Here's the latest update from County Highways detailing their work in Test Valley during November.



Cold weather - gritting

As the cold weather becomes more common over the next couple of months Hampshire County Council's gritters will be hard at work to ensure our main routes are well covered during any freezing conditions.

Whenever icy road conditions are forecast, Hampshire County Council always salt the main roads first. These 'Priority one' routes carry the majority of traffic - covering 'A' class roads, access roads to emergency services establishments and to areas of high traffic concentration, and other heavily used roads. The county use detailed Hampshire-specific weather forecasts through the winter, in combination with real time information from a network of electronic roadside weather stations to make decisions about the best time to salt the roads, where to salt and how much salt to use.

Southampton Road, Romsey - roadworks

Road Repairs

Works to address flooding on the M271/Romsey Road roundabout

Good news this morning that the works to address the flooding on Romsey Road in Nursling at the M271 roundabout and by Romsey Golf Club have been brought forward from their original date of March to 4th January.

The works are expected to take up to 6 weeks. The work will be carried out under temporary traffic lights and a lane closure, which will be in operation from 09:30 to 16:00hrs each day, Monday to Friday. The road will be open outside of these hours and over the weekend.

Flooding at this point has been an issue for a number of years and when I was elected to the County Council in May was one of the main things I wanted to address, so I'm very grateful to Hampshire Highways for bringing the works forward.

ROAD TO BE CLOSED: Nursling and Rownhams Footpaths 16 & 17 with Totton and Eling Footpath 12


ALTERNATIVE ROUTE: No alternative route available

Platinum Jubilee Plans in Hampshire and Test Valley

This year sees a remarkable, and quite possibly unique (certainly in any of our lifetimes) event. HM The Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Next month The Queen will be the first British monarch to celebrate 70 years' service.

To commemorate this, and the Royal Family's connections to the borough, new artwork is being considered by TVBC for locations in both Romsey and Andover, with artists across the country being invited to apply. Funding for the artwork will come from contributions taken from developers over the last 10 years towards public art projects.



Hampshire County Council are setting aside fund for community projects to commemorate the Platinum Jubilee, more detail will be released later in the Spring.

TVBC are also waiving all fees for arranging street closures to enable street parties and other gatherings over the Platinum Jubilee public holiday between June 2nd and 5th. The Queen's commitment to her country and the entire commonwealth over seven decades is absolutely remarkable. It is only right that we celebrate her achievements and thank her for this service.

I spoke to Radio Solent about our plans on January 3rd.

County Councillor Grant Scheme

I've already agreed amounts that have gone to support Romsey Show, Romsey's Christmas Lights, Youth in Romsey, Nursling and Rownhams Parish Council for their recreation ground project, The Social Collective for their work to tackle social exclusion and loneliness in Abbotswood and St Leonard's Church in Sherfield English for their memorial bench.

This month I have agreed a grant to East Tytherley Parish Council for a defibrillator for the parish.

I still have £1,625 in my budget to allocate so if you are aware of any worthy schemes within the division then do please let me know.

Getting About

Parish Council meetings have continued. I've attended meetings of Chilworth, Awbridge, Romsey Extra, West Tytherley, Frenchmoor and Buckholt, Nursling and Rownhams and

Lockerley parish councils since my last report.

I also appeared on BBC Politics South before Christmas, where we were talking about adherence to Covid restrictions, use of food banks and discouraging over-use of the New Forest to protect its unique environment. The broadcast date was December 12th and I think it is still on iplayer.
