Chair's Update

Welcome to our latest newsletter.

As we go to print, we've got a hosepipe ban and a drought! Dunton Green isn't looking very green, although our hanging baskets

bring a
welcome
splash of
colour to the
parched
landscape.



Throughout the village the ground has cracked and

footpaths are looking a bit worse for wear. Having met with them recently. **KCC** Highways will be repairing the footpath by the school and the underpass before terms starts.



And having been advised for many years that the streetlights at either end of the underpass were sufficient, and the internal lights were not needed, there are now new lights inside the underpass. This should ensure a well lit route for everyone to use to safely cross London Road.

Meanwhile, DGPC has extended the footpath area at the entrance to the MUGA (Multi Use Games Area) which gets very muddy in the winter, using a bonded permanent mulch. The Parish Council has also fitted some more CCTV to cover the MUGA and tennis court, and are now able to provide the police with clear



images of acts of vandalism and anti-social behaviour, so that appropriate action can and will be taken. It is proving to be very helpful already!

Works are starting on the old Vauxhall site where McCarthy and Stone



are building 37 flats for older residents. We are already in discussion with them to expand our popular lunches and Pop in Café with AgeUK.

Over the years the Parish Council has installed, maintained and, when necessary, repaired





four publicly accessible defibrillators (PADs) throughout the village, working with the support of Sevenoaks Community First Responders. In July this year the PAD on the parade was used whilst an anxious family waited for an ambulance. Thankfully a full recovery was made. We hope that the PADs are never needed but it is gratifying to know that they are there to provide a potential lifeline if needed.

I wonder if you can help?

There are a few issues that DGPC would appreciate help with. If we all do a little bit it can make a big difference to DG for us all.

Litter There are bins throughout the village and most people use them for wrappers and drinks bottles (as intended) but they are not for household refuse or bags of rubbish. Leaving bags next to bins is fly tipping. Please put them outside your house on bin day.



SATURDAY FREIGHTER GUIDANCE

The Freighter cannot accept white goods, washing machines, dishwashers, fridges freezers, cookers, cast iron bollers or baths, long metal poles, building materials, manure, large parts of engines or vehicles or hazardous waste.

Hazardous waste now includes items like fluorescent tubes, televisions & computer monitors, batteries, oil tins and filters, paint and paint tins and chemical containers. These items cannot be accepted on the Saturday Freighter service and must be taken to your nearest Household Waste Recycling Centre.

Compostable garden waste cannot be accepted

Update from Dunton Green Primary School

It has been lovely to have a whole school year, with no closures due to lockdown. It is a great time of year to look back on everything our school community has achieved during the year and as always we are proud of each and every one of our children and staff for their hard work.



As we experience the heat of the Summer, it is strange to look back on the events of the Autumn which we were able to celebrate or take part in, such as the Halloween pumpkin competition, presenting a wreath on behalf of the school at the village Remembrance Service, as well as all the Christmas events such as carol singing and the Nativity play.

School trips have returned this year and the children have been able to experience visits to Colchester Zoo, Hastings Sealife Centre, Leeds Castle, The London Eye and the Year 6 annual Residential Trip to Norfolk. The choir were able to attend the Young Voices event at the O2 and our dancers took part in the annual community event Love2Dance at the Stag Theatre and the school once again were able to mark World Book Day by dressing up as important characters from British History.



You may have passed the school in June and noticed the red, white & blue balloons and flag when we celebrated the Queen's Platinum Jubilee with a day filled with tea parties, corgi hunting, crown making and the Queen even joined us!! The PTA kindly funded commemorative medals that were presented to all children, to mark this special event.



The long awaited refurbishment of our Key Stage 2 side of the building was finally finished and the classrooms are looking modern and functional with the added benefit of new furniture. Both the PTA and the Parish Council kindly donated funds to sponsor a classroom, for which we are truly grateful. School budgets continue to be stretched and without the fundraising and kind donations of parents, the local community and businesses, we would not be able to do anything extra.

