

Of course it might be that Cllr Mountford's excellent idea of emailing villagers to remind them of the meeting was the responsible stimulus, but as anybody who knows me will tell you, I am far too shy and retiring to venture an opinion on the matter. It – emailing that is - is something that we will do for the next meeting and I hope that we will have a similarly well represented and informed attendance from the village in January.

Notice of an Extraordinary General Meeting of the West Ilsley Village Hall Committee

(formally known as WI Social and Recreation Association)
on Wednesday 5th December 8pm in the Village Hall.

All welcome and especially current user group reps and village representatives.

Your opinion is required on the following:

Some background info:

The village has a new charity called West Ilsley Trust, which was set up for the benefit of the whole village and looks after its assets – namely the Village Hall and Recreation field. The trustees are all members of the Parish Council. There is a fully audited bank account and often funds raised at village events (eg Barn Dance, Winter Warmer etc) are placed there to charge the account, until spent on good causes for the village or ring fenced for future projects/groups as specified by the fund raiser.

Historically the Village Hall is also part of an old charity (WI Social and Recreation Association), which currently looks after the Village Hall and the Recreation Field. It also has a fully audited bank account.

As both charities are doing the same job, our proposal is to dissolve the old charity and hand the Village Hall over to the WI Trust.

The management of the Hall will stay the same with its small management committee plus User Group representatives looking after the maintenance, upkeep and bookings as usual. They will report into the WI Trust (i.e Parish Councillors as trustees) once a year. The Parish Council will take an overseeing role as they do now. The Village Hall committee will be able to use the benefits of the Trust's charitable status when applying for grants etc.

Before any decision is made, The Village Hall Committee would welcome your opinion or support at their meeting.

Thanks to John Clemenger (the first WIN Editor) we have located the first edition of the WIN which was produced in June 1977. The Queen's silver jubilee was a major calendar item that month, with a Jubilee picnic and games being held on the recreation ground and a Jubilee Barn Dance held by the Evergreens at Cold Harbour. Mentions of current villagers/people still with links to the village were: Anne Butterworth and Margaret Gilmore's WI membership, Gary Tizzard coming second in the Senior Section Bonner Trophy, Kevin Holloway coming 2nd in the 8-9 Junior section boys and Julie Procter 1st in the girls 10-11, with Neil Holloway 2nd in the boys 10-11.

Also at that time, the Harrow was kept by Mr and Mrs Saunders, play group was 30p per session, and Mr and Mrs Noble still lived in West Ilsley House, and held a village barbeque in the grounds. We know from John C that the WIN was copied on one of those old duplicators which (those of us who were at school before photocopiers were popular will remember) needed special paper and smelly chemicals just like exam papers!
