#### The most common crime

**Moulsford News: September 2025** 

I often ask what is the most common crime locally, and people are generally surprised when I say that it is domestic abuse. Around a fifth of the jobs a police officer will have during a shift could be some form of domestic abuse, and it is a crime that exists in every community, urban and rural.

No one should live in fear at home. That's why our officers are working tirelessly every day to protect victims, bring offenders to justice, and raise awareness about the support available.

Domestic abuse isn't just physical—it can be emotional, financial, sexual, or controlling behaviour. It can be incredibly hard to reach out, which is why we've made it easier than ever to get help safely and discreetly.

Our specially trained domestic abuse teams offer a compassionate and confidential service. We work closely with local partners, such as victim support charities, housing services, and healthcare providers, to ensure people can access the right help at the right time.

If you or someone you know is experiencing domestic abuse, you are not alone. You can contact us at any time by calling 101—or 999 in an emergency. If speaking isn't safe, you can press 55 when prompted after calling 999 (this is known as the "Silent Solution"). The call handler will do everything they can to determine your location so they can deploy officers to you; if you can say one thing, please say your address. You can also report online at thamesvalley.police.uk.

Support for victims is vital, not just to help them through the criminal justice process, but often in managing that first big step or asking for help. Victims First is the victims service run by my office that provides free support for anyone who has been a victim of crime in Thames Valley.

Our friendly Victims First Officers will talk to you about any emotional or practical needs you may have, and then will help you access help and support. They may offer to refer you to specialist local organisations who have experience in supporting those who have experienced abuse, but no referrals will be made without your consent.

You are welcome to contact Victims First to access support if you have reported the Domestic Abuse to the police, or if you have not made contact with the police at all. Simply call 0300 1234 148 or visit victims-first.org.uk.

BE AFRAID!

At the Annual Parish Meeting in May, a most interesting photographic exhibit, designed by Sue Powell, provided attendees with insight into the history of Moulsford. I do hope this will be repeated in the future.

Despite Moulsford's small size, much could be written of its history, and I intend to give you readers of the Moulsford News further facts and fiction related to our village. We have 17 Grade II listed homes and landmarks. Preserving history is a difficult task.

#### The Beetle and Wedge

Lets start with the Beetle and Wedge, our closest refuge to quench our thirst and hunger. The original hotel has been converted to a private home, and the Boathouse, modified over several years, is the restaurant we enjoy today.

The Beetle was very well known by river enthusiasts who came to dine and drink and spend the night. A favourite of old times was rum and milk. An inn or hotel was likely operating in the early 1800's under sponsorship of the Morrell Brewing Company. The Morrells brewed Lion beer in Oxford and owned much of Moulsford and Streatley.

Our first vicar was a Morrell family member. Family tributes can be found in the St. John the Baptist churchyard. More on the family connections in a later column.




Many people believe the Jerome K. Jerome novel 'Three Men in a Boat' was partly set in Moulsford. However, the story seems to show the trio didn't stop at the Beetle but took lunch in Streatley. Other reports show Jerome did once stay at the Beetle Hotel.

Many people believe the much beloved children's story 'Wind in the Willows' by Kenneth Grahame was set on the Thames near or at the Beetle. In the story a Barge Woman throws Mr. Toad into the river, and as we know, for many years the Beetle provided ferry service between South Stoke and Moulsford. Mr. Toad also rode on a steam engine trying to get to Toad Hall. Were these modelled on our stretch of river?

Grahame spent some of his childhood, and retirement, in Cookham Dean, outside Marlow, and made many boating trips with his uncle. The book was published in 1908, and the Grahames left Cookham Dean, moving to Blewbury in 1910. Was the story set in Moulsford?

I am a great admirer of cartoons and the artists that produce them. Bits of Moulsford's history has been captured by cartoonist Tim Bulmer and his drawings adorn the walls of the Beetle and Wedge Boathouse. Go down and enjoy a drink and a meal and have a chuckle or two seeing these masterpieces first-hand.

There's more to come. I hope you enjoy this adventure of historic discovery....... Cheers, Preston

If you need to add some colour to your garden or home come along to the September Coffee Shop where Veronica Shann will be having a plant stall to raise funds for Altzheimer's Research UK




A big thank you to Hanning Homes Limited for providing delicious cakes each month.





#### **Wallingford Local Producers Market**

WPLM is a regular event in many people's calendar.

Based at St Mary-le-More, it's their weekly fix of fresh vegetables, cheese, cakes, bakes, coffee and lots of foody treats.

Inside there's even more, with handmade arts and crafts by local makers; there really is something for everyone. All the food and crafts

are made locally and the market has a warm and welcoming community feel. So if you haven't found it yet, go and visit on a Saturday morning between 10am and 12.30pm.

Starting in March, the market will also be in the Market Place on every first Saturday of the month with extended hours between 10am and 1pm (except 1st week of Sept).



We are a registered charity operating a food bank based in the centre of Wallingford with the aim of providing emergency food packages to those who need them. Wallingford Emergency Food Bank was set up by Churches Together in the Wallingford Area and we began serving the community in 2011.

Although we are essentially a Christian run organisation, we are by no means exclusive; we welcome volunteers of any faith or none, and we give food to anyone in real need.

#### **WABC** on the Move

#### Thank you, Benson; Riverside here we come!

Wallingford Accessible Boat Club (WABC), the local volunteer-run charity dedicated to providing boating for disabled people, is moving its wheelyboat operations to its new permanent base at Riverside, Wallingford on Monday 21st July. This marks a milestone event for the Club which has been seeking a Wallingford base since it was formed in 2017.

WABC Chairman, John Jenkins MBE, explains: "The move to Wallingford has been a complex one involving changes to our operating procedures and back-office computer systems as well as a significant amount of boat crew training. We've had to accomplish all this while still running passenger trips from Benson. Our wheelyboat team have been simply magnificent – we are so grateful to them all."

The new WABC operating base, formally known as 'Accessible Riverside', opened in mid-May, incorporates a storage hut plus re-surfaced pavements and roadway, a wheelchair-accessible ramp and a docking pontoon for the Club's wheelyboat, WOW-one - all in all, a £209k development funded by South Oxfordshire District Council through its community fund.

Jenkins summed up: "We are very excited at the prospect of the move. Whilst we are very grateful to all our friends in Benson and Preston Crowmarsh who have supported our wheelyboat there for the last 4 years, we are looking forward to our Riverside operations. We will be able to offer our passengers and volunteers easier parking and an improved boating experience with direct access to one of the most beautiful stretches of the Upper Thames. We're here for the long haul and believe our unique wheelyboat service will become a vital part of promoting Wallingford as the incredible river town it is."




