Stockbury Roundabout

The saga rumbles on

As many of you will know, the Inquiry has now been put back to 10th March for reasons unstated by the Department for Transport. Those of you who have lodged formal objections should by now have received an email informing you that there will be a pre-Inquiries meeting on 7th January in Bapchild at which the Inspector will arrange the timetable for the Inquiry itself. This appears to be just an administrative meeting which may be of interest to anyone who is "into" detail and process. It is not a chance to make representations and, whether anyone goes or not, will not affect anyone's right to put evidence to the Inquiry in March.

Meanwhile, we have been trying to find out what is happening down at Kent County Council. You may recall that they did not object to Highways England's plans and committed to working up a business plan for a bridge to be built by KCC. There was an initial flurry of activity in the summer, then it all went quiet. We have received no updates from them at all.

On 20th November, I wrote to the current Cabinet Member for Highways, Michael Payne, asking for a meeting to review progress on the KCC business plan, and to ensure that both the Parish Council and KCC were fully aware of each other's position in advance of the Inquiry. There was no response, not even an acknowledgement.

On 1st December, I wrote to Mr Payne again to remind him of the request. Again, there was no response or acknowledgement.

As far as I know, Mr Payne and his administrative staff are still in post and functioning but, for some reason, there seems to be a reluctance to meet with the Parish Council and let the people affected (you) know what is going on.

I will let people draw their own conclusions on this one. If I hear anything before the next edition of The Observer, I shall post it on the Parish Council Facebook page. In the meantime, you might like to write to Michael.payne@kent.gov.uk to ask about progress with the bridge plan and KCC's "line" for the Inquiry

Stockbury Gardeners

Why are you sitting down when you should be working off the Christmas excesses? Exercise is best taken in the garden or on the allotment.

January is a month when you have to make sure that all of the digging is done, this exposes all of the nasties that eat plant roots and bore into potatoes. You will also do the birds a big favour as they can feast on worms.

This month make sure that the wisteria has been pruned, remember August and December!!

Check over any stored dahlia tubers for rot, you need to keep them reasonably dry and frost free in a shed or greenhouse, a good dust with sulphur will help.


Pruning of apple and pears can be done now, with the exception of trained espaliers or cordons.

Cabbage and cauliflowers can be sown indoors at the end of the month. They can be transplanted in about 8 weeks into the garden.

Stockbury Gardeners do not meet in January, however when they meet in February, there is a presentation on how to grow show onions; so if there are and budding Medwyn Williams's out there come along and see how it can be done.

Earlier today prior to writing this, I was in the

greenhouse sowing some chilli and pepper seeds. I have for a number of years not bothered to use the seed companies, choosing to buy supermarket fruits and letting them literally rot in the greenhouse. Once they reach a really "slimy" stage, I place them on a small tray of compost in a freezer bag and keep at 20 degrees plus until germinated. If you can manage to try this you will be amazed on the



germination rate, its close to 100%. See picture.

Well there goes another year, so have a happy New Year and perhaps if you are feeling adventurous come and join us one Thursday evening.

Patrik Says

Dear Residents,

With the General Election and Christmas out of the way, maybe the Local and National Governments will get the chance to pull up their sleeves and get some actual work done in the New Year.

You gathered it, there is little to report from MBC this month, so I will take the opportunity to address BROADBAND – or rather the lack of it in wide parts of the North Downs.

Recently I attended the Wichling Parish AGM where complaints were plenty. Let me therefore share some alternative solutions.

First of all you could Google for "Satellite Internet":

You would need a satellite dish similar of the ones which we use for television reception and a special router. The installation costs are quite prohibitive but service speeds of up to 20Mbps are available.

Satellite usage allowances tend to be quite low and can easily attract hefty excessive use charges when exceeding the limit. Most satellite internet service providers (ISPs) will also impose and apply a level of 'traffic throttling' that might reduce service speeds. Bad weather such as heavy rain, can also obstruct the line-of-sight between your dish and the orbiting satellite, which sometimes results in disrupted connectivity.

Satellite Internet has inherent delays, due to the distance between the dish and the satellite in the sky. This makes conference calls and Skype etc very difficult.

A resident in South Street did some extensive research recently. To get connected to V-Fast, a Wifi based service with a link station in Stockbury would cost about £1,500 due to the distance. Satellite installations start at similar installation costs.

I asked her whether she had ANY mobile phone reception at all anywhere on her land. There was literally only one place in the garden/house where a weak EE 4G signal could be detected. A company managed to fit an aerial on the garden fence and wired it into the house. This gives a download speed of circa 20mbps and an upload of around 25! They've even recorded a 30mbps download at times. It will also pick up 5g when that arrives so it will, to some extent, be future ready.

All she needs now is an EE unlimited data sim-card for about £34 per month.

4G aerials (as shown in the picture) start at just under £100 and can go up to £400; 4G routers are about the same. If the aerial location is too far from the house you may need a Wifi repeater too. Skilled DIYers can fit such technology



themselves, I fitted a similar system in my own loft.

This particular resident used a company to get it all installed. She reports how happy she is now: "Superb company who have a real can do attitude and spent ages trying to find us a solution. What a difference this has made to our family. I can work, the girls can do their homework and we can watch Netflix!" Unfortunately the overall installation bill was still in the region of £1500 in this case; I hear that it was a rather difficult job.

I will not publish the company's details here but will be happy to forward upon request. There are several 4G specialists advertising on Google.

With such 4G installation, your land-line phone will become redundant.

I hear that he is a very useful source of information.


