What's in a handshake?

My Dear Friends

A simple handshake given between two men, yet so mixed was the reaction. When the Prime Minister symbolically shook hands with Gerry Adams, it provoked such different feelings, from hatred and rage to relief and jubilation. Some are angry because they believe that the evil violence of the past thirty years has triumphed and that the British Government is caving in to terrorism. "The gun has won" they say. On the other hand, there are those who see the handshake as a vindication of a struggle to right a terrible injustice - the Catholic minority in Northern Ireland are the victims of discrimination. They argue that partition is never a solution, only a compromise that requires constant review, and they will never be satisfied until Ireland is united.

But perhaps the majority welcome the handshake because they recognise the need to take a risk to see whether a compromise is possible. Certainly, the referendum in the North and South of Ireland, they argue, will be helped by attempting to get the hostile elements talking.

The handshake is but a symbol of the paradox we all experience. In a marriage breakdown, in the work place, in the community, we face situations that are not black or white - good or evil. Even if we are the injured party and have been deeply hurt, the challenge of Jesus is to reach out and find ways of building bridges. But Jesus goes further. He does not condone evil, indeed he died to refute evil, but he challenges us to forgive - not once, not twice, but seventy times seven. It can be very hard and difficult to offer the handshake of hope, but without that willingness to live with a paradox there is little chance of creating new opportunities and new hope. Could it be that years of prayer and a brave witness for peace are being answered?







Education was not completely free until 1881. The three R's had to be taught and grants were paid by results. Later, physical education was added in the Balfour Education Act, 1901/2.

COMMUNITY POLICE NEWS

I am Richard Lester the community Police Officer for Lyminge and Elham whose "Patch" also includes Elmsted and Bodsham.

I have served 19 years and have worked in various towns across East Kent starting this community role in late July this year.

I will be attending Elmsted Parish Council meetings when possible and am usually at Lyminge car park on Friday morning between 11am and 12 noon in the Shepway Council caravan.

There are currently two campaigns aimed at the motorist. One is to slow down and WATCH your speed through our villages and lanes where you may encounter children or animals. Secondly those of you who drive without Road Tax - if you have not already been stopped at one of our road checks being carried out - there are others planned. Get to the Post Office to save embarrassment.

Crime in your area is generally low; however, continue to lock your house and cars and hide valuables out of sight. Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinators are working very hard and have passed on some good information. If you see anything suspicious phone the Police, take details of car numbers and descriptions of persons and let your co-ordinator know as well.

There is a meeting of all area B co-ordinators planned for Monday 8th December, 7.30pm in Bossingham Village Hall. This will enable anybody interested in our system to come and see how it works.

Parish Newsletter

'CRIME IS FALLING', that is a phrase I cannot say loud enough to the people of the Weald. In the last six months it has dropped by almost 20%. Now we all know people can be very sceptical of statistics, so how about the fact that there have been over 240 fewer victims of house burglary than in the same period last year, down 40%, or 128 fewer cars have been stolen, down 25%? I could go on. The real message is let's keep it falling. There should be no hiding place for the thief! The Weald police have been using many different tactics to achieve such a huge improvement but a lot of these do not include a uniform patrol. For example, Kent police officers recently followed a team of burglars from the scene of their crimes in the Weald to the Thames Valley area where they and others were arrested for many offences. You could not do that with a uniform patrol. On the other hand an operation to stop repetitive milk bottle thefts was carried out successfully by uniform officers, and again nobody living in the area saw the police. The young thieves did though, much to their surprise!! I therefore again say just because you don't see a police uniform it does not mean that there is no police presence!

You do though have a valuable role to play in making it more difficult for the thief. With the dark evenings now back with us do you come home to a house in darkness? Does it look empty? This can and does attract the eyes of the criminal. You do live in a very safe area of the County but don't make it easy for him, or indeed her to work it out. A timer for your lights and radio is a good simple precaution. It also welcomes you home. Think about what you can do, it need not cost a lot.
