## FOOD FOR THOUGHT OLD AND NEW

The distinction between old and new is something which troubles both the world we live in today and the church. Have you ever noticed, for example, that products can be advertised in quite contradictory ways? Sometimes we're encouraged to buy something because it's 'new' - the latest thing, you've never seen anything like it before. And sometimes we encouraged to buy something because it's just like things used to be, it's traditional, what your grandparents would have known.

For instance, we live in a society that is constantly buying and throwing away mobiles, as if they are two for a penny. Just because they do not have the latest features. Yet turn on the television and you discover people longing for antiques, distressed furniture and fireplaces in their homes. As a society, we can't decide whether old or new is best.

And in a way this has also filtered into the life of many churches. For example, in worship we often divide ourselves up according to whether we like a traditional or a contemporary approach. Equally we avoid using the Old Testament as a text for preaching because we think it is superseded by the new and then at other times we cling to an 'old' commentary of the Bible even though scholars have found for us important new insights. I think sometimes in churches we marginalise those who are 'older' and long only for new and younger people to join us – but equally sometimes we are desperately frightened of anything new.

So how do we respond? Well it is always tempting to choose one or the other, either to hold on to the comfort and reassurance of the past or to sweep it away in a grand step into the unknown.

Yet, from a Christian perspective I think we always need the old as well as the new. It is easy for people who live today to think those who lived before us simply are old fashioned and thus have no understanding of what it is like to live in a rapidly changing society. But they have wisdom to pass on to us and it would be unwise to ignore it. Of course, there

are also times when it would be foolish to place "old wine into new wineskins". In a way, what I am trying to say is that on one hand we need to be strongly rooted in the traditions of our faith and denomination, but also we need to be open to the Holy Spirit who constantly questions and renews it. We are called to make faith and life new again in our day - but not, I think, by turning away from all that is past.

Imagine that all the people who have ever worshipped in our churches, served in our community were here today - there would be thousands of them with many different experiences and stories to tell. And in a way they are here - part of our community, part of who we are now. But our faithfulness to their witness lies in responding to the Gospel with integrity for our own times - while never letting go of their hands. This is what we need to do as we walk together discerning through prayer, listening, and consultation what God's has in mind for our churches and Communities we serve.

#### LOWER HALSTOW PRIMARY SCHOOL

The end of Term 4 finished as it started – full of learning, fun and excitement. One of the end of term highlights was the arrival of 12 eggs in an incubator. The children enjoyed keeping watch and seeing the eggs hatch. They all had a chance to hold a chick before they were returned to their farm ready to explore the big wide world. From our office Mrs Deevoy and I enjoyed listening to the conversations between the children as they visited the chicks hearing comments such as, 'I think they are on newspaper to keep their feet warm' and 'next week will they fly out of their box and around the room?' 'I wish I was a chick!' The chicks certainly put a smile on everyone's face, young and old.

We celebrated National Science week by focusing on science in the world around us, with the children participating in experiments involving sweets in water, how sound travels, changing milk into butter and the effect of bacteria on bread to name but a few.

For Comic Relief, we all wore red clothes and some children also chose to paint their noses red. We raised £133.17 from the donations on the gate which will go towards worthwhile causes in this country and abroad.

They visited a Viking market and made a lucet cord. They also discovered how the Vikings fared in their life at sea, and what they got up to as fearsome raiders!

Our term ended with a lovely Easter Service led by John Guest. The children shared prayers and Bible readings, reading beautifully, but the highlight was definitely the singing of Spring Chicken which is always a popular request!