Mrs Stead, one of our Teaching partners organised a sponsored Colour Run which not only was great fun but raised money to create a fantastic VIP Room for the children to experience.



Our next big fundraising drive will be to replace our Breakfast and After School Club building, which will also hold specialist teaching classes and be used for community involvement. Hopefully you were able to join us at our school Summer Fair on July 3rd. The PTA did a fabulous job and raised lots of money. It was lovely to see the school full of children and parents enjoying themselves.



As we wave goodbye to our Year 6 children as they head to Secondary School, we look forward to the new academic year when we will be welcoming a full Reception Class to the school, as well as some children moving into the area and joining us from other schools. We were oversubscribed this year and have a waiting list for Reception places. ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR (ASB) IN DUNTON GREEN

What is antisocial behaviour?

There are three main categories for antisocial behaviour, depending on how many people are affected:

- Personal antisocial behaviour is when a person targets a specific individual or group.
- * <u>Nuisance antisocial behaviour</u> is when a person causes trouble, annoyance or suffering to a community.
- * Environmental antisocial behaviour is when a person's actions affect the wider environment, such as public spaces or buildings.

WARNING - NITROUS OXIDE IS

Parish Council staff have spent a lot of time this summer cleaning up litter, broken glass, gas canisters, all to make the recreation ground and other areas nicer for everyone to enjoy. They have done this voluntarily but it is not what they are employed to do and they draw the line at collecting dog poo...

When you see ASB, please report to agencies that might be able do something. The local police are <u>extremely</u> limited in number (our own PCSO has some TWELVE villages to cover and is not available 24/7, 7 days a week – there are now only 5 PCSOs for the entire District). They have to prioritise calls. The PCSOs are often called away to assist Police colleagues and Dunton Green is, in fact, well served given the geography that they have to cover. But we know that residents are frustrated - perhaps you can make contact with the Kent Police & Crime Commissioner to let them know of your concerns?


To contact the Police call 101, or 999 if the crime is in progress. Report online using the reporting tool via www.kent.police.uk/.

Or you can report by email to community.safety@sevenoaks.gov.uk. This is not an official means of reporting crime and is not an alternative to formally reporting to the Police but it will keep them informed of local issues.

Always give as much information as possible: precise locations, dates and times, photos or CCTV if possible. We do know that those residents who provide detailed

information are often the ones who see a more positive outcome.


We really would very much appreciate the community's help in reporting things through official channels. Unfortunately, social media often seems to be the first port of call for many.

The extremely hot and prolonged dry weather this summer has seen some of our planting (particularly the new privet in the hedge on London Road and new trees in Longford Meadow) really struggle. A water bowser has been purchased to assist our grounds maintenance team. Watering is now more effective (no hosepipes but better than small watering cans).

PARISH COUNCIL News Highlights...

 Progressing the Speed Indicator Scheme is proving more complicated than anticipated. Some of the suggested locations for posts have been ruled out as they fall within 40mph zones where SIDs are not permitted and there are concerns about other suggested sites because of the limitations of



sightlines. We continue to work with KCC to develop a scheme that will assist us with trying to make the roads in Dunton Green safer for all and will update you as we make progress.



*Horses are not permitted on any Parish Council land and we have put up notices indicating this. Unfortunately, people persist with bringing them onto Parish Council land (and other areas in the village). Whilst not dangerous like dog faeces, we don't appreciate horse/pony manure being left in public places where children play.

- Like residents, village venues will be affected by the cost of living crisis and the increased costs of utility bills. The Parish Council will review budgets vey carefully this autumn, aiming to ensure that its part of your Council Tax bills next year does not increase, if possible.
- Bus services: in response to the announcement of cuts, the Parish Council wrote to KCC, SDC and Laura Trott MP in full support of concerned parents and guardians. We received this note of thanks from a resident who contacted us: Please pass on all our thanks for this tremendous letter and the action the Parish Council have taken so far. This is just what we need and heart-warming to read. At the time of going to press, some progress was being made reinstating services.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

DUNTON GREEN 100 YEARS AGO...

