# Have your say on WODC plans!

West Oxfordshire District Council has opened a consultation into the plans for the development of the district up until 2041. It is your chance to have your say about How you would like to see the Village and surrounding area developed over the next 18 years.

This new consultation, 'Your Place, Your Plan', launched on 30 August and will be open for two months. Residents are being encouraged to share their thoughts on three different topics: the draft objectives of the local plan; the future pattern of development for the district (by reviewing scenarios) and how local land could be used in the future.

The District Council is hopeful that residents will review the new materials and respond again in this current consultation, viewing their input as key. The consultation will be hosted on the District Council's online platform, although the PC have placed some paper copies in the Village Shop for those who have no internet access and would prefer to share their opinions by post.

# Botley Road to remain closed to through traffic until October 2024 due to delays to Oxford Station redevelopment.

Network Rail has informed Oxfordshire County Council that it will no longer be able to reopen Oxford's Botley Road at the end of October 2023, as previously planned. Due to complications experienced during its £161 million redevelopment of Oxford Station, Network Rail has requested that Botley Road remain closed to through traffic until the project is completed in October 2024.

The original plan was to reopen the road at the end of October when utility diversion work was due to be completed, and then close it again to through traffic from March - October 2024 for highway work and the replacement of Botley railway bridge.

However, Network Rail has not been able to keep to this schedule due to problems caused by the discovery of an inverted brick arch under the surface, which stretches beneath the railway bridge.

## Incorrect battery disposal resulting in fire risk.

More than 700 waste-related fires are responded to each year by the emergency services due to the unsafe disposal of batteries, many of which are hidden inside electrical equipment and put in general waste.

Should lithium batteries end up in the refuse or in the body of the recycling truck there's a very real risk of the battery being punctured by the compacting equipment with the potential to ignite or explode in the back of the lorry, causing damage, disrupting waste collections and ultimately putting lives at risk.

The good news is that batteries and small appliances can still be recycled at the kerb just as long as they're separated out from the main recycling. Due to their small size, vapes should be placed inside an envelope or ideally an old plastic bag and left on the lid on top of the blue-lidded recycling bin ready for collection. Household batteries should be recycled in the same manner. Electricals and batteries are stored separately on the recycling vehicle so are not compacted, massively reducing the risk of fire.

Residents can recycle their small electrical and electronic items using the Council's kerbside service by placing them in their black box.

Alternatively, they can be taken to the Household Waste Recycling Centre (Dix Pit) or any retailer that sells batteries and electricals and who has a duty to offer a take back service for these types of goods.



# **Great news for Standing with Giants**

Standing with Giants formed as a community project after a remembrance gathering, that took place here, in Stanton Harcourt, on our Village Green. Encouraged by the passion of the people at that gathering to remember those who gave us our freedom, our small community group has achieved amazing things. We've displayed at Blenheim Palace, Hampton Court Palace, Lord Rothschild's Waddesdon Manor, Fort Nelson, International Bomber Command, and even the Falkland Islands.

From the beginning, Dan Barton, who founded the project, was keen to create a giant installation to take to Normandy to honour those who died on D-Day on the beaches, paving the way for the liberation of Europe. After 18 months of Zoom meetings with Nicholas Witchell, BBC Royal correspondent, and a trip to Normandy to meet with Nicholas and Lord Dannatt, the proposal to install 1500 figures between the beach and the British Normandy Memorial from April 2024 through to September 2024 was voted on by the memorial's trustees. We are pleased to announce that the vote was a unanimous yes, and we will be traveling with 1500 figures to Normandy in April 2024 to set up a huge installation representing the 1476 British servicemen who died on the beaches that day and to honour and remember all those who have made sacrifices for our freedom.

We envisage the whole installation will travel to Normandy in April 2024 on three articulated lorries. We are having conversations with various motorbike groups who wish to escort these lorries to Portsmouth from Oxfordshire. The Hog Group of French riders will then join us on the French side.

We are allowing 15 days with 20-30 volunteers to set up the installation. By the time the installation is complete, we will have painted 25 miles of steel and alloy. We will have used 10 miles of guy lines, hammered in 6,000 large steel pegs, and tied 12,000 knots. The whole installation will weigh 25 to 30 tonnes. The installation will be called "For You Tomorrow: The People's Tribute."

The team has been working for 3 years+ to make components so others can help paint and assemble the figures. Last weekend, we were humbled to meet Normandy veterans who were delighted to hear our plans. They may visit to help paint silhouettes.

We're currently building a workshop so people can help paint and assemble 'The People's Tribute'. In two weeks, we will be displaying 200 of these figures at the National Trust's Stowe House, Buckinghamshire, where we will launch "The Normandy Initiative." We still have painting, assembling, and packing of the 200 Stowe figures to do. There's an incredible amount of work to do, from electrics in the workshop to fitting roller doors and laying concrete slabs & fitting a large modern industrial wood burner. There's admin, research, fundraising, press releases, logistics, and marshalling. We really need some help.

Amongst our volunteer help, we have enjoyed working with 5 Duke of Edinburgh students from Bartholomew and our local Scout and Sea Scout groups. We look forward to welcoming individuals or local groups who would like to get involved. We're on the outskirts of Stanton Harcourt near the recycling centre.
