The Council continues to consider the provision of financial support to local groups. Application forms and further details can be found on the Council's website or obtained from the office.

Council Meetings and Committees

The Council held full Council meetings every month throughout the year. The Council has three standing committees: Planning, Estate and Staffing. The Planning Committee met every month, the Estate Committee met bi-monthly and the Staffing Committee met as required. Members of the public were invited to attend and listen at Council meetings and had the opportunity to speak in the Public Participation session of the Full Council meeting or Planning Committee meeting. 10 minutes were set aside for public participation at the beginning of those meetings when members of the public could raise issues of concern or pass on information.

Planning Committee Report by Councillor Ian West, Chair 2018/2019

The Planning Committee meets monthly to consider planning and related matters on behalf of the Town Council. As well as responding to Shropshire Council on specific planning applications, including proposed work on trees, the Committee also oversees the Council's policies on highways and footpaths. Members of the public are able to attend meetings and to speak in the public participation period at the start of each meeting. The Planning Committee have reviewed and, where necessary, provided comments to Shropshire Council on 72 applications this year. The Planning Committee's activities this year have also included the monitoring of the work to develop a Neighbourhood Plan for Broseley, preparing Broseley's response to Shropshire Council's consultation on preferred development sites, discussing with Shropshire Council the use of Community Infrastructure Levy funds within Broseley, and holding discussions with registered providers of affordable housing on their aspirations for increasing the provision of affordable housing in the town.

Estate Committee Report by Councillor Michael Garbett, Chair 2018/2019

A quieter year for projects at the Birchmeadow Centre. The front doors have been replaced as have a couple of windows. Stairway lighting has been improved and vision panels have been made in some doors to improve safety issues. The flat roof has been repaired and new double doors for the cellar are ordered and awaiting fitting. A small extension to the stage has been agreed and plans to go ahead with this are in the pipeline. The solar panels have saved on electricity costs to the centre and feeding export tariffs have benefitted the Town Council by approximately £1,000 this year.

The MUGA Chair was taken over by Gary Price and outgoing Chair Mike Kaiser was thanked for his work over many years.

The play equipment has been removed from Park View and we are waiting for Shropshire Council to engage with us to decide on a suitable future for it. New benches have been installed in the Memorial Green and a Flagpole has been erected.

Shropshire Council have now replaced all their street lights in Broseley with energy-saving LED lights and the Town Council is working on a survey and timetable for the replacement of the approximately 170 Broseley Town Council owned lights to have them replaced also. There has been an increase in groups using the library for meetings and drop-in sessions. The decision to install electrical car charging points has been put on hold while we wait to see the results of trials by Shropshire Council in other towns. CCTV cameras have been installed both inside and outside the Library building and also an intruder detector alarm system. Recycling bins have been removed from the car park by Shropshire Council which caused a problem with fly-tipping at a cost to Broseley Town Council to have rubbish removed.

Plans to increase the size of the cemetery are progressing slowly. Plans for a new Welfare Building on the site are still being discussed. The Chapel is to be opened to the public imminently and work has taken place to remove clutter from the Chapel in readiness. The Council will purchase a 20ft container to provide an indoor working space, which will include an electricity supply, for use by the Groundsmen.

Outside Bodies

During 2018/19 representatives from the Council served on the following outside bodies: Birchmeadow Centre Management Committee, Birchmeadow Park Management Committee, Victoria Hall Management Committee, Local Joint Committee, MUGA Group, Severn Gorge Countryside Trust, Ironbridge Gorge World Heritage Site Steering Group and the JL Edwards Memorial Trust.

Communications

During the year the Town Council published four issues of its newsletter, Town Talk, which was distributed door to door throughout the town. The Council regularly contributed to the Broseley Quarterly and What's What magazine, as well as issuing press releases to the local newspapers. Council notices, including the schedule of meetings and meeting agendas and minutes, were displayed on Council notice boards and on the Council's website and were also available from the library and the Clerk. Liaison was maintained with visitbroseley.com to ensure that clubs and events in the town were included on this website. The office was open to visits from the public on Thursday mornings from 10am to 12 noon.
