

- The diagram is split up into zones the Young People see the village in
 - The Youth Club
 - The Recreation Ground
 - The Village Hall
- The drawing also highlights the type of activities they would like to do in their ideal village
 - A park with a zip wire
 - Organised activities
 - Fundraising
 - Swimming
 - Sports
- Following this activity the Young People focused their attention on each zone


Village hall activities

Young people's identifying activities that could take place at the village hall – two different groups came up with similar activities

- The diagram identifies that Young People in the village seek more from the village hall
 - Physical activities with a fun element
 - Craft activities where they can be creative
 - Fund raising activities
 - Life skill and changing activities
- The young people have identified the Village Hall as being central to the village
 - A place where activities could be based more
 - A central meeting point in the village that is currently utilised

Young people's identifying improvements that could be made at the village hall play park

- The diagram identifies that the following improvements could be made
 - A disability swing – maybe highlighting the lack of specific disabled facilities in the village?
 - The desire for an improved climbing frame
 - Opportunity for an outdoor gym
 - Different apparatus to add variety to the play park
 - Better bins for rubbish including recycling
- At a time when young people are criticised for not spending time outdoors it seems facilities are a barrier

Young people's ideas for activities to be hosted at the recreation ground



Young people's identifying activities to be hosted at the Recreation Ground

- The diagram identifies a mix of organised activities and facilities they desire
 - In contrast to previous diagrams there was a real focus on events that bring the village together
 - Following previous themes there was still as number of equipment related requests
- The young people identified that there is a lack of organised activities which are a mix of social and physical in their format. The recreation ground seems to be the physical space they would like these events to happen

- Climbing equipment


Skate Park revamp

The rec final plan






Young people's view on community facilities missing


- Central to their view was a common space they could meet and use for study
- The view was not having a library meant young people didn't have access to this type of facility
- A communal facility with tables and chairs
- Somewhere with computers
- Somewhere that they could study
- Access to books
- Practical ideas for funding
- Idea of including older people who might donate their time to be librarians
- Areas to relax in armchairs (like a common room)
- The need for more community events

Young people's additional views on issues in the village



- Not knowing PCSO's better
- Lack of organised activities (a recurring theme)
- Access to facilities
- Difficulty of safe independent transport between villages
- Safety concerns about crossing roads
- Concerns of feeling safe when around the village with no CCTV
- Lack of bike facilities and routes around the village

Young people's additional views on issues in the village cont.



- Highlighting the lack of organised activities for younger siblings
- Lack of organised activities (a recurring theme)
- Need for more organised sport clubs
- Highlighting no petrol station nearby (maybe something they hear at home a lot)
- Poor maintenance of local highways and paths
- Lack of lighting in public areas
- Worry of crime
