## **News from St. Nicholas Church**

#### March 2022

Despite having electricity again after a break of more than 24hours, the weather still looks pretty grim today, with driving rain and increasing high winds. Yet another named storm is heading our way.

There was a tree down in the churchyard by the far gate and the porch light was smashed at the height of storm Eunice and as there was no sign of when power would be on, the decision was made on Saturday evening to cancel our Sunday service on the 20th February. We hope the information was widely enough shared and that nobody was inconvenienced.

As we personally are very dependant on electricity we moved down to the little cabin by the mill pond where we have a tiny woodburning stove and spent a very cosy time till the power returned by 10.30pm. So lovely to read and chat by candlelight. The bright moonlight and starry sky sparkling over the water were a beautiful sight.

### Reminders

**The church porch** is open at all times, do shelter in there if the weather is spoiling your walk and your dogs may need the water in the bowl by the door. There is also a basket for items for the Maidstone Homeless Food Bank on the bench. Any contributions would be most welcome.

**The main church building** is open for weekly services only and for access to the ecochurch shop afterwards. At other times please contact the churchwardens for a key, their details are printed elsewhere in the magazine and in the porch.

**Tower repairs** are not completed so take care as you walk round the building and avoid the fenced off area.

**Daily Morning Prayer** and other on-line services from Canterbury Cathedral are available on the diocesan website. They are well worth joining. We will sadly miss the daily prayer time in the cathedral gardens with the Dean of Canterbury, the Very Revd. Dr. Robert Willis, his beloved animals around him, as he retires later in the year. He has been a beacon for us in the troubling recent months, not only for us but around the country and worldwide.

**Celtic Prayers** are said each Monday in the side chapel, from 9-9.30am. If you have prayer requests please contact Rev. John Huggins or the churchwardens at any time and prayers will be said at Morning Prayer time or in private if you wish.

#### Information

Lent begins the first week on March. We have no information about courses or recommended reading just yet, but will put out notices if possible, on the church noticeboard. Hopefully a new one will be erected soon!

Our Lent lunches seem to have been put 'on hold'. Any further information will be posted. We had hoped to make use of the church building, but our re-organisation of the pews etc. are soon to start, so plans cannot be finalised yet.

Also, a reminder about the Food Bank basket in the porch. A good Lent project to bring an item to each service or visit to the porch!

**Village Coffee Mornings** are making a come-back! In a new form, we will be offering a simplified version, with coffee/tea facilities and biscuits each week in the hall while the pop-up Post Office is open. It will be a social opportunity for all, not just when you need the Post Office. Not quite what was on offer before, but let's see how it goes. There will be a charge of £1, and any proceeds will go to charity, as it always did. The Parish Hall committee are pleased to have a basket for items for the Maidstone Homeless Food Bank available at this time.

The first coffee time will be on **March 8th.** Looking forward to meeting up again.

Today is a worrying time as we heard the news that the Queen has been diagnosed with Covid. We all wish that she will make a rapid recovery and only has the mildest of symptoms. Our good wishes go out to her whole family and to all those facing the disease.



# Covid down, levelling up

2022 has got off to a busy start.

With Covid restrictions eased, I've been enjoying meeting people face to face again – on top of the virtual meetings which have become a feature of life for many of us.

Whether it's visiting a farm in Langley or a community centre in Faversham (or even an outdoor adventure centre!), getting out and talking to people is one of the parts of being an MP I most enjoy.

We've come a long way since Christmas when the Omicron variant threatened to delay our recovery. Thanks to our booster campaign and the hard work of NHS and care staff, and volunteers, we've turned a corner - though I do know schools are still seeing high numbers of cases.

My focus now is on supporting our local recovery from Covid – whether that's helping secure more NHS dental appointments, getting our local train timetable back on track, or tackling the backlog in applications at the DVLA.

As Exchequer Secretary to the Treasury, I've been working to boost the productivity of small businesses with our Help to Grow: Digital scheme – something many of our local businesses can benefit from. I've also been working on our Tax-Free Childcare scheme and Energy Bills Rebate to help households with the cost of living.

It's been great seeing how schemes to boost jobs and skills are benefitting people locally. I recently met some of the 3,000 'Kickstarters' in Kent on a visit to the West Faversham Community Centre – another sign that our plan for jobs is working.

