

CHARLTON PARISH CHAT AUG/SEPT 25 - PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

The Parish Council (PC) reviewed all 3 festivals (Shindig, Existance and Gem) that have taken place in Charlton Park in the past couple of months:

- 1. <u>Summary of all complaints</u> from residents (and some from residents of surrounding parishes):
- · Noise. Far too loud.
 - · Combined with the type of music heavy low-frequency bass, perhaps made the impact greater.
- · Timings midnight was bad enough, but music to 4am was totally unreasonable.
- · Bad language over loudspeakers, and at great volume. Thought to be GemFest only.
- Mobile phone coverage. With so many extra people, coverage was lost. Impact on at least one home security system. Residents lost ability to make calls. May explain why complainers unable to get through to organizers' response numbers.
- · Lack of response of organizers to complaints. Lack of mobile phone coverage may have added to this problem.
- · Roads and traffic:
 - · Blockages caused by traffic trying to turn right at the Lodge entrance.
 - Problems at the Unleashed exit gate traffic signs/bollards on B4040 on the road not the verge, so an obstruction for west-bound traffic who could not know that east-bound traffic also had a green light.
 - At main exit times the west-bound traffic formed a queue due to the exit being on green for lengthy periods which was a hazard for west-bound traffic approaching through the dip.
 - Some cars parked on Tetbury Lane, drivers/passengers perhaps attempting to walk in without paying.
 - At least one camper van parked at gate end of Park St, thought to be people sleeping there.
- People walking on road (B4040 towards Malmesbury; and in Charlton, exiting Park St)
 in unsafe condition i.e. appeared to be under influence of alcohol, possibly even drugs.
- Drugs at festival (specifically Gem?) reported overheard being discussed in supermarket in town.
- 2. <u>PC Discussion</u>. Various comments by Cllrs:
- \cdot $\;$ Take what festivals say on first meeting with great caution.
- · Volume of bass unacceptable; bad language unacceptable.
- · Community should benefit in some way. (Note Shindig free Thursday, Gem free entrance all weekend, talked of welcoming local employment and traders.)
- · Accept that Estate needs to diversify, but 4am and noise level unacceptable.
- Lord Suffolk "noted all comments, looking at noise levels, will not repeat 2 events same weekend."
- 3. <u>PC Action Now</u>. Discuss with all festivals, report back to PC 4 Sep. 25.



News from the Bell Tower



Due to the efforts of many, for which we are most grateful, the May 10th World Record achievement and Open Tower refreshment and Beer & Cider sales and Sponsorship and a number of generous donations, we managed to raise over £1,500, towards the church facilities project. Which is a good start, with much more to come. We really are very appreciative of all those who contributed to the success of that day, and although I had hoped for a higher figure for the World Record, for the most number of ringers through one tower in a day, which was verified as 176, we can always claim to have set that record in the first place and many people have told me, how much they enjoyed the day.

All the recent learners are making good progress, so we could do with another intake, so we will plan for another Open Taster Day in the Autumn. Bells are not just rung for reminding and welcoming people to Sunday Services, they are rung to celebrate National events such as the King's Coronation, the 80th anniversary of Victory in Europe, but also Weddings and Funerals. Ringers often ring Peals and Quarter Peals to mark certain events of a more personal nature, and on July 10th we rang a Quarter Peal to celebrate the life and work, at the sad passing, of Richenda Milton-Daws, the wife of Christopher, which he was able to join us for. We rang this half muffled, which is the tradition when someone has passed away. The back strokes on the ringing are dampened by a leather pad, which gives the effect of an echo:

Quarter Peal of 1260 changes of Grandsire Doubles, rung half muffled in 47 minutes.

Tuesday 19th August. - Gloucester & Bristol Youth Team (10yrs - 18yrs) are coming to Charlton. Any young people in the Village / Parish that would like to come and see that bell ringing isn't just something for oldies, are most welcome to come between 10.00am - 11.00am and once they move on to their next tower, we will give you a chance to have a go, and that is anyone not just youngster's.

This is an opportunity to discover a hobby that certainly doesn't restrict you to ringing in one place for ever and a day! Having had the good fortune to have rung in the most northerly and most southerly in the World (Inverness Cathedral in Scotland and First Church, Dunedin in the South Island of New Zealand) and a few in between, I can vouch that visiting other towers and ringing and meeting with lots of other people, is one of the highlights to ringing.

N.B. The 'G & B Youth Team' have competed annually for the last 12 or so years in the the Ringing World National Youth Competition, with various degrees of success, recently competing in Birmingham with a total of 320 other young ringers in 37 teams, with classes in 6 bell and 8 bell, Method ringing and Call Changes and also having the opportunity to ring on the peal of 16 bells at St Martin's in the Bullring (only 2 other 16's in the World) and Mobile Belfries.

Also, on Saturday, 23rd 9.15am till 10.15am, the Malmesbury Ringers are visiting.

And on Sunday, 24th at 11.30am a band from Richmond upon Thames are visiting.


A brief update...

Situated on the Lower Moor nature reserve overlooking Cottage Lake is the newly built but already becoming firmly established Dragonfly Café and Nature Centre.


Since 2007 the reserve has been home to a plethora of wildlife from insects to otters and offers the opportunity to get lost in the nature we endeavour to protect.






