Enter your postcode, town, village or street into the search box, and get instant access to street-level crime maps and data, as well as details of the neighbourhood police team and

'Have Your Say Events'. The level of crime and ASB in the area remains below average compared with the rest of England and Wales.

Currently there are no neighbourhood priorities. If however you do have some concerns about crime or disorder in the Downlands neighbourhood please email me at the address below or call me on 101.

On 23rd March an overnight operation was carried out in the Downlands neighbourhood involving police and local gamekeepers aimed at tackling rural crime. Although no one was arrested on that night I am pleased to say that no crimes were reported to us either for the area that the operation covered.

The mobile police station is coming to a street near you. On 14th April it will be parked in The Westons, Beedon, outside the primary school between 1.45pm and 2.15pm and outside Peasmore village hall on Field Road between 2.45pm and 3.15pm. On 5th May the police station will be on Broad Street, East Ilsley between 10.00am and 10.30am, Main Street, West Ilsley between 10.45am and 11.15am, outside the church in Farnborough between 11.30am and 12.00pm, outside the village school in Chaddleworth between 12.30pm and 1.00pm, in Brightwalton village hall car park between 1.30pm and 2.00pm and in Leckhampstead village hall car park between 2.30pm and 3.00pm. You can meet your local police team and discuss any issues with us you may have.

Community Messaging is a free service which provides information to subscribers about crime and police activity in their area via phone or email. It also includes information on what we and our partner services are doing to bring offenders to justice or combat anti-social behaviour, and information on opportunities for local residents to raise concerns with their local policing teams.

THE ROYAL BRITISH LEGION (RBL) - news from your local branch March 2012 - Compton, Isleys & Norreys Branch

The Officers and members of the branch would like to thank everyone who contributed to the 2010-2011 Poppy Appeal. The villages of Compton, West Ilsley, East Ilsley and Aldworth raised a record £2,331 for the charity. Hampstead Norreys has conducted its own successful campaign. Your generosity was a splendid statement of support for the RBL in its 90th year that culminated locally with the tremendously well attended Remembrance Sunday parade and service in Compton that has been previously reported – thank you.

For those readers who like to get dates in their diaries early, this year Remembrance Sunday is on 11th November and the branch's service and parade will take place in Hampstead Norreys.

Since our last bulletin the branch has held two successful events. The first was our annual lunch which was held on Friday 30th September 2011 at the Compton Swan. We were delighted that Richard Benyon, Member of Parliament for Newbury and

Minister for the Natural Environment and Fisheries, attended and spoke briefly about the Government's commitment to the Military Covenant which is now enshrined in law.

At this event, we are proud to report that Richard Benyon presented Alex Lister with an RBL Berkshire County Certificate of Appreciation. Our Branch is a small one and it is largely due to Alex's determination, hard work and engaging personality that it survives today under his chairmanship. It is still a small branch but membership recruitment over the last several years makes it a healthy one. The second event, specifically a fund raising effort to contribute to our county headquarters' target to raise an additional £90,000 to mark the RBL's 90th birthday, was a wine tasting and talk held at the Compton Swan on Friday 25th November. Mr Julian Jeffs, wine author and member of our branch, gave a masterly and amusing description of the origins and attributes of eight wines from the pub's wine list. The evening was very much enjoyed by all attending.



It was lovely to see so many people in church at Easter and we would like to thank all those who made All Saints' look so beautiful. Coffee was served after the service and the children had great fun searching the churchyard for Easter goodies.

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting this year was held in church on Tuesday 24th April when the last year was reviewed. The meeting covered various aspects of church life, including a report on finance, in which we discovered where All



Saints' money came from and went to in 2011. Thanks to your generosity, for every pound we needed to spend, we received the equivalent of 73 pence through your donations and collections, leaving a further 27 pence to be found. As always we rely heavily on fund raising events to augment our income and through the hard work of our PCC and others we were able to make another 22 pence in this way. Fortunately this year we were able to make up the shortfall from other sources, such as fees and grants. Our outgoings in 2011 can be seen by percentages in the pie chart, although these figures are approximate.

We thanked everyone who contributed to All Saints' in any way during the year whether to the church building or churchyard. We also thanked Anne and Norman Carlisle who after their many

years of gardening, would like to "hand over the trowel". If anyone would be prepared to help look after the churchyard flower beds in particular, please contact Ian (281625).


