While contemplating what to write today, I am listening to the Young Chorister of the Year Final: heavenly voices singing of a heavenly event in a stable in Bethlehem.

The first chorister sang "In the Bleak Midwinter" as a solo – a beautiful performance, almost faultless.

I thought of those first words of Christina Rosetti's, which could almost be set in the Cotswolds, and thought, "It is pretty bleak here at the moment, quite cold and frosty".

The winter scene of that first verse is unlikely to have been Mary and Joseph's experience, but bleakness perhaps describes their feelings as they sought somewhere to stay, sleep maybe, and for Mary to deliver her baby.

It must have been chilly at night, and among the animals positively smelly. Not quite the birth experience Mary had been expecting. Not normal, even for first century Palestine standards.

But out of that bleakness came joy. Joy to Mary and Joseph.

And then the visitors pitch up; shepherds and lambs; the angels and archangels are already there, and the Wise Men.

Out of the bleakness came joy. Joy to the world.

It has been, at times, a pretty bleak year; more for some of us than others. Not the year we have expected, not normal.

As we come to the end of it, with the hope that things will be better in 2021, and we once again encounter the birth of Jesus at Christmas, it may not be the Christmas we were expecting. It may not be a "normal" Christmas.

We hope that you will be able to celebrate this very different Christmas with us in the activities which you will find advertised in the pages of this 70x7. You will be most welcome to any or all of them.

Our prayer for you is that out of this bleak year, joy will be yours too, as we celebrate the birth of Christ once again, and look forward with hope to the year ahead.

Hark! the herald angels sing...

Hark! Can you hear it?! Christmas is nearly here and if ever there was an *Awesome* hymn to belt out at the top of your voice, this is it! That this hymn proclaims the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ just makes it even better!

And yet, the word "Hark" suggests that we must listen out for these Angels.

When this hymn was first written in 1739, capitalism was progressing at such a pace that the birth of the industrial revolution was just around the corner. The dawn of the modern world, how it must have felt that everything was changing. Even then, before the construction of William Blake's dark satanic mills, this hymn implies that the Angels already required a certain concentration for us to be able to hear them.

Hark! the herald angels sing. Difficult though it was to hear them in 1739, this year, a quarter of a millennia later, when a million brands clawing for our attention stream through that widescreen window into homes that we have spent a year forbidden to leave, the angelic choir is competing with an incredible cacophony.

And yet, if you listen closely, the sound of the Angels is all around us, in even wider screen.

This morning I looked out of my window towards where the sun was rising. Like any other morning it was an everyday scene. But an exercise I like to do, is allow myself to be awed by the things that I experience, and to allow myself to see (and hear!) the God in things. By listening to the sunlight, those rays were full of God for me, and "full of God" is an awesome thing indeed.

Hark! the herald angels sing. I can hear it, and I hope you can too, in the moments we stop to reflect and be awed by God in front of our face, wherever we choose to see Him, and the wonder and glory of His son, our new born King.

I will be feeling the awe and belting the tune out this Christmas, with you, for you, for God, and joy, and I hope, this strange year, you have many wonderful chances to do so too.
