PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

This month I'm covering topics that will help make the village and surrounding areas safe for all of us including the wild birds and animals we are so lucky to share the village with.

The RSPB recommend that you do not cut down trees, hedges or hedgerows from March to the end of August (during the nesting season). A reminder that it is unlawful to cut down hedgerow where there are nesting birds or if you do not own the land! Please also avoid disturbing the habitat of other creatures during their mating seasons such as those that use the hedgerows for food and shelter, nesting hedgehogs that their homes in the long grasses. If you need to strim or cut long grass please walk through it first dragging a stick to make a noise. This will disturb sleeping hogs – give them 15/20 mins to move away before you cut the grass. The damage a strimmer can do to a hog is devastating it only takes a few moments to think before you act.

When the heat is intense please keep a watchful eye on your vulnerable neighbours, it is easy to become dehydrated in this weather and not realise it. Please don't walk your dogs in the height of the heat as the pavements can be very hot. If you live in an area where dogs are walked regularly perhaps putting a bowl of clean water out for the passing dogs would be helpful, not forgetting that wild animals might like to have a night time drink too.

It has been noted that some people have been double parking on the High Street, this practice is dangerous for several reasons:

- 1. You are blocking the pavement and causing people to walk on the road around the car
- 2. Large vehicles have difficulty in passing through the gap
- 3. It causes even more congestion than normal
- 4. It is illegal

The Parish Council have been contacted by Mr Zac England who owns the Quarrying rights to Ham Hill. He has informed the Council that he has put in an application to Somerset Council to increase the quarrying rights for a further 25 years. The plans for this can be found on
