer many of the questions organisations and residents may have the Parish Council has written a policy for installing and maintaining memorial and other benches and trees, and a list of sites where we would welcome further seating or trees to be planted.

If an organisation or resident would like to discuss placing a bench or planting a tree either in memory of a loved one or in an area where people could rest whilst walking around the parish, please read this policy and then contact the Clerk to discuss the matter.

This Commemorative Benches and Trees Policy was adopted by the council at its meeting held on 23rd March 2023.

1. OBJECTIVES OF THE POLICY

This policy has been produced with the following guiding principles:

- To be respectful, sympathetic and easily understood by local organisations and residents;
- To balance the sometimes-contrasting needs of the donor and a variety of facility users as benches or trees are not appropriate for all sites;
- To maintain and enhance the appearance of sites and not detract from their prime purpose;
- To clearly establish the responsibility for maintenance, repair and replacement of donated benches or trees;
- To achieve full cost recovery by Baughurst Parish Council for any benches or trees provided.

2. DONATION OF BENCHES

Siting, type of bench and inscription

All existing and potential bench locations and details of the type of bench appropriate for each site in the parish of Baughurst have been mapped and are shown on the Benches Plan for Baughurst. See Appendix A.

Donated benches will only be placed in positions specified in the Plan. A choice of position may be offered but the applicant donor may not specify locations other than those included in the Plan.

All requests regarding the donation of a bench should be made to the Clerk using the application form in Appendix B. All applications will be fully considered by the Parish Council.

A bench will be selected in consultation with the donor, of a type and standard approved by the Parish Council. The bench can either be supplied the donor or the council with the donor meeting the cost.

All inscriptions on plaques to be attached to benches are limited to text only and where appropriate a logo. All plaques are to be approved by the Parish Council to ensure that they are appropriate and comply with other policies.



Costs and future maintenance

The donor will meet the cost of the purchase and installation of the bench and plaque.

The ownership of benches remains with the donor.

Once erected and on the payment of an initial fee based on the type of bench purchased, the basic maintenance of the bench will become the responsibility of the Parish Council during the period of its natural life. Details of the proposed fees are shown in Appendix C.

If major maintenance is required, the donor will be consulted and invited to meet / contribute towards the cost. If repairs are not viable, the donor will be consulted regarding disposal or replacement.

When the bench reaches the end of its natural life, the original donor will be contacted wherever possible, and asked whether they wish to purchase a replacement bench.

The Parish Council reserves the right to remove any donated bench that has been damaged and that in the view of the Council is beyond economical repair or is unsafe having made every effort to contact the donor.

The Parish Council reserves the right to re-locate benches for operational requirements. For short term relocation the donor will not be consulted. For longer term re-location, donors will be advised of the new position and the reasons for moving.

A dedication ceremony is acceptable, but the Parish Council must be informed as to the size of the gathering, the date and time and whether there will be any press involvement.

3. DONATION OF TREES

Siting, type of tree and plaques

All existing and potential tree locations and details of the type of tree appropriate for each site in the parish of Baughurst have been mapped and are shown on the Trees Plan for Baughurst. See Appendix A.

Donated trees will only be placed in positions specified in the Plan. A choice of position may be offered but the applicant donor may not specify locations



other than those included in the Plan.

All requests regarding the donation of a tree should be made to the Clerk using the application form in Appendix B. All applications will be fully considered by the Parish Council.

A tree will be selected in consultation with the donor, of a type and standard approved by the Parish Council. The tree can either be supplied the donor or the council with the donor meeting the cost.

All inscriptions on plaques to be attached to a stake close to the tree are limited to text only and where appropriate a logo. All plaques are to be approved by the Parish Council to ensure that they are appropriate and comply with other policies.

Costs and future maintenance

The donor will meet the cost of the purchase and planting of the tree and installation of the plaque.

The ownership of tree will pass to the Parish Council who will include on the tree register for the parish.

Once planted and on the payment of an initial fee based on the type of bench purchased, the basic maintenance of the tree will become the responsibility of the Parish Council during the period of its natural life. Details of the proposed fees are shown in Appendix C.

If major maintenance is required, the donor will be consulted and invited to meet / contribute towards the cost. If repairs are not viable, the donor will be consulted regarding removal or replacement.

When the tree reaches the end of its natural life, the original donor will be contacted wherever possible, and asked whether they wish to purchase a replacement tree.

The Parish Council reserves the right to remove any donated tree that has been damaged or is unsafe having made every effort to contact the donor.

A dedication ceremony is acceptable, but the Parish Council must be informed as to the size of the gathering, the date and time and whether there will be any press involvement.
