We are very nearly there with our fund-raising but every extra bit we receive will ensure that we do not have to compromise on the design or equipment choices. We are in the process of appointing contractors to develop the two sites in the spring, so need to finalise our accounts soon. School News

The children in class 2 at Stanton Harcourt School have been learning about the prehistoric period. They have particularly enjoyed researching homes and shelters from the Stone Age through to the Iron Age. They were so fascinated with the diagrams they found of a roundhouse, we decided to build one on the school grounds!

We had previously cleared an area during our Family Learning Day and it generated a lot of garden rubbish. We decided that prehistoric man would have used what was readily available. So, armed with a wheelbarrow of tools, Mr Peter Newman helped the children to build a framework for our own roundhouse design.

The children were so enthusiastic and eager to help, we decided to have a day outdoors finishing the roundhouse, creating cave paintings using natural materials, making clay fossils and we even



managed to complete a soil science investigation! Below are the comments made by the children whilst they were drinking hot chocolate and watching Stig of the Dump, who was the inspiration for our topic.

'I liked finding out how Stone Age people lived.'

'My favourite thing was using sticks to build a roundhouse.'

'I got to tie lots of knots.'

'I liked using the tools and getting messy hands.'

'You got to collect stuff to make cave paintings.'

'I like putting soil in a pot for our science investigation.'

'It's really creative making clay fossils.'

'It was awesome finding out what the Stone Age people felt like.'

We can't wait to visit the Hill End Outdoor Centre and visit their ancient settlement and find out more about how these prehistoric people lived! I am sure they didn't think to make stone circle monuments out of biscuits! Linda Walsh

DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING

I am sure you are aware that Stanton Harcourt Parish Council is now very lucky to have a Defibrillator in situ, located at the entrance to the Village Hall.

We are very fortunate to be able to hold training sessions in use of the defibrillator - Ian Jones, Paramedic / Community Responder Liaison & Training Officer of South Central Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust has very kindly agreed to hold a session in the Stanton Harcourt Village Hall on **Tuesday 16th Dec at 7pm**. The session should last around 1 hour.

We would like to invite any residents who would like to gain knowledge in the use of a defibrillator to join the session.

The sessions are limited to 15 people, as it is felt this is the optimum number and allows for a Q and A at the end of the demo.

WODC Improved online planning system up and running

People should find it simpler to view, track and comment on planning applications in West Oxfordshire following

the launch of a new online planning system by the District Council.

The Council has upgraded the planning section of its website www.westoxon.gov.uk/planning to give better online access to information.

The new system gives more detailed information and, for the first time, provides the opportunity for comments to be submitted online and applications to be tracked as they progress.

Cllr Warwick Robinson, Cabinet Member for Strategic Planning and Housing, said: "Whereas the former system contained only limited information, it is now possible to follow planning applications from submission through to decision, in addition to registering to receive email updates about any applications you are interested in to ensure you are notified every step of the way.

"As well as making it easier to use, we hope this enables people to easily find the information they want at their fingertips and make the planning process more transparent for everyone."

The new system enables users to:

- view all planning applications made to the Council
- see where applications are on a map
- view documents and plans that provide details of the development
- submit and view comments on applications
- monitor applications or appeals - including associated plans and documents
- save personalised searches for a particular ward/parish or application type
- view decision notices

As well as improving online services for members of the public, planning professionals and partner agencies, the Council hopes the changes will enable town and parish councils to view more information online, giving them more timely information.

Recipe of the Winter: Leek, Potato & Bacon Soup!

300g/12oz Leeks (washed and sliced)

300g/12oz Potatoes (peeled and sliced)

150g/6oz bacon (chopped)

700ml/1¼ pint chicken or veg stock (~3 cubes dissolved in hot water)

½ pint milk, seasoning to taste e.g. black pepper.

- Sauté (cook) the leek, potato and bacon till soft.
- Add stock and cook till vegetables are tender
- Liquidise/Blitz to make more soup like
- Add milk, pepper and it's ready to serve with a nice bit of bread!

If you're posh you can serve with a dribble of cream in the top too to make it look pretty!
