

Dear Friends, Last month I suggested a date for your diaries – the 10:30am Palm Sunday service in Brightwalton on Sunday, 13th April 2025. This is when Lent comes to an end, and we move into Holy Week, accompanied by Trevor the Donkey (who you might have met at the Chaddleworth Christmas Market in the Ibex last year).



This Lent, we have been thinking about **'Living** Hope'. Journeying together through the confusions and certainties, the fears and the joys, the imperfections and the delights of a life shared in community with one another and with God. That living hope has been difficult to cling onto at times. We have experienced great sadness within our communities this vear already. But we worship a God who knows. Jesus endured the worst that humanity could imagine conquered even death itself and made a

way for us to be with Him in eternity. That is our Living Hope.

We get to immerse ourselves in the Holy Week journey again this year. After the excitement of Trevor the Donkey on Palm Sunday, we will have evening services at 7pm in Shefford Woodlands on Monday, Leckhampstead on Tuesday Chaddleworth on Wednesday (14-16th April). Maundy Thursday sees the moving evening event of the bring and share meal to mark the Last Supper, with the service of Holy Communion entwined hosted in Welford Church. Good Friday sees an All-Age Easter Extravaganza with crafts, food, games and music at 10:30am in Brightwalton Church and the moving traditional service of The Last Hour in Wickham at 2pm. On Easter Eve (after recovering from the Duck Derby!) the (now famous) Easter Eve service will begin with a bowl of chilli around the fire in Fawley at 7pm as it gets dark and we bring the Easter Light in to start our celebrations. Easter Day, the services are 9am for Holy Communion Leckhampstead and 10:30 Café Church in Great Shefford.

Saunders Wynn and Coventry Educational Foundation

The three named benefactors set up the Trust to offer financial help to further the educational needs of the children and students (up to the age of 25) of the Parish of Chaddleworth. The Trustees meet four times a year with the next meeting scheduled for 22nd May to consider applications including any relating to the additional costs of home-schooling and remote study for students. Previous contributions have been made towards the cost of school uniforms, books for university courses, specific equipment and kit for courses, and residential courses.

West Berkshire Council

Introducing **Ridgeway Council**, an ambitious proposal to create a brand-new council that delivers high-quality services, improves financial resilience and value-for-money, and ensures it is able to maintain truly local representation.

An initial proposal has been submitted on behalf of West Berkshire Council and the district councils in South Oxfordshire and the Vale of White Horse for the creation of a new unitary council that would see the three areas combined. The move is in response to a government invitation following its announcement in December 2024 to end two-tier authorities like those in Oxfordshire.

As part of the shake-up of local councils, the government has also indicated all unitary authorities will need to serve around 500,000 residents or more, which will require West Berkshire Council - which covers around 170,000 people - to merge with neighbouring councils.

Ridgeway Council forms one half of a two-

unitary council proposal for Oxfordshire, with the other half made up from the district council areas West Oxfordshire Oxford City and Cherwell. West Oxfordshire District Council and Cherwell District Council have confirmed they will be developing the North Oxfordshire Council half of the proposal, strongly complementing Ridgeway Council work being carried out by West Berkshire, South Oxfordshire and the Vale, coming together to create a proposal for two unitaries covering what is currently Oxfordshire and West Berkshire.

With strong demographic and economic similarities and significant historic ties between West Berkshire. South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse the three councils began discussions to explore the possibility of coming together as one single council. All three councils have now produced a detailed interim proposal document, which is available on their new website dedicated to keeping the public informed about the proposal www.ridgewaycouncil.org.uk. The proposal is being developed under the title 'Ridgeway Council' - named after the famous 5,000-yearold trail that travels through the heart of the three council areas.

The government has set a deadline for final submissions for unitary council proposals no later than 28th November 2025. In the meantime, the councils will continue to develop the proposals along with a programme of communication and engagement to ensure local voices and community needs are reflected in the proposal and will also continue working positively and collaboratively with the other authorities in Oxfordshire. If the final proposal is accepted the government's indicative timeline sets out that the new council could go live in 2028.


