We are therefore looking for as many volunteers as we can muster to coordinate and monitor the speed of vehicles in the village. CLOSURE OF HAMDON PLAYGROUP

Hamdon Playgroup has now sadly closed permanently after 48 years due to URC South Western Synod wanting to sell the building; this meant we would have to accept a new tenancy agreement. This was offered but we were unable to accept it due to the cost being beyond our means and financial commitment. The conditions were £10,500 a year rent, not including utility and insurance costs which brought our monthly rent payable to around £1,500 per month, this being unachievable.

An Extraordinary General meeting was held on 14th June 2022, where a vote was taken by the Committee and parents with support from Somerset County Council that Playgroup would have no option but to close at the end of July 2022. The Committee then had to put into place the closure and secure funds for the staff redundancy payments. All assets and equipment had to be sold to fund this. Sales were advertised by Somerset County Council to Preschools and Early Years settings. These took place in August. Somerset County Council supported us with a sustainability grant, plus funds raised by the Committee although we still have a shortfall of £1,600 to complete all redundancy payments.

I would like to thank Committee members, parents, villagers and staff for their support in this mammoth task to sell everything and empty the premises by 14th September when the keys were handed back to the South Western Synod and our tenancy ended. A very sad day for all concerned.

We would like to thank everyone over the years, the Stoke Sports and Recreation Trust, the Charity shop, Derek Goad, Derek Morris at West Street Farm, HCAP, Stoke Working Men's Club, the Co-op Community Fund, Castle Primary School and Stoke Parish Council who have supported us and, of course, all the people and parents of Stoke Sub Hamdon over the 48 years we were open. Thank you to all of you.

NOTICE FROM SSDC - COVID-19 AUTUMN BOOSTER AND FLU VACCINES FOR CARERS

The Covid-19 Autumn Booster and Flu vaccine programmes are now well underway and Carers in South Somerset are being urged to take up the offer of immunisation, to protect themselves and those they care for. This year anyone aged 16 and over who receives carer's allowance, or who is the main carer of an elderly or disabled person who is at increased risk from flu or COVID-19, is eligible for both vaccines. This includes people who provide unpaid care, for example as a family member, close friend or neighbour.

It is hugely important that all those who are eligible, especially unpaid carers, take up the offer of both the COVID-19 booster and flu vaccines as soon as possible this season. The risk of COVID-19 and flu remains significant, and vaccines remain the best defense against them.

Carers who are known to GPs and who have a 'carer's flag' on their primary care record will receive invitations to book both their COVID-19 booster and flu vaccines as soon as they are eligible. Carers can also self-declare and book their COVID-19 booster vaccination via the National Booking Service on the NHS website (www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/), by calling 119, or by finding a walk-in appointment through the online vaccination walk-in finder, and should approach their GP or pharmacy for further information about how to access the flu vaccine. There is no requirement to provide proof that a person is a carer when attending vaccination appointments.

Those who have newly taken on caring responsibilities may not yet be known to their GPs or Local Authority. All carers are encouraged to find out if they are eligible for a vaccination – especially those who are unpaid. If you are a carer or know of anyone who is, do consider approaching your GP to record your status on your primary care record.

Further information about the COVID-19 autumn booster is available online via www.gov.uk/government/publications/, and separate flu vaccination guidance for social care workers and carers has also been published.
