The meeting started at 7.00pm	
Cllr Whybrow welcomed everyone to the meeting. The idea is to engage with the residents, it has been difficult to represent the residents of Sevington due to lack of engagement. The Finberry residents represent themselves at meetings but no-one from Sevington has ever attended the Parish Council meetings.	
Apologies for absence had been received from Cllr Steve Campkin.	
Public session: To receive questions and comments from the public on any agenda item. Business Park Car Meets: There have been recent car meets which have caused a nuisance to neighbours of the business park in Church Road. This appears to be a monthly meeting. The PCSOs and Police are looking to stop the next meeting. Cllr Nilssen, Cllr Whybrow and PCSO Luke Jones spoke on Saturday. Club-unknown" are expected to close the meet via Facebook. The "day of action" was successful in cracking down on nuisance vehicles on the A2070.	
Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebration The beacon will be lit on 2/6 at 21.45. Some people in Nightingale Close had arranged a street party but would prefer a larger gathering. It was suggested that the playing field could be utilised, residents could bring a picnic. A leaflet to advertise this will be produced and delivered to the residents (the Clerk will produce 126 leaflets). Parking is available at the Church, picnic to be on 2/6 from 3-6pm.	
Update from Cllr Nilssen A KCC newsletter has been delivered as has an ABC newsletter. Cllr Nilssen has reported pot holes to Kent Highways and has been discussing the goal posts on field with Aspire. It is hoped that the posts will be repaired as they are loose and need painting. Cllr Nilssen is also looking for mesh to be placed in the divots.	
Telephone Box Thanks were extended to John Lang for his work on the telephone box. The defibrillator has been installed and looks fantastic. Signage for the telephone box is to be installed. The books placed in the telephone box are an arson risk and are to be removed. The Clerk is to contact the KE and suggest a photo opportunity for 2pm on 5 th May.	
Update regarding Sevington IBF There is a call next week with the DfT, Cllr Bartlett is to be on this call. Cllr Bartlett will discuss: noise, lighting, errant lorries, planting issues, keenness to have regular updates, signs on site to request neighbour consideration. Mr Lang will provide an update to Cllr Bartlett. Cllr Bartlett will request a site meeting for residents.	
Any Other Business Potholes on Church Road have been reported. The land at the rear of Church Road has been viewed by Cllr Whybrow following some concerns. There was no evidence of a water pump, shelters have been removed, there is no livestock on site, a fence	

had been removed but has now been replaced.	
Sevington Mill was discussed. The property has been stripped internally and is to be used for supported living.