I'll continue to do everything I can to help my constituents over the coming year. If you have a problem you think I can help with, then please get in contact with me.

# **PM and Chancellor visit Maidstone Hospital**

I was delighted to welcomed Boris Johnson and Rishi Sunak to Maidstone Hospital in early February.

The hospital is home to the Kent Oncology Centre, which is delivering some of the best cancer treatment in England.

The centre is part of Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells NHS Trust which is one of only a handful of hospital trusts to meet the national standard for treating cancer patients within 62 days.

I'm determined to help the hospital build on this success and expand its work so that even more people can benefit.

# 3,000 'Kickstarters' in Kent

Latest stats show that over 3,000 young people across Kent have benefitted from our Kickstart scheme, which provides Government-backed work placements.

It was great to be back at the West Faversham Community Centre recently – talking to young people about how the work placements provided by Kickstart are helping them find jobs. The first steps after leaving school are crucial but they can also be daunting. Speaking to 'Kickstarters' in Faversham and Maidstone, it's clear the programme has given them opportunities they might never have dreamt of.

# My message to the Housing Minister

I recently met the then Housing Minister, Christopher Pincher MP, to convey concerns from local residents and councillors about housing numbers in Kent.

In my meeting with the Minister, I highlighted the challenges both Maidstone and Swale Borough Councils are facing in meeting their housing needs as well as unhappiness from local residents at the scale of proposed development.

I'm determined to make sure that Ministers understand the challenges we face in Kent. People elected me to stand up for our community and that's what I will do.

# Making country roads safer

I'm working with the local police and Kent Highways to make roads around Headcorn safer. It's clear we need joined up action to make this happen – with better road signage and stronger enforcement.

This work is already underway with Kent Police running "Operation Mandalay" to catch dangerous drivers around the village. The police also ran a "Neighbourhood Week of Action" in January to clamp down on speeding across Maidstone.

Kent Highways will be running speed surveys in Headcorn and also carrying out a general review of road signage and white lines around the village.

# **Reclaiming Pilgrims Way**

I've been concerned by reports about off-road vehicles using sections of the Pilgrims and North Downs way illegally. Riders flying up these tracks are putting people in danger and causing misery for local residents.

Last month, I called a meeting with local councillors, police, and Kent Highways to discuss solutions. Local Councillors and I will be organising a further meeting of those affected, to make sure that enough of these instances are being reported to the police.

If you've been affected by this, please do report incidents to 101 or online. I'm determined not to let a small minority spoil our green spaces.

# Action to tackle illegal hare coursing

The sight of tyre tracks through fields, broken gates, and damaged crops has sadly become all too common in the countryside.

I've called on Ministers to introduce tougher laws to tackle the blight of illegal hare coursing, and I'm pleased that new legislation is now being introduced.

The Government has confirmed that it will be amending the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Bill to strengthen law enforcement for hare coursing. The proposals include new offences, tougher penalties, and powers to stop those found guilty from keeping dogs in future.

# **Grafty Gourmet**

These are great for a snack or served with a salad and yogurt for a lunch.

# **Sweet Potato, Carrot & Feta Fritters**

800g carrots
2 large potatoes
1 large onion
600g of sweet potatoes
5 medium free-range eggs
200g of feta, crumbled

6 tablespoons of wholemeal flour 25g of fresh coriander, chopped 2 tablespoons of cumin seeds 300ml of vegetable oil Green salad, lime wedges and yogurt to serve

- 1. Peel and grate the carrots, potatoes, onion and sweet potatoes. Put in a colander over the sink with a big pinch of salt to drain for 30 minutes.
- 2. In a large bowl, combine the eggs, feta, flour, coriander and cumin seeds, then beat with a fork until mixed.
- 3. Squeeze as much liquid from the veg as you can, pressing down hard into the colander for 1-2 minutes, then add to the egg mixture. Stir to combine and season well. Heat the oven to 150°C (fan130°C).

Heat the oil in a wok or saucepan until hot. Put a small handful of the mix in a slotted spoon and lower into the oil. Cook 2-3 at a time: fry for 1-2 minutes, then turn and repeat until golden. Put on a plate and keep warm in a low oven.




