

Grafty Gourmet

This makes a fantastic dinner, and is very simple to make. There are actually no olives in this recipe. The name of the dish is derived from the shape of the beef when rolled, as being 'olive shaped'. Serve with potatoes and fresh vegetables of your choice

Beef Olives with Red Wine Sauce

Beef Olives

2 lb Topside of Beef Joint
(Sliced into 8 equal slices)
1 lb Sausage meat
1 medium onion, finely chopped
1 clove very finely crushed garlic
60g Sage and Onion stuffing mix
200g Mushrooms, chopped
1 tablespoon of finely chopped fresh parsley
1 tablespoon of butter
1 tablespoon of olive oil

Red Wine Sauce

1 medium onion, finely chopped 1 tablespoon of Plain Flour 1 tablespoon of tomato puree 1 glass of red wine 1/2 pint of beef stock Pinch of salt Dash of fresh ground black pepper

- 1. Carefully flatten the slices of beef with a meat hammer. Alternatively place between sheets of grease proof paper and beat carefully with a rolling pin.
- 2. Make the sage & onion stuffing, as per instructions on the box. Mix together with the sausage meat, one chopped onion, garlic, mushrooms and parsley. Place the mixture into the middle of the slices of beef and roll up. Secure each roll with two cocktail sticks.
- 3. Put butter and olive oil in a frying pan and melt the butter. Add the rolls of beef, and cook for no more than 2 minutes, until brown.
- 4. For the Red Wine Sauce, remove the rolls of beef and add the onion to the pan and cook until softened. Stir in the flour and mix well with the onions. Add the tomato puree, wine and beef stock and bring to the boil. Season with salt and pepper.
- 5. Transfer the sauce to a casserole dish, and add the Beef Olives. Cover and place in a preheated oven. Cook on a low heat of 120 degrees for 1 to $1^1/_2$ hours.

WINDOWS 10 - Personalise the Start Menu

In the same way that you were able to add shortcuts and frequently used applications (apps) to your Desktop in Windows 7 and the Start Menu in Windows 8, you can do this in Windows 10. You can also get rid of some of those applications that windows added, but you don't use (e.g. Store).

Adding Commonly used <u>apps</u> to the tiled area of the menu:

Locate the <u>app</u> that you want available from the start menu (eg Calculator).

Use the search option or select All apps option which will show you everything you have available.

Do not click it, just point to it, then use the right button on the mouse (**Right-Click**) which will give you a menu.

From this menu use the left click to Select Pin to Start.



Moving the tiles is done by dragging them to a position that is most appropriate to you. You can also resize them, by pointing to the tile, "Right-click" the mouse and select the resize option with the left click.

Removing unwanted tiles, just point the unwanted tile, then use the "**Right-Click**", a menu will appear which should give you the option to **Unpin from Start**, left click this option.

You may noticed an option to **Pin to Taskbar**, this is the area at the bottom of the screen, which can be very useful if you use an <u>app</u> every day, eg: Google Chrome.



You can only access this island by crossing the road known as The Causeway when the tide has gone out. At other times the water covers the road and you just have to wait before you can get on or come off the island. At Lindisfarne you really are dependant on the rhythm of the tides and the seasons.
