AL5 Access off A508 (RAB –v- Traffic lights) subject to Highway comments > more to do along with Environmental objections who maybe softening approach;

WN Budget was Passed, expect a Council Tax rise of 4.99%

Green waste charge will increase from £42 to £55 per year per bin

Black bins will be on a 3 weekly collection not fortnightly as present

Car parking increased in Northampton with some modifications to allow for a period of free parking at the weekends.> Expect your bills to arrive probably next week.

Community Voting WNC Days - we received an email asking for residents to vote on priorities for small grants in 3 areas in Northampton. Ken asked about Deanshanger Ward, once we have an answer we can update these were for small grants of £2500 but residents may want to think about schemes now should this money be made available to us.

Gypsy & Traveller Site - Enforcement update. WNC have advised that the people on site are those allowed, the pre occupation conditions have not been complied with as yet but they have allowed a grace period for compliance.

Local Plan Update - Today 1 March I attended a briefing on the WNC Local Plan. The new thinking is that the spatial strategy and local plan part 2 will be replaced with one district wide Local Plan for WNC. They are still working on the timetable and the plan to develop the Plan! However, the plan period will be to approx 2041 which means that an additional 6,000 houses over and above what is currently in the existing plans are required. This should mean many of the sites promoted previously can be reconsidered and hopefully removed. WNC needs a small amount of employment land approx 25 Hectares but may have to take an allocation of additional Strategic Logistics land allocation which in the SEMLEP area is assessed to be in the range of 257 to 575 Hectares (SME LEP is NNC, WNC, MKC, Bedford, Central Beds and Luton)
