Vodafone rolls out rural network coverage

Fed up with a poor mobile phone signal in Stanton Harcourt and Sutton? Vodafone UK has teamed up with the National Association of Local Councils and the Countryside Alliance to encourage more communities to apply to its Rural Open Sure Signal programme which will give 100 rural communities across the UK the opportunity to have 3G

mobile coverage. An Open Sure Signal unit is a larger version of the standard Sure Signal (which creates 3G signal in your home or small office). It's also 'open', so as long as you're within range and have a 3G device, you'll automatically connect to it. This means you'll be able to make clear calls and get online in rural locations where you couldn't before. Open Sure Signal would require the mounting of around 5 small, low-powered 3G mobile base stations, just a bit larger than your home broadband box and mounted high onto a chimney breast, pole or wall in a vertical position. There's a choice of coloured covers to ensure they blend in to the surroundings It works with a local broadband connection to create a 3G signal. Please check out the Vodafone website

WODC and the Local Plan

WODC has recently published its Local Plan and a member of SHPC attended WODC's consultation presentation earlier this month to find out what the implications are for Stanton Harcourt.

Key points are: WODC said that West Oxfordshire is now subject to many and sometimes speculative housing development plans – but no large scale 'serious' plan had been submitted for SH; in many ways, SH was far more fortunate in this respect than some surrounding villages that are currently subject to relatively large expansions; the importance of maintaining the distinctiveness of SH and Sutton; one of the factors 'protecting' us from large scale expansion was our low level of sustainability, i.e. few resources or amenities to support large expansion; in the absence of relatively large scale s106 payments being available (which there aren't), the Sutton bypass is currently not scheduled to go forward.

Overall, SSHPC was encouraged by WODC's understanding of SH and slightly comforted. However, we must be **very**, **very** vigilant if we want to preserve the rural nature of our village and community. *Glyn Jones*

Chicane Crossing - Notice from Oxfordshire County Council Highways Dept

The Parish Council and SHAPE's project to develop Jubilee Field as a children's play area has given careful consideration to the safety of children crossing the main road to reach Jubilee Field. We have been working with Oxfordshire County Council's Highways Dept to develop a scheme to improve pedestrian safety, and OCC's proposal is now ready for viewing. A summary of the proposal is as follows:-

"The County Council acting at the request of Stanton Harcourt Parish Council are proposing to introduce a traffic calming feature at the entry to Stanton Harcourt. The proposed traffic island or "build out" is to be located on Main Road just north of Flexneys Paddock. The island will be built across the approach lane into the village and supplemented with advance warning signs and "priority working" signs. Incoming vehicles will be required to slow and give way to outbound vehicles. The aim of the above is to slow vehicles entering the village and assist pedestrians in crossing Main Road and thereby improve conditions for all classes of road user within the village, including pedestrians, cyclists and other vulnerable users. It is our intention to construct the feature in the late spring if no objections or sooner if possible."

Full details and drawings may be obtained from the Parish Clerk, and are available to view on the Parish Council's website and noticeboards in the village.


