Update from Your Parish Council

Green Campaign



A big thank you to those residents who have been in touch with ideas to help tackle the climate emergency. Ideas have ranged from planting more trees, setting up more local terra cycling points, leaving the grass longer and planting more wild flowers to creating hedgehog highways (see page 11). I'm sure there are still more suggestions and we want to create a space where people can share ideas and experience and motivate others to make changes.

To kick start the conversation we are looking to use the Annual Parish Meeting on the evening of the 21st May as the first stage in the process. Please come along and get involved! We will be especially keen to see children and young people and to harness their ideas as part of the Green Campaign (venue to be confirmed).

We have some ideas already. They include tree/hedge planting at the Southern Quay between the dinghy storage park and the grassed area and expanding the community orchard at College Playing Fields. We are also looking at the smaller green areas that we own to do smaller planting schemes and work will continue to find other locations. With the help of the Community Payback team, we have completed the first stage of the preparation work at the Southern Quay where, ahead of plating trees in October, we will be sowing wild flowers. We'd love to get people involved so let us know if you are interested in helping.


We have been thinking about a greener truck as the lease on the current one is due to end in the summer. Although electric trucks are less developed than cars, we have identified one of two vehicles and will hope to make a decision over the coming months. We are thinking about keeping

the current truck for bigger jobs or those outside of the village and purchasing a more sustainable smaller vehicle for local and smaller trips, but it will be subject to value for money.

The Roy Underdown Pavilion refurbishment programme is nearly complete but we still need to replace the boilers and the cost of running the floodlights for the Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) is significant. To guide our decision, we are going to do an environmental audit on the building with a view to considering options like solar panels, ground source heat pumps and LED light replacements. This will keep us busy for the next few months.

Bench Refurbishment

The slat replacement project on the northern quay is now completed. There are two newer benches that are in good repair but will have a coat of stain in the next week or so, weather permitting. This should leave the area looking smart ahead of the summer period. A big thank you to the staff involved who have had to brave the worst of the weather to complete the work project. The wooden slats removed from the benches are being reused for other purposes across the village so won't be going to waste.

Discussions are taking place with a supplier for new benches at the Southern Quay and this will be part of a wider facelift for that area, including the planting later in the year. **Grants**

Hamble Conservation Volunteers were awarded a grant of £500 at our March meeting towards the cost of replacement tools. The work of the volunteers makes a huge difference to the management of our treasured spaces and you only need to see the volume of rubbish collected on their beach cleans to know what a valuable contribution they make.



Following last year's popular Keep Britain Tidy Spring Clean a further event is arranged for this year. Details on centre page and page 19.

Changes to School Lane

Hampshire County Council have confirmed that they will be improving signage and reducing the speed limit to 20mph on the sharp corner on School Lane which has long been identified as a dangerous spot by many local residents. Hamble Lifeboat



Grenville Houser and Paul Ackland came along to our March meeting to highlight the great work of the Lifeboat and to outline the challenges they face as an independent volunteer organisation, as they are not part of the RNLI. As a station they attend over 100 call outs per year, far higher than the national average. Discussions were held around how the council could support Hamble Lifeboat to highlight the dangers of being on the water especially for young people and visitors. Rail Trail and Cycling

Thank you to those of you who raised the poor state of repair of the rail trail making cycling difficult and very messy during the wet weather (there's been a lot of that around!)

As a result, we have approached Eastleigh Borough Council (EBC) who own the trail and they have proposed a budget of \pounds 3,000 to do improvements subject to the Local Area Committee approving it.

If approved, it will encourage more cycling and hopefully reduce congestion, air pollution and promote a healthier lifestyle. We are also waiting to hear how successful Southampton City Council have been in bidding for funds under Transforming Cities Fund which would see further investment coming to the village and peninsula to reduce car dependency. Our Green Campaign will support these measures as well as those linked to biodiversity.

Hamble Primary School

Following the survey of Mount Pleasant Car Park, the Chair and Clerk met with Mrs Rickman, the Head of the Primary School, to see whether we could help get children and carers out of the car for the school run. Mrs Rickman ran through the many initiatives already in place to encourage walking, scooting and cycling to school and we wanted to say a great big thank you to those that regularly do leave the car at home, brave the elements and get to school under your own steam. Keep it up! You're setting a great example to others and we need people to do more of this for everyone's sake.

The Square, Hamble

Discussions have taken place with EBC about a facelift for The Square. Aspects of it are looking a tad tired and in need of a bit

of tender loving care. The Parish has been working for some time on how to rationalise the many street signs that pepper the area creating a cluttered feel. Members on the Planning Committee are also looking at how to discourage people from parking outside the Coop; it blocks the footway and can cause problems for buses. If you are in a rush and tempted to stop there please think twice about the problems it creates for others and head to the Square car park instead – the first half hour is free.

