OUR PARISH COUNCIL

Here are the last of the questions which we asked of Councillor Peter Bartaby. If there is anything else you would like to know about the workings of the PC, please let us know.

11. What are the responsibilities of individual Councillors? These are laid down in various documents many of which are currently being revised. Perhaps the biggest single attribute for a prospective Councillor would be Common Sense.

12. What are the rules about publicising the agendas and minutes of the PC? Notices of all meetings of a Parish Council (or of a Sub-Committee of the P.C.) have to be published at least 7 days before the date fixed for the meeting. All Members of the Council are sent a copy of the Notice which is also displayed on Parish Notice Boards. Parish Councillors are also sent a copy of the Minutes of the previous meeting as compiled by the Parish Clerk and these are also published and displayed in 'Draft' form on Notice boards for some weeks ahead of each meeting.

13. Does the PC decide points by majority vote, and if so what is a quorum? In the case of any properly proposed and seconded motion a vote is taken and the matter decided by a simple majority. Were the vote to be tied the Chairman would have a

Casting vote. A Quorum is normally stated in the Council's Standing Orders but as W.I. P.C. does not have Standing Orders at the present time I understand that the usual procedure in such circumstances is for a Quorum to be one-third of the Number of Members or Three Members – whichever is the greater.
