CHAIR'S UPDATE

We had two meetings in May. At our usual monthly one we heard a presentation from AgeUK Somerset and formally agreed to set up a 12-month pilot project for a Befriending Service for older and vulnerable people in our village, a project we have long been wanting to do. The council will provide funding and promote the service and AgeUK Somerset will manage and support volunteers. We hope to start the partnership from July and will be leafleting each house in the village with more details. At our Annual meeting the eight existing councillors confirmed their willingness to continue as elected members for the next four-year term. councillors are Barbara Brooks, Hugh Donovan, Andy Dawe, Rebecca Merrick, Graham Middleton, Suzanne Nelms, Bill Southcombe, and Malcolm Uhlhorn. We have a wide range of interests and skills and live in different parts of the village. We have three vacancies - so if you would like to be co-opted as a councillor, please get in touch - you will be very warmly welcomed!

I would like to pay tribute to Sylvia Seal who has stepped down as a District Councillor having served Stoke for 23 years. Her active support and enthusiasm have been invaluable for our village. Mike Hewitson was elected in early May as our new District Councillor and we look forward to working with him. Key points from the Chair's Annual Report are as follows. By keeping a firm eye on costs, we have been able to keep just under budget last year.

We have continued to support community facilities as we do every year by providing a total of £15,453 grant money towards operating costs for the Sports & Recreation Trust, the Memorial Hall, Hamdon Youth Group, Hamdon Youth & Family Centre, Stoke Working Men's Club, the British Legion and the May Fayre. We prudently continue to put aside each year £7,200 into long term maintenance Reserves for parish assets, for the Recreation Ground Pavilion and the new Youth Centre.

We spent £8,363 on grass cutting and ground maintenance around the village, £3,250 on the maintenance of parish asset and play equipment and £1,750 on rent for the Recreation Ground and allotments for residents' use and enjoyment.

Our three-year long project, the Community Right to Bid purchase of the old Methodist Church in West Street for a new Youth & Family Centre finally came into being with completion at the end of 2018. A new community charity Hamdon Youth & Family Centre Trust has been set up, run by the youth organization leaders and parish councillors, and now runs the Centre on a day to day basis. The Brownies, Guides and the Youth Group are the initial users and we expect more to join once the building has been fully adapted.

In the areas of planning we ensured that we responded to SSDC consultation documents and we firmly supported our village's need for affordable housing, 2 bedroomed houses and improved infrastructure such as bus services, sewage etc. As other authorities make the actual decisions, we strongly believe that we need to make our village's voice heard on key issues.
