## 22/138 TO RECONSIDER THE PRECEPT REQUIREMENT FOR 2023/24

Cllr. A Ratcliffe asked why the meeting was required when the precept was previously agreed at January's full council meeting. Cllr. J Britt reported that at least two Cllrs. were not comfortable or understood the figures previously presented, so J Bate has spent time making the figures easier to understand.

J Bate presented the figures predicted for the end of the 23/24 financial year. LPC have an agreement to retain 50% of annual expenditure in the bank. The agreed budget is £248,730 with a precept of £228,730 allocating £20,000 from reserves. This additional allocation from reserves means the potential bank balance at the end of 23/24 would be approximately £7000 below the required 50% reserves level at 47%.

If £30,000 is allocated from reserves, lowering the precept to £218,730, the bank balance at the end of 23/24 would potentially be £17,000 below the required 50% reserves level at 43%.

Following discussion of the options and the potential for additional core income (as opposed to income for projects) Cllr. P Culver felt that the only way to meet the 50% reserve level would be to underspend on the budget or receive more income. RFO J Bate confirmed that likely income has been incorporated into the calculations, there is unlikely to be more income.

Cllr. J Britt asked all Cllrs. to vote:

- Option A precept of £228,730, all Cllrs. voted yes
- Option B precept of £218,730 no Cllrs. voted for this.
