RUSPER CHRONICLE

May meeting. We enjoyed an afternoon in Rusper Church discussing the rebuilding of the Church in 1855 by the Broadwood family. We know the foundation stone was laid in June 1854 which we all set out looking for but with no luck!

In February 1854 the plans were left in the Star Inn for builders to tender for the work of demolishing the old church and rebuilding with the addition of a south aisle. The builder Mr Dalby of Steyning won the tender and in addition to adding the south aisle, the porch was rebuilt.

The cost including the tablet over and railings around the Broadwood vault was £2694 which in today's money would be just under £300,000.

My brothers & I were very honoured when the Parish Council got in touch saying they would like to install a bench in memory of Mum and her work in Rusper and the wider community.

We were asked for our thoughts for the inscription for the plaque and, after much consideration, we decided on "*proud to serve the village she loved.*" Because she really was. Ever since moving to Rusper in the 1960s, she was an integral part of village life, serving on the Parish Council and later as a local Councillor, as well as countless committees and fundraising for local causes. It was always more than just a role for her, she had a strong sense of community and dedication to public service but, above all, she loved people and was always interested in them, even if they didn't share each other's views. Whether we were in the shop, church or village pubs, she always seemed to know everyone and was happy to stop and chat.

Of course, to us at home as children, she was always just Mum. But we were aware she did something important because of the huge amount of phone calls she had throughout the day and the piles of papers on her desk that the cat would knock off when he was trying to find a patch of sun.

During election season we would help deliver leaflets, often accompanied by the dogs, and she would cover most of Rusper and beyond, stopping to talk to anyone we met.

She also proved an invaluable source of local knowledge for school projects over the years, including a GCSE project on the redevelopment of Horsham, just after the "new" Swan Walk opened.

She always enjoyed helping out at village events and fundraising for numerous local causes, including being an enthusiastic fundraiser for St. Catherine's Hospice over many years.

Her dedication to public service and great affection for the village was undeniable. After her death in February 2025, it was a comfort for us to receive so many letters remembering her common sense, warmth and positive outlook. As a family, it is lovely to have this tribute in the playground where we spent happy times as children. She would be slightly embarrassed but also very honoured.

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RUSPER PARISH COUNCIL

Rusper Parish Council has held its latest meetings, covering a broad range of community projects, planning matters, financial decisions, and key local issues affecting the parish. Below is a summary of the main points discussed.

Public Participation & Community Updates

Members of the public attended the Open Forum and received updates on community initiatives, including the donation and forthcoming installation of the **memorial bench** in the playground.

Recreation Ground & Sports Club

Significant attention was given to the Recreation Ground and Pavilion, with a number of essential works and safety measures agreed:

- Emergency plumbing and electrical works were approved (up to £3,100 plus contingency) ahead of mandatory Health and Safety Executive (HSE) testing
- A further HSE test and training session was approved (up to £500)
- Additional investigations will be carried out into ceiling repairs and drainage issues
- The Recreation Ground shed is required to be cleared of waste by the end of May
- Minor maintenance issues, including drainage improvements at the Star pump trough, were discussed
- Further long-term expenditure for the site will be brought back to a future meeting

Financial Matters

The Council approved the March financial reports, reconciliations, and schedule of payments. Key updates included:

- Internal audit scheduled for 11 May 2026
- Agreement to open a new savings account with Hinckley and Rugby Building Society and close the existing Nationwide account
- Approval of £300 for new village planters, compost, and planting
- Confirmation of Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) income of £11,324.13
- Progress on a grant application for CCTV improvements at Rusper Store

- Removal of one bank signatory from Unity Trust Bank

Community Governance & Projects

Councillors discussed the forthcoming Horsham District Council Community Governance Review, which may affect parish boundaries, particularly around the Mowbray site. A working group has been formed to prepare the Parish Council's response.

Community projects progressing include:

- The memorial bench, now ordered with a brass plaque agreed for installation
- Repairs to the Lambs Green telephone box and a village fingerpost (to be progressed by relevant committees)
- Tree issues within the Recreation Ground, including encroachment from neighbouring properties
- Future defibrillator installation plans following completion of related works

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held alongside the Annual Parish Council Meeting on **26 May 2026**.

Planning Matters

Planning Applications Considered

The Planning Committee met on 21 April 2026 and considered the following applications:

DC/26/0515 – Bonwycks Place, Ifield Wood

Installation of 23 solar panels on an existing barn roof.

Decision: Support – the proposal was welcomed for its contribution to renewable energy and use of an existing building.

DC/26/0482 – 2 Rose Cottages, Friday Street

Demolition of outbuildings and erection of a double garage with ancillary accommodation above.

Decision: No objection, subject to the use remaining ancillary to the main dwelling.

DC/26/0269 – Hawksbourne Wood, Rusper Road

Variation of conditions relating to access and water neutrality requirements.

Status: Noted

West of Ifield Development

The Committee received an update on **DC/25/1312 – West of Ifield**, a major planning application due for decision in June 2026.

Members noted that amendments are expected from Horsham District Council, but consultation documents remain incomplete, particularly in relation to transport evidence. The Clerk has been asked to seek clarification on all amendments and consultation deadlines. The Parish Council will review and respond once full information is available.

Horsham District Local Plan 2023–2040

Councillors received updates from the ongoing Local Plan Examination hearings.

While initial impressions suggest the Planning Inspector is broadly supportive of the housing strategy, the Parish Council continues to raise concerns regarding:

- The proposed spatial strategy and its alignment with the overall plan
- The inclusion of the Ifield development, which is considered potentially unsound
- The treatment of unmet housing need, particularly wider regional pressures from the south coast

These matters will continue to be reviewed as the hearings progress.

Planning Enforcement & Appeals

No new appeals or amendments were reported.

SAVE WEST OF IFIELD CAMPAIGN

It was lovely to chat to so many people at the Rusper May Fair – thank you! Last month we said that we would be participating in the examination hearings for **Horsham's Local Plan** alongside Rusper Parish Council. This is only the first round of hearings and covered housing numbers overall not specific sites like the West of Ifield. We spoke on a couple of issues including the need for full and transparent financial viability assessments (FVA) for all strategic sites being considered for allocation in the Plan. This became particularly relevant as Homes England suddenly announced in the hearings that they were changing their planning application to include 40% affordable housing and not 35%. In parallel we have now written to Horsham Council asking for a full and detailed FVA for the West of Ifield to be published before the Council makes a decision on the **planning application**, which they have said they hope to do in June or July. We've also started to work with lawyers on the grounds for a legal case against Horsham Council should they decide to permit the West of Ifield application.

Meanwhile you may remember that many of the statutory consultees to the planning application had requested additional information from Homes England. This information is now on Horsham Council's planning portal, as are the further responses from the statutory consultees. Our view is that Homes England's plans are still not sound, particularly their proposed mitigations for increased traffic and for the loss of Ifield golf course, and that their failure to acknowledge the lack of sewage processing capacity is unlawful.

What next? Many people continue to **respond to the planning application**, and we can all do this right up until Horsham Council make a decision. In terms of **Horsham's Local Plan**, the Inspector hopes to be examining development sites, including the West of Ifield, over the next few months, including a **public consultation in the summer** and further hearings in October.
