Crime/Incident Breakdown

Hinderwell Parish:

16th October Approx 2120Hrs Report of possible poachers with air rifles seen on foot between bank top car park and the caravan site, Staithes, two males challenged by a resident but received arrogant reply – Officers attended and conducted search including the beck area but no gain.

27th October Report from the owner of Midge hall farm between Dalehouse and Roxby of an overnight attempt theft of an ATV which was in an insecure shed – Vehicle had been pushed into the yard but appears that a neighbour disturbed the offenders after investigating the dogs barking. Linked to a burglary in neighbouring property (see below) – Officers attended, limited lines of enquiry available.

27th October Report from a property neighbouring Midge Hall farm of an overnight burglary to garage – a vehicle was entered in the garage and a screwdriver stolen – Later retrieved at the scene of the attempt ATV theft at Midge Hall farm – Enquiries for forensic RTC - 2

Mickleby, Ugthorpe and Roxby Parishes:

26th October Report from a resident of Ugthorpe of issues with another resident in the village waving at traffic entering the village from the A171 side – Initial complaint was around possible harassment of a young male driver who was getting the brunt of the residents ire. Officers attended the address of the suspect and words of advice given re actions. In addition to action taken on the visit it was discussed what was at the heart of resident's actions which was a concern for the speed of traffic (no suggestion of it being illegal) being hazardous to pedestrians on the section of road particularly between the 30mph signs and the Mickleby road junction. Officers have advised the concerned parties to bring this to the attention of the Parish council who in turn have avenues to explore with other agencies including Police who will be happy to assist with any problem solving.

Hawsker and Sneaton Parishes:

24th October Report from a visitor to the area that they had parked their vehicle at a supermarket car park on Stainsacre Lane and on return the number plate had been ripped off – No Lines of enquiry.

28th October Report from resident of Russell Hall Farm, Stainisacre that a grain store entered overnight, door left open and light on – Nothing stolen or damaged – No Lines of enquiry.

Fylingdales Parishes:

18th October Approx 1925Hrs Report from Middlewood Farm, Fylingthorpe of a stolen motor vehicle from farm yard between 1600Hrs and 1700hrs – vehicle was found later smashed up near Whitby. Offenders had also entered several sheds – Enquiries ongoing.

Newholm, Aislaby and Lythe Parishes:

13th October – Report from a resident of Aislaby of tampering of their Citroen van – Vehicle vin plate removed – No lines of enquiry.

Sleights Parish

2nd October approx. 1010Hrs Officers responded to a report of a female assaulted near Sleights village hall by a male – Female victim located and assisted, male offender located after a search and arrested for common assault – Enquiries ongoing.

18th October Approx 2300Hrs Report from a resident of Birch Crescent of theft of motorbike – Believed offenders wearing balaclavas responsible and seen at approximately 2215hrs on Birch Avenue area heading towards Lowdale Lane – Bike was later found and recovered damaged in the Sleights area – Enquiries ongoing.

Goathland, Grosmont, Egton Parishes:

22nd October Approx 2050Hrs Report from a resident of Esk View, Egton,that a visiting relative's motorbike had been tampered with, appears attempt to steal? – Area search conducted, possible link to 3 males seen riding on one motorbike A171 earlier which officers had searched for including in the Egton area – Possible link to below incident in Egton Bridge 23rd October – Enquiries ongoing.

23rd October Report by a resident of Broom House Lane, Egton Bridge of an outbuilding burglary over past 36/48hrs – Padlock forced off and search made of building but nothing appeared stolen? – Possible link to above incident on Esk View, Egton? – Enquiries ongoing.

25th October Approx 1120Hrs Following a complaint of obstruction between the railway bridge and NYMP car park entrance a total of 5 vehicles were issued tickets for obstruction AND issued NYCC parking tickets by attending parking wardens for yellow line offences. These vehicles were parked completely over the footpath in a line and causing pedestrians to walk in the road.

Danby Parish:

6th October Approx 2255Hrs Report from a resident of Ainthorpe that their E-bike had been stolen from outside the Duke of Wellington Pub, West Lane, Danby – Bike had been secured by chain lock to a post (also stolen) – this is linked to an E-bike theft in Whitby on the same day.

9th October approx. 1600Hrs A male was arrested on suspicion opl (drink driving) in Castleton – vehicle also seized for no insurance.

12th October approx. 0730Hrs A suspicious male seen driving a black landrover Defender reg **YM7*D*X** driving up and down the road at Commondale between 0530Hrs and 0730Hrs – Officers conducted an area search with negative gain – Local Police would be interested in any future sightings.

30th October Report from the resident of Thornhill Farm, Commondale of locating a sheep tied up with nylon rope, appeared to have been tied deliberately in a way to pick it up and carry away – Officers making enquiries.
