

Village Hall News

At our AGM last month, we welcomed a newcomer to our committee, Stefania Graziola (who was the inspiration behind our 'Italian Meal and Magic' evening at the end of March) and we said goodbye to Annie Henderson, who has served on the committee for the last two years and whom we sincerely thank for her past help and support. The committee now comprises myself, Sue Burch, Sarah Cutbill, Stefania, Carol Hulm, Margaret Neaves, Barbara Pearce, Sandra Pilborough, Jacky Simmons, Jacqui Thompson and Robert Turner.

The AGM agreed a number of expenditure priorities (see below) and also considered what future events we might run over the next year. We just don't have the resources at present to mount a major summer event like a fete (which we know many people would like) but we wondered whether a Treasure Hunt, by car or on foot, finishing with a bar-b-que, would be a fun thing to do in the fine weather. Do let me know what you think.

The 'Italian Meal and Magic' evening appeared to be enjoyed by everyone (even by the cooks responsible for turning out the 80+ anti-pastas, lasagnes and desserts!) and it was certainly a financial success, yielding a fantastic profit in the order of £800. This will help us do a number of things, including replacing our ageing (and broken) cooker and buying a large projector screen which will be permanently installed on the ceiling of the stage and able to be pulled down when required (a facility that more than one of our regular hirers have said they would find useful).

More fundamentally, though, we decided at the AGM to do away with the coin operated electricity meters in the Hall. This is a radical step, as the meters yield a worthwhile contribution towards our quarterly electricity bills, but users have said they find it inconvenient to have to find and feed-in 50p coins to use the heaters (and to have to guess how many to use). Also, several people have been confused as to why there are 2 meters and as to what operates off each.

Additionally, there has been a call for improved heating arrangements for the early morning yoga class, in particular. Although the recent roof insulation has helped to maintain heat in the Hall, it is not possible to start the heating process until someone arrives, with a pocketful of 50p coins, to switch on the heaters. Without pre-payment meters, however, we can install a programmer that will automatically bring on the heating prior to a class (or any other event) and automatically switch it off after a given time, or once the Hall is at a set temperature.

This will make the Hall much more user-friendly and efficient – but at a price. The proceeds from the Italian evening will help fund the removal of the meters and the installation of comprehensive controls, but the loss of income from the meters will be on-going. For this reason the committee decided at the AGM that we must raise the Hall hire fee once the meters are removed.

The fee has stood at a very low £6 per hour for some time and, quite apart from the need to recoup the loss of 'meter income', we believe that improvements made (and planned) to Hall facilities justify a modest increase in the fee to £7 per hour, for residents of the Parish and regular hirers (£8 per hour for most others). Given that this sum will include the cost of heating in future, we hope you will agree.

Carriageway Repairs in Your Area

Road Surface Treatment

Liverton Street, Liverton Hill, Headcorn Road, Platt's Heath



When we plan to carry out the work and how long it will take

This is to let you know that, as part of the on-going maintenance and improvement of the highway network, Kent County Council will be treating the surface of Liverton Street, Liverton Hill and Headcom Road, Platts Heath from its junctions Chain Gate Road to a point just past Woodcock Lane.

The Surface Treatment work will start on 16 May 2014 and should be completed in only 2 days. Working hours will be between 9.30am and 3.30pm. This type of work can be affected by bad weather, so if it is not possible for us to carry it out at this time, we will arrange a new date and let you know via a letter drop to your home. We will also put up signs along the road before we start showing the date we plan to start work.

What we plan to do

We will use a product called 'Surface Dressing' to treat the road. Surface dressing is quick to apply, which means less disruption to road users, residents, local businesses and the emergency services. It is a cost effective way of prolonging the life expectancy of the road before any major repair works are required. It also benefits from having a low carbon footprint

Surface dressing is applied directly onto the existing road in two stages. The first is the application of a hot binder which is sprayed onto the road surface and the second is the laying of chippings onto the binder. (Sometimes we lay 2 or more layers of chippings depending on the design). These layers seal the surface to prevent water penetration, restore texture and improve skid resistance. The carriageway is then rolled using a rubber wheeled roller. This is to ensure the chippings are properly embedded and stick into the binder permanently. The continued action of the traffic also helps to embed the chippings as well.

To make sure all the binder is covered with chippings, we lay enough onto the road to ensure a full covering, and to make certain there are no gaps. There will be some loose chippings left, which is quite normal, and consequently we erect 20mph speed limit signs to slow vehicles down as they pass over the new surface. These signs will be on site until the road has settled down and all programmed sweeps have been carried out.

Generally after seven days of the completion of the surfacing the road markings will be reinstated.

How you can help

During these essential works, it will be necessary to use a road closure, so that we can carry out the works safely for both the workforce and road users. Any pavements will remain open at all times. A signed diversion route will be via Lenham Road, Eastwood Road, The Street, Ulcombe Hill, Lenham Road and Headcorn Road.

It is inevitable that residents and businesses near the works will experience some disruption, but we will try to keep these to a minimum. Access to properties will need to be restricted for a short period while work is carried out in front of each property. If you have any particular access needs, please let the workforce on site know.

We need your help to make sure the work is done as quickly as possible and to the best possible quality.

