Proposed Options

Each of the options below are under research and not definitive.

The Almonry Development Project – the refurbishment of The Almonry and rebuilding of the south wing to provide a fully accessible and future proofed community building with a Council hub, Tourist Information Point and flexible meeting spaces.

The Reduced Almonry Development Project – the refurbishment of The Almonry, without rebuilding the south wing, to provide an accessible building with a Council hub, Tourist Information Point and accessible toilet outside the building.

Relocate the Council Offices to rented fully accessible premises and rent out all office space in The Almonry - losing public access to Battle's only publicly owned heritage building.

Sell the Almonry and relocate the Council Offices to fully accessible premises, either rented or purchased resulting in the loss of the only publicly owned heritage building and relocation of the Battle Museum of Local History.

Your Voice

The Council is open to discussion and comment and understand that any one of these could be deemed be unviable, as could other options be made apparent. The Strategic Plan, with confirmed costs, will be available in time for consultation at the Parish Assembly.

- \Rightarrow The Council is working closely with RDC Officers to source funding.

A monitory value is difficult to place on some services.