Farewell to Justyn Willsmore

Many of you will know Justyn from BP. He has worked at the site for the last decade and has been a supporter of many community events and activities throughout that time. There are few village events that Justyn hasn't been present at over that time and as a gifted photographer has captured many of these occasions for us. Sadly, Justyn will be leaving BP at the end of March to explore other interests. I am sure that on behalf of the Parish Council and the village that we thank him for all his help and support over the years and wish him every success in his future endeavours.



Did You Know – The Story Behind the Donkey Derby Field?

The "Donkey Derby Field" is the field on the left as you head up Green Lane from the foreshore, adjacent to Hamble Common. This field is currently used for occasional overflow parking for events which happen in the village. However, there are a complex set of rules surrounding the use of this field which many people are not aware of, and can seem confusing. The rules arise from its history.

The field was transferred to Eastleigh Borough Council in 1994 from the developer JS Bloor, prior to that it was owned by the College of Air Training. Although privately owned, the Field was made available to host community events such as Donkey Derbies (hence the name), the village carnival and regattas. When the land was transferred to Eastleigh Borough Council it was used to provide overspill parking for big village events. When the Eastleigh Borough Council were considering the regeneration improvements to the car park in The Square the Donkey Derby Field was considered as a short-term parking solution. This would have required hard landscaping in the field which proved controversial and resulted in the proposals being withdrawn.

Recognising the ongoing parking challenges in the village a resident put forward a suggestion that the lower part of the Field be set aside for rural car parking. The suggestion did not include hard landscaping but a screened off area. Nonetheless this raised concerns about the permanent use of the field for parking and as a result an application to register Donkey Derby Field as Village Green was submitted to the County Council. If the Field had been designated as an extension to the Village



Green, it would have stopped all parking there in the future. A non-statutory Public Inquiry was held to look at the evidence. The case was protracted with a raft of evidence from Eastleigh Borough Council, Hamble Parish Council and local residents. The result of the legal judgement was that the field was not deemed to be a Village Green and that occasional parking (no more than 28 days a year) could continue to be permitted on the site. In 2011 the site was transferred to the Parish Council and has been managed on behalf of the community since then.

If the Field is used for more than the 28 days, the Parish Council could face planning enforcement action from Eastleigh Borough Council for the breach. In addition to these planning protections, the land is also subject to covenants that protect it as open space for community use and it is also

within the local conservation area.

Every year, Hamble Parish Council receives requests to use the field for parking from event managers who anticipate the need for additional parking. Parish councillors collectively agree how to allocate these days if more than 28 are requested. Priority is given to events that are run for the benefit of the whole community - such as the Farmers' Market, River Raid, River Hamble games, Brocante Market. A range of sailing events such as the Warming Pan, have also been allocated days.

When a day's use is agreed a 'day' is strictly defined until midnight of that day. If a single car remains in the field after midnight - even if just a few minutes - this is classified as a second day of usage which is deducted from the 28 days available. Whoever is granted permission to use the field therefore has a responsibility to

ensure that the terms of the parking are not breached and a deposit is pavable, which is forfeited if the agreed parking limits are exceeded.

Given the stringent measures needed to keep within the 28 days, the Council may deny requests in subsequent years from users who haven't been able to adhere to the rules. When there is an overstay it has the potential to significantly impact on other users later in the same year. To minimise the likelihood of this happening, and to allow for unforeseen circumstances. Hamble Parish Council allocated 23 of the 28 days this year with some users needing to share the field where two events are planned for the same day or weekend.

Are you Registered as a Priority Customer with the Local Electricity Network?


We all rely on electricity day to day for various things, but for some, a power cut can be particularly distressing and difficult. Scottish and Southern Electricity Networks offer extra help and support during a power cut. Registering for their Priority Services helps them to help you when you need it most. All of their priority services are free. Scottish and Southern Electricity Networks (SSEN) are the people who look after the wires and cables that bring electricity to your home but not the company who sends vou electricity bills.

The priority service offers: dedicated 24 hour priority services phone number; priority updates during a power cut; nominate someone for SSEN to contact on your behalf; provide information in the format you need, for example Braille or audio CD; and a security password to keep vou safe.

People who may wish to be registered include those who:

- Are deaf or hard of hearing
- Have a disability
- Live with children under five
- Are blind or partially sighted
- Have a chronic illness
- · Use medical equipment/aids reliant on electricity
- Are over 60

Keep a Lid on It

You can recycle any type of plastic bottles in your green recycling bin, recycling sack or communal recycling bin. This includes drink bottles, shampoo bottles and cleaning product bottles and you can now keep lids (not pumps or spray tops) and labels on them when they go in your recycling bin. But please empty any liquid content and squash the bottle before replacing the lid. **Why can't I recycle certain plastics**

such as plastic pots, tubs or trays?

