Sadly for us the guy who did the co-ordinating for the A35 Group has moved away and the project manager at HE has left. Suffice to say everything has gone silent. So we are trying to get the Group back together again.</p> <p>What I am writing to you for is that Wilmington is like Chideock split in half by the A35. The pavements are non existent or narrow, we have no crossings at all, this on a road with an average of 15,000 vehicles a day. We have school children crossing the road each day to get their buses. HE originally as part of the project promised us a crossing (we need two) but this has now been taken out of the original project and is a separate project so now will not get funding. It really looks like the only way funding will be found by HE is if someone gets killed.</p> <p>You at Chideock have been there, done it and got the tee shirt (crossings and cameras). We think after 40+ years of promises (lies), the time has come for some action and it would be good to speak to someone on how to succeed."</p>
