# **Parish Council Report**



As mentioned in the last Moulsford News you will notice that some of the playground equipment has now been removed due to some serious rot issues within the timbers. Whilst negotiations are still ongoing with the original installers of the equipment, we have concluded that in order to move forward and make decisions on the next course of action to get the playground back to full running capacity, a new playground committee will be required to drive this project for us.

Therefore we are reaching out to all of our villagers to ask for volunteers to stand forward, who would be willing to volunteer some time to meeting, coming up with ideas and supporting the implementation of agreed plans to replace and fix damaged equipment. Suitable for anyone, whether your children/grandchildren are frequent users or not, or you perhaps you have some project management skills that would be helpful. In September Richard and Elspeth Hayward handed over the distribution of the Moulsford News to Darlyl and Linda Dixon. Thanks go to both couples for their time given to this task, ensuring all villagers receive this newsletter monthly.

You will be pleased to hear that with the nights now drawing in, the driveway lighting is now operational, with Pavilion hirers now having the necessary access to the switching on of the lights. When you catch your first glimpse of them, we hope you agree that they omit a lovely ambience, ensuring the safety of driveway users but remaining non light polluting to the environment. Whilst on the topic of the Pavilion, the Parish Council also arranged this month for a fallen tree branch to be removed and a general trim and tidy up of branches overhanging the driveway to vehicles.

Education for the children of Moulsford is an important topic, further highlighted by this years secondary school place allocation for Moulsford children, which did not see allocations as expected for many children and parents in the village. It is well known that there are many plans already in place to build many more homes in the area and unfortunately for Moulsford school allocations that only makes matters worse when the criteria works on distance from the schools. With this in mind, within the parish council we have formed a sub committee to specifically pursue this issue with our county council and government. Our aim is to compile data and a case that over the future years, Moulsford children are at risk of having to travel considerable distance to both primary and secondary schools if something is not done to increase the provision in line with the volume of new houses being built.

We have already made a start on putting our case together, however we will need your help to compile some data to back up our arguments. In next months council update, we will publish a link to a survey which we would be very grateful if all parents with children under the age of 18 could complete . Look out for this nest month.

The Friday night socials have now come to close, and thanks go to all those involved in making them happen over the summer season. Please do take advantage of the events scheduled for the winter season.

The next Parish Council meeting is on Wednesday 9th October, everyone is welcome. In the meantime if you have any queries, please do not hesitate to contact one of us, our details are on page 16.

## From the Vicar

#### **Andrew Petit**

My dear friends,

"These three endure: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love". So wrote St Paul in that wonderful letter to the Corinthians, which is so often chosen both for weddings and for funerals. However, the original purpose of the passage was to give people guidelines for how they should live in community. The community St Paul had in mind was the newly formed community of Christians (or *church*) that had grown up in ancient Corinth, but his words are just as relevant for any community, whether it be a family, or a place of work, or a village. In the preceding paragraphs Paul has made it very clear that he is not talking so much about romantic love but the very practical kind of love that is a blessing to all of us. This is what Paul says such love is in practice: "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth."

How important these words are in our present febrile times, when widely diverging views and sometimes anxiety about what the future holds, can lead us to speak to others with something less than charity. I read recently that whilst we often hear the term *"hate speech"*, we don't often talk about *"love speech"*. The writer made clear, he was not talking here about being all *"lovey-dovey"* when we talk to our colleagues or neighbours, but loving in the way St Paul means it:

Being 'patient' means being more ready to listen than to speak, and being 'kind', means being understanding and respectful in the way we speak to others. Not 'boasting' and not being 'proud' means not thinking we are better than others. Not 'dishonouring others' means treating them with respect - however much we might disagree with them. 'Not self-seeking' means seeking what is best for the whole community, especially those who are most vulnerable.

'Not easily angered' speaks for itself and 'keeping no record of wrongs' means being ready to forgive -and forget hurts or slights from the past. 'Not delighting in evil' includes not exaggerating or speaking offensively or aggressively in order to win an argument. 'Rejoicing with the truth' means being committed to discovering the truth about situations, however uncomfortable that particular truth might make us feel, and making sure we are not selective with the truth when we talk with others.

When we try to live by these guidelines how much more harmony there is in our families, neighbourhoods and places of work. If those who are in the public arena or who delight to broadcast through social media, lived by this rule of love, how much more unity there would be in our nation. No wonder St Paul says that *"the greatest of these is love."*

# **Oxfordshire Multi-Agency Suicide Prevention Group**



### Oxfordshire residents that have been affected by suicide are urged to give their feedback to help shape a suicide prevention strategy

Between 2016 and 2018 there were a total of 155 deaths by suicide in Oxfordshire. Of these, 126 of these were men which means that deaths in men outnumbered those in women by 4:1.

The Oxfordshire suicide prevention group is about to revise its action plan and develop a strategy and wants to hear from people in Oxfordshire who have been affected by suicide or who may have had suicidal thoughts themselves.

There is a determination to reduce the numbers of death by suicide therefore we are asking residents to complete the survey <u>www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/suicidepreventionsurvey</u> to help achieve this understanding.




