

# From the Vicar

Dear Friends,

I'm writing this on the First Sunday of Lent (apologies to our editor!). The sun is shining brightly. The sky is blue. Birds are visiting our bird feeders and – in the churchyard of All Saints – the daffodils are beginning to bloom. Spring is in the air – though recent temperatures have been rather wintry again, over the last few days.

Lent is a season in which the days begin to lengthen – particularly once the clocks change – and the skies appear lighter. But Lent is also the season in which we turn towards the cross, and prepare ourselves, spiritually, for Jesus' death and resurrection. The season begins, on Ash Wednesday, with a reminder of our mortality: we hear the words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ," as we are marked, on our foreheads, with the sign of the cross, in ash and oil. Then, on the first Sunday in Lent, we hear the story of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness, or desert, where he fasted forty days and forty nights. (It was wonderful, on Ash Wednesday and this morning, to listen to our choir singing for us the moving hymn, 'Drop, drop slow tears,' by Phineas Fletcher, as we begin to reflect upon Jesus' journey to the cross, and our own journey through Lent. Our choir usually sings on the fourth Sunday of the month and, occasionally, at other services too.

Do come along and experience how the choir is enhancing our worship – or speak to Ron Stern about joining the choir). Jesus' period in the wilderness forms the backdrop, or framework, for our own observance of Lent. We fast, because Jesus fasted in the wilderness. We seek to resist temptation, following the example of Jesus, who was tested as we are, but without sin. The desert was, for Jesus, a place for struggle, adversity, and wrestling with evil. Lent, for us, might be a time for struggle, adversity and wrestling with evil, too, as we seek to grow in faith, hope, love and our relationship with God.


Perhaps you've given something up for Lent, perhaps you've started something new. Whatever you've resolved to 'do' for Lent, I hope and pray that it will draw you closer to the loving heart of Jesus, who loves us so much that he died and rose again for us. Our Lenten observations

shouldn't cause us guilt or shame, but should bring us freedom, confidence and gratitude, as we realise more clearly that God forgives our sins and offers us a clean slate, cleansing and purifying us, and enfolding us in unconditional, immeasurable, love.

The desert can be dangerous - but it can also be a place for growth, transformation and new life. Jesus won for us, in the wilderness, and on the cross, victory over evil, sin and death. In the scorching heat of the desert - during this season of Lent - dross can be refined, or burned, and out of the fire and ash, new life can emerge, like a phoenix arising from the flames. Christians believe that Jesus is the life-giving water, and his presence, with us, in the 40-day wilderness of Lent, can lead to transformation, like flowers which break forth in the desert after a fall of rain.

I hope and pray that Lent will be a season of growth and transformation for you, and that you will come to a deeper awareness and understanding of just how much Jesus loves you, just as you are. God bless you, and your loved ones, this Lent and always.

# Parish Council

The election for a new Parish Council is taking place on 4th May, and this is your chance to become a Parish Councillor. The duties are not very arduous and you will be able to influence the running of the village. It is also an opportunity for the Parish Council to be refreshed with new people with new ideas about how things should be done. If you are interested then please contact me and I will tell you more about it.

Two trees have been planted on the High Street verge near the pub, to replace the unsafe one which was removed last year. Thanks to Nicko King who planted them and to Eileen Robinson, John Paxton's niece, who donated the money for the trees in memory of John.

Some Parish Councillors have been tidying up Cuddesdon Green by removing the undergrowth at the back, particularly the brambles. We would like to know what you think should be done to improve Cuddesdon Green further. In particular, we would like to hear from residents of Church Road about what they think of the screen of trees behind their houses.

We have pressed the County Council about the state of the bridge at Cuddesdon Mill and they have said they hope to repair it in the spring.

Planning permission has been granted for the modifications at Wesley House (P22/S4307/HH) and at Jubilee Cottage (P22/S3922/HH), both on Denton Hill.

The Parish Council has opposed erection of a garage at 1 Dove House Lane (P23/S0094/HH) because it is considered to be large and intrusive, although the proposed pergola at the same location is supported.

There is concern about SODC's agreement to the landscaping proposals at Dove House Farm. The proposals mainly relate to the area near the road. There are only going to be a small number of trees and the decision ignores the policies of the Neighbourhood Plan.

Denton Hill is going to be closed for the day on 9th March for pole replacement.



While it's worrying that the crops in southern Spain and north Africa seem to be another warning about the effects of climate change, I also wonder if the media telling us that there's a shortage of anything helps to create a run on it and makes the situation worse.

We are, of course, very lucky that we are often so little inconvenienced by big world problems. This might not always be the case moving forward which is why doing the little things is never a wasted effort, even if it doesn't seem that we can effect anything much in our tiny parish.

Speaking of which our parish clerk, Mike, mentions in his notes that there's a parish council election coming up. He's right to say that it would be brilliant for our community to have as many people as possible showing an interest in joining the PC. If you think you can spare a little of your time, then it's a great way to help run our parish. There are seven spots and they are rarely filled without the need to co-opt a few councillors. I don't mean to vote myself off the council but wouldn't it be better to have lots of villagers signing up from every corner of the parish?

In the meantime I want to thank the team who've been helping on the PC for the last 4 years (5 in fact due to the pandemic) and everyone who gives their time to make our community better. There are so many unsung heroes working on the Village Hall Committee, WI, Fete, Church, Bonfire Night, and litter picking, to name just a few jobs that are just like housework; nobody notices if you do it or not, until you don't. ## John Howell MP writes... *February 2023*

As readers may know I lead the UK Parliamentary Delegation to the Council of Europe on behalf of the Government. Whilst this does take me away some of the time it also enables me to steer a positive contribution for the UK as well as all other Member Countries. For example at the January meeting of the international delegation I put forward a paper for the introduction of a new International Convention or Treaty on the protection of the environment in times of armed conflict. Whilst this could seem remote what would mean is that we would have something with which to prosecute a crime such as deliberately exposing a community to chemical weapons. Something long needed.