The Dunton Green Fete Committee



This is a photograph of the Fete Committee of 1927, posing for the camera for posterity. The annual Fete was a major event back then, a highlight of the village year.

In 1927 the committee had good reason to be proud for in 1926 they had held the "Great Fete" which had raised the money to build Donnington Hall.

This event was filmed and has been made available on the Internet by the Sevenoaks Society. It is well worth searching out and viewing. Sadly, only one person in the photo is identified and that is the man seated at the extreme right and bearing a faint resemblance to the late King Edward VII. He was Mr Edward Meyerstein who lived at Morants Court in the Village.

He was a generous benefactor to the Village and to Sevenoaks. Indeed, he paid for the old swimming pool in the town, which was located where the District Council offices are now.

He also, reportedly, thought that the village would be prettier if the cottages were thatched and he even offered to pay for the work. The villagers however thought differently, as thatched cottages had a habit of catching fire on a regular basis in those days!

A Dunton Green Character

This remarkable photograph is of a character, known as "Spiff" Nash.

He had a yard in Kingswood Road in the 1920's where he operated as a "dealer", buying and selling all manner of articles, mostly scrap.

In those days most villages would have had such a character, scraping a bare living.

The yard was later occupied by the Hocking Family as a scrap yard and was then redeveloped as housing and is now known as Careys Field.

Ultra-Runners!

On Saturday 6th of August, about 6pm, I wandered along a bit of the North Downs Way, enjoying the warm evening sunshine. I noticed a little pink banner hanging off a tree. Then another. And then one with some arrows under it, pointing towards Otford. Odd, I thought.

Then I was passed by a series of runners, all dusty and hot looking, with little backpacks of water, food and clothing. They were Ultra Runners, following the trail of little pink banners, for a race of just over 100 miles!

Now, I've run a bit: a few 10 milers, lots of 5 mile +/- courses in my youth. 10 miles is hard, it's a long way. But to multiply that distance by 10? Not for me!




The event I'd stumbled into was the Centurion Running NDW100.
According to their website:

"THE NDW100 IS A 100 MILE CONTINUOUS TRAIL RUN ALONG THE NORTH DOWNS WAY. THE COURSE TRAVELS FROM FARNHAM IN THE SURREY HILLS TO ASHFORD IN KENT. TOTAL CLIMB OF 10,000 FEET.

The race begins in Farnham at the Western end of the North Downs. The course works its way through some of the best of the English countryside before traveling through the small village of Puttenham and on to Guildford. It

then continues on to Ranmore Common before the steepest climb of the race up to the top of Box Hill. The trail then drops down the other side and back up to Reigate Hill, on through Merstham to Oxted and a further 8 miles to Knockholt Pound and the 50-mile point at the outermost edge of Greater London. The course then travels on through Wrotham and Holly Hill before crossing the Medway Bridge.

The final 25 miles see runners travel Southeast towards Dover running the majority on trails, paying brief visits to the villages of Detling, Hollingbourne, Harrietsham and Charing before dropping down into Ashford and the finish at the Julie Rose Stadium."



The race is 20% road and 80% trail, and I'd met them about halfway through. The temperature was in the high 20's °C, and I have to say, the runners I saw were not looking anywhere near as knackered as they should have been after 50 miles!

Runners have to finish within 30 hours, and over 200 hardy souls started, and according to the Centurion Running website, 144 people finished, with Mark Lynch finishing quickest in 16 hours, 52 minutes ad 59 seconds. That's an incredible achievement!

The NDW100 was first run in 2011. The course records were set by Mark Darbyshire (M) in a time of 15:18:41 in 2019 and by Debbie Martin-Consani (F) in a time of 18:34:54 in 2016! Absolutely amazing!!



To even enter the race, you have to have completed a minimum of a 50-mile distance race within 15hrs, and the organisers police this strictly, for the runners' own safety.



Runners are required to carry specific kit, including survival blanket, water, waterproof jacket, headtorches and a mobile phone.

At least 13 Aid Stations along the way provide food, drinks and medical assistance. I have a feeling I would need all of that and more!


