Christian Louboutin designed hats, this is what they


would look like. Above, a pair of blue tits climb a sycamore trunk searching cracks in the bark for hidden insects; these are no urban peanut eating garden birds, these are true

#### MALTHOUSE WELL

December, January and February have been relatively dry months compared to normal and so the Malthouse well's level has continued its gentle increase in February. It has risen by just over 3 metres (~10ft) during February and is about 13 metres (~42ft) below ground level. As the graph below shows, this is about 10 metres below the February 2014 level of about 3 metres.