Whilst on the subject of Europe, there has been talk of the UK leaving the European Court of Human Rights. I am a firm believer that we should stay a member of the Court and of the Convention on Human Rights. The Court is not a foreign court but is an international body in which we share responsibility with the other countries who are members. I believe that leaving the Court would be disastrous for the UK. I am sure we will hear more on this in the coming months.

Much more locally I have been pursuing issue relating to our GPs. I fully appreciate the frustration around access and face to face appointments. At the same time many of our GPs are feeling under huge pressure. Having met with some of our GPs to listen to their concerns, I have now had a meeting with other Oxfordshire MPs and the Chief Executive of the local Integrated Care Board (ICB) which oversees primary care provision. The senior ICB team agreed to meet with local GP teams to follow up. Also working with other Oxfordshire MPs, I have been looking into the issue raised with me by a number of parents of the decision by the County Council to withdraw its 'spare seat scheme' for school transport on some services. This is a scheme where any unallocated seats on school buses could be offered to those not eligible for free school transport. Removal of this scheme raises a

number of concerns, not least that it flies in the face of the County Council's own environmental ambition to reduce car journeys. We have urged them to reconsider this decision as a matter of urgency.

I have long supported the part that apprenticeships play in the transition from full time education to work. I am therefore delighted to see that for young people seeking apprenticeships will be able to use the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS) to search and apply for apprenticeships. This will give them a better understanding of all the options available to them.

There are, of course, many issues which affect us which are well rehearsed in the media and which the government is working to address. ## Restoring the Tower of All Saints' Church

You will probably have noticed that the church tower has been partly covered in scaffolding. This is because the stonework on the north side had deteriorated and there was danger of bits falling and damaging people or the roof. Also, some work done about seventy years ago had

caused further problems: an iron bar, built into the parapet to strengthen a corner, had swollen in summer heat, contracted in winter cold and so begun to shatter surrounding stonework. Extensive repointing in concrete, which must have seemed a good way to strengthen the walls, actually caused cracks between concrete and softer Oxford stone so that water has been seeping into the wall. One of the unwanted results has been water leaks around the pulpit and ministers' seats

Since mid-October when the scaffolding went up, stone masons have been busily working from the top down, replacing damaged stone, knocking out unwanted concrete and repointing with a lime-mortar mixture. A roofer has checked and repaired lead flashings, replaced broken tiles and asbestos water goods and a window expert has replaced the broken windows of the staircase turret. The work should be finished by the time you are reading this and one very important task was included: the regilding of the weathercock.

That much-appreciated feature on the top of the tower swings freely and is responsive to the slightest breath of wind. It was expertly engineered by Arthur Smith, Faith Fitchett's father, and was installed some seventy five years ago. More recently maintained by his son-in-law, the late Jim Fitchett, a fourth refurbishment is currently being managed by his grandson, Arthur Smith Fitchett. He has taken this opportunity to bring it to ground again, give it a light sandblast, repaint it and put it back to crown the tower and flash with shining precision in the sunlight.


### *Lighting the Tower*

As we approached Christmas, we had thought the tower with its ugly scaffold should not this year be flood-lit but a couple of generous sponsors, wanting to see it cheer us during these gloomy months, gave

their usual donations and so it was floodlit between the start of Advent in early December and the feast of Candlemass in early February, lit specifically on some nights to mark personally important anniversaries. If you have appreciated the tower's cheering effect as a beacon of light, do please consider giving the church a retrospective donation and let me know if you would like your name to be published in the next Newsletter.

If you would like its illumination to mark anniversaries in future months, please let me know the dates. The going rate is £10 for a single night or £40 for a week but less is more if that is what you feel able to give. 

## Calf raises

The calf muscles are located on the back of the lower leg. They are used to plantar flex the foot (point the toes towards the floor) and play a significant role in walking and running. Tight calf muscles can cause stiffness when walking and contribute to painful conditions such as Achilles tendon pain and plantar fasciitis. The calf raises below not only strengthen the muscles over their full working range but also stretch them.

To do this exercise you will require a step (stairs are ideal). Stand on the bottom step on the balls of your feet with the heels hanging off the edge of the step. Slowly and under control lift the heels as high as you can. Pause and then slowly lower the heels as far as they will go. The timing for this exercise is 2 seconds to go up, 1 second pause, 2 seconds to go down, 1 second pause and repeat.



To make this exercise more challenging it can be done on one leg at a time. It can also be done holding weights. If you suffer from tight calves hold the pause when the heels are at their lowest for 10 seconds during the exercises and for 20 – 30 seconds at the end of the set. A beginner could start with two sets of 12 repetitions (reps), increasing by one rep a week. If you get pain in the calf or the heel, take a rest from the calf raises until the pain has gone.

## Walks Programme March 2023

- Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup>** Meet at Ewelme (Cow Common car park) for an undulating 5½ mile walk via Swyncombe church.

- Sunday 26<sup>th</sup>** Meet at Garsington for a 6 mile walk around local villages.
- Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup>** 10:30am Meet at Hailey (near Wallingford) for a 4 mile leisurely Chilterns walk. Possible pub stop at the end.
- Thursday 30<sup>th</sup>** Meet at Eythrope, near Stone, for a 7 mile walk (which can be cut short to a 4 mile walk if preferred).


