51/25 To receive apologies for absence

After discussion, the council **resolved** to accept the apologies of Cllr Barden.

52/25 To receive declarations of interest

Cllr Lee declared an interest in 55/25.

53/25 To Approve Minutes of the Previous Meeting

After discussion, the council **resolved** to accept the minutes. The chairman signed the minutes of the previous meeting as a true and accurate record.

54/25 To receive reports from County and District Councillors

Dist Cllr Griffin – Advised a new flood officer has been appointed at Bassetlaw District Council.

Dist Cllr Stanniland – Did not attend.

County Cllr Limber – Did not attend.

55/25 To discuss meadow path cutting in Dunham & Fledborough Churchyards

At the last meeting the Council discussed the pathways which MeadowMarkers are unable to cut anymore in each of the churchyards. After discussion, Cllr Ballinger **Proposed**, Cllr Bean **Seconded** and the Council **resolved** to pay upon provision of receipts to the Clerk, petrol costs to the member of the public cutting Dunham and Cllr Lee cutting Fledborough.

56/25 To Adopt the NALC IT Policy & convert the domain and clerk email to gov.uk to comply with Assertion 10

A new compliance requirement is coming in 2026 which Parish Council must adhere to known as Assertion 10, this is monitored via the external auditor. To comply a parish council must:

1. Comply with Data Protection UK GDPR and the Data Protection Act 2018
2. The website the parish council uses must comply with Web Content Accessibility Guidelines 2.2 AA standards
3. Adopt an IT Policy required to outline secure and lawful conduct for using digital devices and software, applicable to clerks, members, and other staff.
4. Councils must use a proper email address for the Clerk, an authority-owned generic email address, e.g. Every authority must have a generic email account hosted on an authority-owned domain, for clerk@dunham-pc.gov.uk and not personal or free services such as Gmail, Outlook, Hotmail, etc.

The parish council already complies with 2 out of the 4 requirements, and just needs to adopt the NALC approved IT policy template and arrange for Hugo Fox Ltd to transfer the website to a Gov.uk domain name and replace the Clerk outlook email address with a Gov.uk email address, Hugo Fox can arrange this for £47.76 per year.

Cllr Lee **Proposed**, Cllr Watkinson **Seconded** and the Council **resolved** that the IT policy be adopted with immediate effect.

57/25 To Adopt a Vulnerable Adults & Children Safeguarding Policy

The Parish Council are successful with their £1000 grant application to upgrade the 4 remaining noticeboards in the area to magnetic backboards. Forever-Notts the grant provider demand that the parish council adopts a Vulnerable Adults & Children Safeguarding Policy. Even though the parish council owns now buildings and runs now clubs, events, cafes, pubs etc, employs adults and not children. The Clerk checked with NALC and they advised it is not a mandatory requirement but they have heard before of grant bodies, regardless of the purpose of the funds provided, demanding a policy is adopted. In Dunham & Districts case, the policy would only really apply to the playgrounds and any potential children and vulnerable children using them (whilst a Cllr or contractor was working in them) and at parish council meetings where the possibility of members of the public containing children and vulnerable adults.

To accept and use the £1,000 the PC needs to adopt the policy and send Forever-Notts a copy. Cllr Watkinson **Proposed**, Cllr Lee **Seconded** and the Council **resolved** that the Vulnerable Adults & Children Safeguarding Policy be adopted with immediate effect.

59/25 To Note in the Minutes the response to any planning applications via the scheme of delegation and decide on a response to One Earth Solar Planning Inspectorate Application

The Council **noted** the following which have been responded to via the scheme of delegation:

- **24/00161/ENF - Aria House the Green Dunham Retrospective Application for a Front Boundary Wall –** Bassetlaw Planning have advised: “*The recently refused planning application was submitted in order to address an ongoing District level breach of planning control, namely the erection of a wall above 1m adjacent to a highway used by vehicular traffic. During the consultation procedure for the retrospective planning application, NCC as the local highway authority, confirmed that the wall has been constructed on the footpath and therefore highway land. NCC also raised highway safety concerns.*

This makes the matter somewhat complicated as the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) seeks to secure compliance with planning laws against landowners, which in this case involved NCC. Consequently, this matter has therefore been referred to NCC to take the necessary action in order to remedy any breach of the Highway Act, which in turn will remedy the Planning Act.

I will endeavour to keep you updated with NCC’s response (and any action they intend to take), however, you may want to contact NCC directly in relation to this matter, so as to avoid confusion and/or delays in communications.” Response from Notts County Council Highways Assistant District Manager 9/8/2025 “I was made aware of BDC response from July only yesterday. I am currently in communication with the owners’ solicitors to hopefully resolve this issue.” 24.9.25 Update from Notts County Highways Area Assistant Manager “We have made comment to the client’s solicitor that we would accept a 1m plus footway, any other business would be for BDC to enforcement as part of the planning application.” Email sent to Bassetlaw Planning Enforcement to clarify.

- **25/00053/NEWDEV - Land South of Briar Lea, Main Street, Ragnall** – The District Council have received a request from the developer to call the new properties:
 - Gregory House
 - Swaddon House
 - Swinford House
 - Redmay House
 The Parish Council responded “it supports the naming”.
- **25/01241/SCR - Screening Opinion for a 400kV Substation, High Marnham Power Station Fledborough Road High Marnham** – The Council responded as follows: “Because the screening application is due to the applicant splitting the project into 2 smaller projects, consequently nothing else has changed, the parish council previously responded in full via the previous screening application (23/01519/SCR), therefore there's nothing new to add from the parish council.”

60/25 To Receive Councillor's/Clerks' Reports including Road Traffic Accidents & County Council Highways Matters:

- **Noting of Accidents** – Vehicle crash into property, A57 Tuxford end of Darlton, 3rd Oct – Cllr Sergison to let the member of the public know to raise their concerns and requests for an additional interactive speed sign to County Cllr Limber in the first instance.

Cllrs Updates:

- Cllr Atkinson – Reported online ref CSC754290847 overgrown hedge obstructing bend safety sign close to the bus stop at Darlton. The Village Hall are reviewing the constitution governing document, contact has been made with RCAN to support this review before it goes to the Charity Commission, Cllr Atkinson would like to reach out to the regular user groups of the hall for their input into the review.
- Cllr Watkinson – currently works for the Fledglings group. Cllr Watkinson would like to request that the 40mph section of speed limit is shortened or removed altogether at Darlton as you leave towards Dunham as it is too long and impatient drivers overtake on the straight stretch. The Rota Bounce at Dunham Play area gets waterlogged and muddy around its base, request that PlayDales contacted to ask for a price to reinstate/alter the flooring around it.
- Cllr Ballinger – Wished to give thanks to the members of the public in Dunham who put up and take down the lamppost poppies.
- Cllr Hutley – Has completed NALC training recently and attended the Local Govt Reorganisation virtual meeting, Cllr Hutley has also reported to Notts CC that the white lines at Woodcoates Lane junction in Darlton require repainting.
- Cllr Bean – Noticed a prolonged noise coming from Pears Factory and will report this to them if it happens again.

There being no further business, the Chairman thanked everyone for their contributions and closed the meeting at 7:50pm.
