

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The Parish Council met on Wednesday 8th October to consider another busy agenda. The ongoing Sunday parking charges consultation by Somerset Council is a forerunner to the consultation on other possible parking charges, and to establish some villagewide data, a survey is being co-ordinated by a local resident. Output from the survey will be shared with the Parish Council who in turn will be writing to Somerset Council expressing their concerns with associated impacts. However, individuals are strongly encouraged to respond also.

Plans for festive lights in the village are developing well – a lighting up ceremony will coincide with the Castle school's Christmas Fair on 3rd December. To celebrate the school's 150th anniversary the Parish Council will be funding commissioning of history boards and donating these to the school.

A grant was awarded to the Memorial Hall, as a contribution to their roof insulation project.

The clerk confirmed that the status of grit bins through the village has been reported to Somerset Council Highways who will be refilling ready for the winter. Those residents who kindly offered to act as 'monitors' are asked to check that their bins are clear of litter and ready for use. Please report any issues back to the clerk.

The next meeting which will be held on Wednesday 5th November at 7pm. The agenda will be available to view on the website, where minutes of previous meetings can also be found together with the full report from Somerset Council and the Responsible Financial Officer. Please see website

UPDATE ON CAR PARKING SURVEY

Thank you to everyone who has completed the online survey, especially residents of Ham Hill, Princes' Close, High Street, Bonnie's Lane, Castle Street and parts of West Street and North Street – the streets most likely to be impacted by the proposed introduction of charges at Ham Hill car park by Somerset Council.

So far, we have had 146 responses to this village survey, showing that parking charges would mean that drivers will (understandably) avoid parking in the car park wherever possible, which will increase the already difficult situation for those people who rely on on-street parking in the centre of the village. The problem is not simply that congestion will be worse than it already is, but that there will be a negative impact for many in our community, including those who have limited mobility or young families – who will find parking anywhere close to their homes even more difficult. We also know that those who provide care services to residents are concerned about the effect on their work - some of whom already find it almost impossible to park legally when working in the centre of the village. We already know that pressure on parking spaces leads people to park in places that can create additional dangers for pedestrians as well as other road

The next step for the village survey is to contact those people who aren't able to complete the on-line survey; we'll be knocking on doors during November with a paper copy so that you can have your voice heard. Once we have all the information, it will be compiled into a report that the Parish Council will be able to use when the formal consultation is announced by Somerset Council.

Unfortunately, Somerset Council have not confirmed the start date for this yet. However, please remember that when the Somerset Council consultation starts, it is really important that everyone who is concerned about the impact responds directly to the formal consultation. This is because the survey we are carrying out as villagers is an additional piece of work to help us provide in-depth data and evidence about parking need in our village.
