Parish Council

A meeting was held on the 26th November. Notts. County Council have said that they can't change the sign at the end of Grey Lane as any alteration would contravene their regulations. The village owl box has now been constructed and erected in a tree in the churchyard by Mr. Brian Armstrong.

Approval was recommended for a planning application by Mr. and Mrs. Shaw for a garage and conservatory at Nuholme Bungalow, Radley Road. There will be no increase in the precept for the Halam Parish Rate for

1994/95.

A further meeting was held on 17th December. Approval was recommended for a planning application by Notts. County Council for a small extension to the existing office / staffroom at Halam School, subject to the use of reclaimed bricks and pantiles and the adjacent tree being pruned for protection from the work. The Parish Council is considering a suggestion to provide and erect either an internal plaque or external stone tablet commemorating the Halam men who died in service during the 1914 - 18 war. The most appropriate location would be on the wall of the existing staffroom, originally built in memory of these men and paid for by public subscription. It is believed there are three names which should be included and it would be appreciated if anyone with any information regarding the names, ranks and regiments could contact the Clerk. Planning permission has been granted to Mr. and Mrs. P. Rickett and also Mr. and Mrs. R. Bull (the latter on condition that no further development would take place on the applicant's property). Simon Bust gave a report on a meeting of the Notts. Association of Local Councils, Newark Area Committee which he had attended. The children of Halam School carried out a litter survey on the 18th October. The most obvious litter was cigarette and sweet debris, apple cores and dog mess, particularly in Back Lane. Worst areas were the bus shelter and near the church seat. The Parish Council asks parishoners to co-operate in reducing litter and preventing the fouling of public areas by dogs.

The next meeting will be on the 28th January at 7.30pm.

The Chairman presented the Annual Report which included the following,

1) 14 Parish Council meetings were held during the year.

Comments had been made to the District Council on 16 planning 2) applications.

3) The Parish Council had been consulted by the Commissioners in connection with the restructuring of local government.

4) A memorial stone is to be erected at Halam School to commemorate

the four Halam men who fell during the 1914 - 18 War. 5) There had been an increase in the number of lettings of the Village Hall. Financing of the Hall had been well supported by the proceeds

were now satisfied with the proposal. It was agreed to recommend approval of the planning application by Mr.D.Rogers for a mobile home situated to the rear of Halam Mill and the application by Mr.W.Hill for the erection of a satellite dish to the rear of the Manor House, Radley Road.

On Friday 13th May the Annual General Meeting was held and attended by the Chairman, Mr.E.Bust, the Clerk, Mr.P.Rickett, Mr.R.Brown, Mr.H.Rickett Mrs.G.Herbert, Mr.T.Hallam, Mr.D.Kemp, parishioners. Both District Councillors were present. It was agreed to recommend approval of a planning application by Mr.I.Sharman for the erection of a cattle building at New Holbeck Farm.

It was agreed that the Gardens' Open Day would be held on Sunday 3rd July and all offers of help would be greatly appreciated.