Mixed recycling collected in Hampshire is sorted at one of two Material Recovery Facilities (MRFs). These facilities sort items into different materials and can sort plastic bottles from other materials when an infrared light is used to identify and separate two types of plastic bottle: PET (indicated by a number 1 on the bottle) PET (indicated by a number 2 on the bottom of the bottle).

These two types make up around 97% of the plastic bottle stream, including milk, soft drink, cosmetic and cleaning product

Small Change, Big Difference

Have you made a hole in your fence for hedgehogs?

If you haven't, then maybe it's time you consider making a 'Hedgehog Highway' in your garden. This is a simple and great solution for hedgehogs which are fast disappearing from our countryside.

Hedgehogs can travel up to a mile over one night-time, which means that there can be fences and walls getting in the way of their plans. By connecting as many gardens and green spaces as possible, we are giving hedgehogs more places to feed, nest or meet their partners, and ultimately helping





bottles.

Plastic pots, tubs and trays (PTT) are made up of a wider variety of polymers e.g. PS, PP, PET, PVC, and LDPE. This range of polymers can't be successfully sorted in our MRFs. Any recyclable material needs a viable and sustainable end market. Currently, there is no viable market for over half of the PTT that we could collect.

Why can't drink cartons be recycled?

Drink cartons are currently not recycled in Hampshire due to their foil lining and plastic coating.

Making a hole is really easy to do (with your neighbours permission of course!) You just need to drill a 13cmx 13cm hole in your fence (about the size of a CD case), and this helps to prevent larger animals like pets getting through, but just the right size for 'hogs. To book a visit, you must receive water and wastewater services from Southern Water and have a water meter.







The outcome of the maintenance sessions on our bird boxes was most encouraging. We now have 49 boxes on the Common with varying sizes of access hole to suit different types of birds. About 70% of the boxes were used for last season's nesting, the majority being blue and great tits but there are signs that nuthatches and tree-creepers are recognising the advantages of weather and predator proof nesting. This success with bird boxes on the Common has encouraged us to expand their deployment throughout Hamble and if you have any thoughts on where they might go please contact us.

The two Keep Britain Tidy sessions are in April and it would be helpful if you would register in advance if you intend joining us. Please keep an eye on our website for further details but one of the start points will be the Roy Underdown Pavilion.

Regardless of the task we welcome volunteers, the tasks can be arduous but

there are roles for a wide range of agilities. Furthermore we appreciate that many people cannot spare the time for the whole task so please do not be put off if you can only be with us for a short time.

From the Parish Council's Records

100 YEARS AGO - New Member The Rev E V Roe signed the declaration as a member of the Council ... April 1920

He was Hamble's new Vicar and the brother of A V Roe who opened an aircraft factory and airfield in village during the First World War

100 YEARS AGO - **Fire Station Shed** Mr Bartlett reported that it had been found inconvenient for the Fire Station Shed to be fixed in Mr Lubbock's field as previously agreed, but a suitable site for the Shed had been offered by Mr Emmons. **April 1920**

Mr Emmons was an American millionaire who owned the large house 'The Copse'

75 YEARS AGO - **Parish Dump** A letter was read from the Officer in command at the Copse, stating that the Council letter was incorrect that any Soldier indiscriminately deposited their rubbish on the Parish Dump. The Clerk gave a statement to the Council which showed that they had blamed the wrong people ... **April 1945**

75 YEARS AGO - **De-requisition on Common** ... a letter that had been conversed with the War District Claims Officer on his visit to the Green to view the requisition thereon. He thought the Council might consider any other damage to the Common outside of the requisition ... **April 1945**

50 YEARS AGO - **Port Hamble Yacht Haven** ... in respect of the Council's claim of landing in front of the R.A.F.Y.C. Counc. Robinson told Port Hamble representatives that the Parish Council has a survey map showing the Hard going down to the low water mark and that on two occasions in the past people have tried to stop this access but have failed ...

April 1970

50 YEARS AGO - **Foreshore** Pointing out the problem of keeping spaces clear on the Foreshore for boats to be taken to the Boat Parking Area, and putting forward a suggestion, accompanied by an illustration of a hinged rail ... **April 1970**

50 YEARS AGO - **Special Parish Meeting** ... to hold a Parish Meeting to consider an environmental strategy re Chapter 28 of Agenda 21 of the Earth Summit ... April **1995**

25 YEARS AGO - Satchell Lane Bus Service ... Hampshire County Council stating that at last there is to be a bus service along Satchell Lane and a draft timetable was enclosed, proposing three journeys from Satchell Lane which can be implemented from 22nd May 1995 ... April 1995


