6 FOOTPATHS

453 a Representative's Report

The Chairman suspended the meeting to allow Mrs Roscow give her report.

I have reported three issues to Adam Taylor this month. A fence bordering a farm on RS118 is laying in the field along one section between the B2000 and Bunters Hill Road. There is a short piece of plank traversing the ditch at the end of RS119 near Four Elms Hill. The ditch has become silted up and has covered the ends of the plank. I am concerned that the plank doesn't get completely covered resulting in someone stepping into the ditch as it is deeper than it looks.

The footpath across RS128 between Four Elms Hill and Upchat road has not been reinstated since the crop was planted, making it difficult to see the route that should be taken.

Dennis and I have picked up 4 bags of rubbish on the section of RS121 between the tunnel and Parsonage Lane and on RS328 between the Tithe Barn and Frindsbury Hill.

After discussion, it was agreed the Parish Council object to the flyover as it was not suitable and would impact severely on the residents not only of Higham Road but other areas of the parish.