If your vehicle is usually parked on the carriageway, please make sure you park it somewhere else away from the site whilst the works are carried out, so the road is clear for us to resurface.

Too Much Information? Oh No!

"I need a wheelchair. Where can I get one?" I had no idea until I visited the recent **Community Awareness** event organised by the Parish Council. The answer is the Red Cross. I had always pictured them helping sufferers of conflicts in places across the world but they have a base in Kent from which they help local people at times of crisis. So do contact them (0800 0280 831) for items including bed cradles, back rests, commode chairs as well as a wide range of wheel chairs.

I collected leaflets from several organisations including Kent Fire and Rescue Service, Kent Police, Brighter Futures, Voluntary Action Maidstone and CROP. The latter is an advocacy group new to me. They have an office in Lenham (01622 851200). Their staff are available to advise on consumer disputes, abuse, family conflict and the difficulties associated with moving into sheltered accommodation or residential care. Completing application forms for attendance allowances, disability allowances and so on are a nightmare but CROP staff will help.

Voluntary Action Maidstone (01622 756662) run a transport service for those who because of illness, frailty, age or disability cannot manage on public transport. There are costs. The charge for a journey of under 75 miles in Kent is 45p per mile plus a booking fee of £4.

I learned so much. I had no idea, for example, of the number of people who are victims of a variety of scams. A DVD shown by the charity THINK JESSICA (www.thinkjessica.com) enlightened me.

Information about Maidstone Borough Council's plans for residential development was available and councillors encouraged residents to attend the presentation in Headcorn later in the day.

This was a valuable event for the community. There was opportunity to meet those involved in community life including councillors and KCC community warden Stuart Ellesmere. There was also an endless supply of tea served by Margaret Neaves and a box of Quality Street.

During the afternoon Joanne Harris of AW Court presented a defibrillator to KFRS Community Volunteer Chris Wheal. This will be located at AW Court and operational arrangements for it are being made and will be published as soon as possible.

Ulcombe C of E Primary School News

I have been asked to use the following quote from Peter Titchener the chairman of Ulcombe Parish Council as the content of the school article this month:-

"Miss. Emma Hickling took over Ulcombe Church of England Primary School as executive headteacher in November 2013. She was already the headteacher at Kingswood primary school. Ulcombe school was vulnerable; it had falling standards and a falling roll. The staff were very supportive and we worked well as a team to improve the school rapidly.

In December 2013, the school was inspected by OFSTED and received a "requires improvement" judgement. This was a huge improvement on the grade the local authority had judged it to be in November 2013.

In January 2014, she also became the executive headteacher of Leeds and Broomfield Church of England Primary School, as the collaboration extended to include the third school. A collaboration of this type allows the leadership across the schools to strengthen, and the schools to be in a stable position.

The executive headteacher is training to be an OFSTED inspector and a Kent Leader of Education.

Grafty Geeks - Adware Remover

Have you ever accidentally downloaded internet browsers when downloading other applications and wondered where they came from eg: MySearchDial.

After downloading a useful application like WinZip or Skype you suddenly find when opening the normal Internet Browser (Google or Internet Explorer) you get additional tabs appear automatically eg:



These come as packages when you download other applications and are hidden in the download questions, so if you don't pay full attention and just keep clicking yes when accepting agreements you may accept something you didn't expect and will then find that the Internet Browser is behaving differently the next time you use it, which can be very annoying.

These are known as Adware and some can be viruses so you need to remove them. They can sometimes be very difficult to remove, especially MySearchDial, as it does not go away if you uninstall in the normal Control Panel, Programs and Features, Uninstall function.

Luckily there is a very useful tool that I found when this happened to me called Adware Remover. It's free, provided by a group called Techsupportall, is very efficient, quick and completely removes the offending Adware.

Search for it in your browser, download it and then select Scan and Repair. It takes about 10 mins in total and is well worth it.

If it works for you, consider giving a donation via PayPal as it says on their site as this type of help is worth supporting.

A very simple yet tasty pasta dish that can be eaten all year round. Simply serve with salad.

Chicken & Chorizo Pasta Bake - Serves 4

250g penne pasta

1 table spoon of olive oil

4 boneless chicken breasts - cubed

1 red pepper - chopped

250ml of single cream

1/2 tea spoon of dried red chilli flakes

100g grated mozzarella and cheddar

mix

25g fresh chorizo sausage - diced

25g freshly grated parmesan cheese

300g passata

(optional)

- 1. Preheat oven to 190 degrees C. Bring a large pan of lightly salted water to the boil. Add pasta and cook for 8-10 mins or until al dente, drain and set aside.
- 2. Heat the olive oil in a large deep frying pan over medium/ high heat. Add the chicken and lightly brown on all sides. Add the red pepper and chorizo and cook for 5 minutes until the chorizo is hot and the chicken is no longer pink in the centre.
- 3. Add the chilli flakes and cook for 1 minute. Add the passata and cream, bring to a simmer over medium/high heat, then reduce heat to medium/low and simmer for 5 minutes, until the sauce has thickened.
- 4. Add the drained pasta to the frying pan and mix well. Spoon the mixture into an ovenproof dish, Add about a quarter of the cheddar and mozzarella mix and stir into the sauce mixture. Sprinkle the remaining cheese over the top. Bake in the centre of the oven for 15 minutes or when the top is golden.
